### Thoughts on the Sunday Scriptures

In today's Gospel, Jesus begins his Sermon on the Mount with a series of blessings, the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes are a summary of the fundamental attitude of a Christian steward. Make it a point to reflect on this Gospel reading during the week. Identify the blessing you relate to the most. Which one is the most challenging for you?

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Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we launch our annual observance of Catholic Schools Week. Check out the bulletin for many events that will acknowledge the special place our parish school has in the life of our faith community.

The theme of this year's observance is, "Catholic Schools: Communities of Faith, Knowledge and Service". The theme encompasses concepts that are at the heart of a Catholic education. First, schools are communities, small communities in their own right, but also, members of the larger community of home, church, city and nation. Faith, knowledge and service are three measures by which any Catholic school can and should be judged.

By many measures, how blest are we with our school. Since we opened the doors of our parish school in 1929 we have been providing a place that offers faith, knowledge and service. Thousands of children have been formed by OLPH school.

Today, OLPH School is the largest Catholic school in the Archdiocese and by most standards excels in providing a faith filled, quality education. I am so proud of what Dr. Mills, her staff and faculty do day in and day out. I am profoundly grateful to the parents and parishioners who make the sacrifices necessary so that our school will have the resources to be vital and the best it can be.

Handing our faith on with passion and commitment are hallmarks of our parish school and religious education program.

Next Saturday, Feb. 4th at 3:00 Hickey Hall, there will be an information meeting on our upcoming pilgrimage to Berlin, Krakow, Czestochowa, Budapest and Vienna. The trip departs on Aug 26 and concludes Sept. 8th. We will have

Sue Jackson our tour guide at the meeting. Sue has been the docent for many of the OLPH trips and is the best at what she does. She will give a great perspective on the incredible sights on this itinerary.

I met this past week with our committee that oversees the First Fruits Program. Each week, 6% of our weekly collection supports all of the mandated 2nd collections, our Sharing Parishes and other needs that are brought to our attention. The committee, headed by Susan Logan, reviews the disbursements and looks to our future. We hope in the future to increase the percentage of our weekly collection to outreach initiatives. This past year, in addition to maintaining our support to all of the mandated 2nd collections, we continued our financial support of St. Philip Neri, St. Sabina, Our Lady of Tepeyac and St. James. Each quarter I always receive such touching letters from these four parishes letting us know what a crucial difference our contributions make. This past year we have also assisted the refugee families we are supporting, the Night Ministry that reaches out to homeless teenagers, Amate House and the Archdiocesan outreach on domestic violence. We also supported Catholic Relief Services emergency outreach to Haiti that endured yet another devastating hurricane.

Don't forget next Sunday is Scout Sunday! Our Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts will attend the 7:30 am mass. Several scouts will be recognized. One of the best meals served here in the course of the year is the Pancake Breakfast! Breakfast will be served all morning in the Playdium.

## European Art in the Age of Shakespeare

Tuesday, January 31 at 7:00 pm

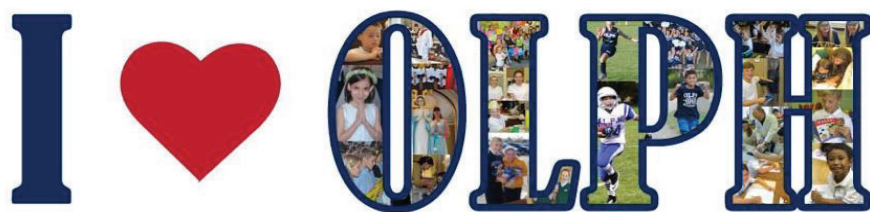
Art historian Jeff Mishur returns to OLPH on Tuesday, January 31 from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. in McDonnell Hall.

**ABOUT THE TOPIC:** The year 2016 marked 400 years since the death of Shakespeare (1564-1616.) Mr. Mishur will focus on a

selection of art created during Shakespeare's lifetime which represents one of the most exciting periods in the history of art, a period when accepted Renaissance practices gave way to radical Baroque innovations.

This was also a period when the Church, still a major sponsor of artistic efforts, promoted the use of Counterreformation themes in order to catechize to people who were illiterate and offer a response to the challenges of the Protestant Reformation movements occurring in Europe. During this time, there was a central connection between art and the changing religious climate. Artists to be discussed include Caravaggio, Frans Hals, Rubens and Tintoretto.

**ABOUT THE SPEAKER:** Jeff Mishur and his wife Michelle Paluch Mishur co-own Art Excursions, a local company offering private tours to museums and architectural sites in Chicago and other U.S. cities.

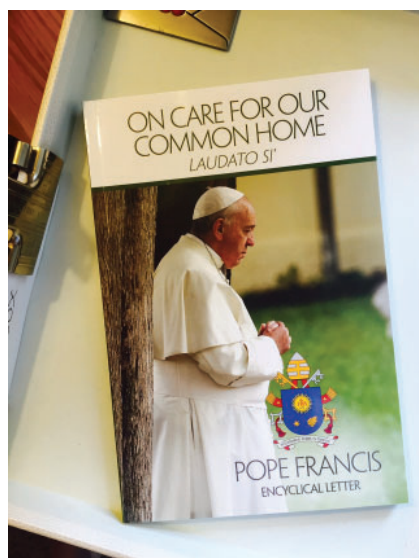

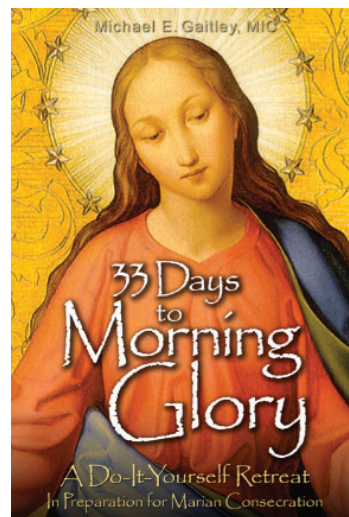
#### 6 Saturdays: February 18 to March 25
