Well things are really hopping around here! Our school opened its doors this week and several meetings took place inaugurating the new program year. It is going to be a great year.

This week, the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council met. I am so grateful for the parishioners that serve our parish on these vital governance structures. I am also appreciative of the great work our school board and religious education board do for us.

On August 31, we will be hosting the Third Annual Solemn Vespers for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation at 7 p.m. in the Church. This is a major ecumenical effort between the Archdiocese of Chicago and the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Chicago. SS Peter and Paul have been great friends as we have worked a lot together. I am grateful to Fr. Nick, Jim Riley and our Creation Care Ministry for preparing for this celebration. Please come!

This past summer, incoming 8th graders; Matthew Boylen, Connor Garrigus and Matthew O'Brien hosted a basketball competition for incoming 5th and 6th graders. They donated almost \$400 in proceeds to Sr. Paulanne's Needy Family Fund. You guys make us proud.

We have an author in the parish! I just read Jeff Jacobs new book, "Get Off the Couch and See It Live"! This is a sports fan's delight; to read about Jeff's remarkable efforts to witness some of the greatest sports championships from the 1978 Cotton Bowl to the 7th game of the Cub's World Series. He generously shares some of the strategies that can get you to the 50-yard line or mid court at an NBA game. We need to have a night with Jeff to present his book to his fellow OLPH parishioners.

The Stephen T. Sexton Foundation was established in 1987 by Ed and Mary Sexton to provide resources for the study and prevention of suicide. Their son Stephen's death led to the establishment of this foundation. As the foundation enters its 30th year, over \$1.4 million dollars has been disbursed. You can get more information by visiting the website; ssmf.co. Recently three college scholarships were awarded in honor of Mary Sexton who passed away last year. Thanks Ed, for all you are doing through this foundation.

I am leaving for our annual parish pilgrimage. We have a group of 30 made up of OLPH and Holy Cross parishioners. A highlight of our trip will be celebrating Mass at the Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa just outside Krakow. Next year's pilgrimage will be from June 18-28 and will take us from Barcelona to Lourdes to Avignon to Nice. In 2020, we will be going to the Passion Play in Oberammergau and explore Croatia and Slovenia. Give it some thought!

Our Men's Club had an awesome golf outing last week and are putting the final touches on the Block Party, happening Saturday, September 9. It begins with one of the most popular masses of the year – on the rectory lawn – at 5 p.m.

Sacrament

For many of us, the catechism definition of Sacrament was “an outward sign, instituted by Christ to give grace.” You can’t argue with that. They certainly are. And for most of our lives, we have thought about and talked about receiving the Sacraments and indeed, we did receive Baptism, Eucharist, Reconciliation, Confirmation and perhaps, Matrimony, or Holy Orders, and Extreme Unction (before they changed it to Sacrament of the Sick.)

But what if Sacrament was defined as “a Sign of God’s love?” If we came to understand Sacrament in that way, there would be way more than seven sacraments. Signs of God’s love are all around us.

But getting back to Sacraments—what if they became not just something we receive but something we become. What if we came to understand that by Baptism, not only do we become part of Christ’s body, the Church, but we become the Sacrament of Baptism—a living sign of God’s love? As a community, the Church is called to be sacrament—a sign of God’s love, for all the world to see and experience. Individually, we too are called to be signs of God’s love in what we say,

what we do, how we live our lives.

And when we sin, then we are not being a sign of God’s love but an imperfect sign of God’s love in the world. But we become more fully a sign again when we ask forgiveness, or Reconciliation. Others see we believe in God’s mercy and, in turn, our lives reflect our ongoing desire to love God and love one another.

Baptism is a daily Sacrament. Every day, many times a day, we are called to live out the beliefs and promises made. Confirmation is a daily Sacrament. Confirming our commitment, renewing our baptismal promises and always striving to remember who God is, who we are, as Church, as Sacrament.

Baptism and Confirmation are not merely once in a lifetime Sacraments. They are once and for all, a daily living out the Law of Love, the rule of the Kingdom of God. Hopefully, coming to a greater depth and awareness that we are sacrament for one another, we will draw closer and closer to the One who is, and was, and forever will be, Jesus--the Greatest Sacrament.




Join the Children's Choir and the Middle School Choir


PROJECT LINUS Meeting | Wednesday, August 30, 9-11:30 am | Hickey Hall*

OLPH Book Club



Recently we've been reading a book about the murder of a Catholic priest in Birmingham, Alabama, in 1921, by a local Methodist minister. The case is very important in American legal history partly because the defense was financed by KKK. Defense attorney was Hugo Black who subsequently became a member of KKK. Though a civil rights champion in later life, in 1921 Black was just months away from donning the robes of the Ku Klux Klan. The Methodist minister was found not guilty because of temporary insanity. This is a great and very readable book.

Next, we took up a book that was on our list many years ago, but we decided it deserved another reading. "An Interrupted Life" is the story of her own life told by Etty Hillesum. Like Anne Frank, Etty escaped from the Nazis for a while, but was finally captured and met her death in Auschwitz Death camp. Her reflections on evil in the world, and how to protect herself from bitterness and anger are quite remarkable. This is certainly a book that will enrich any reader's life.

The book we've selected for our next meeting is "Vesper Time" by Frank J. Cunningham. Its subtitle is "the Spiritual Practice of Growing Older".

"From a writer, editor and publisher in his eighth decade, *Vesper Time* addresses the yearning among elders for continued growth, expansiveness of heart, improvement of mind and a meaningful understanding of their lives. As with Christianity's age-old practice of Vespers, or evening prayer, Frank Cunningham, views it as a time when colors deepen and our experience of aging becomes our spiritual practice.

With humor and wisdom, he looks at five facets of this integral spirituality- memory, intimacy, diminishment, gratitude and acceptance- offering guidance and encouragement for those who are on this stage of their journey of life."
