

Dear Parishioners,

"A voice cries: Prepare the way of the Lord!"

On this Second Week of Advent, the scriptures present to us the extraordinary person of John the Baptist. He embodies the vibes of this holy season.

Isaiah describes in his poetic manner the one who is to come proclaiming the imminent arrival of the long-awaited Messiah. He

cries out to us, a voice grounded in urgency. Now is the time to make "straight the wasteland".

Advent is all about the process of preparing ourselves for the rebirth of Christ in our hearts and in the world. There are many voices that are crying for our attention these days, from the mundane to the profound. It is not easy tuning out the noise so we can hear more clearly the urgings of John the Baptist to open our hearts to the glory of the Lord.

In our recent parish pilgrimage, we were blessed to visit the holy site of Bethany-Beyond-the-Jordan. This is the place many scholars believe is where John the Baptist baptized Jesus. It had been off limits to pilgrims because this part of the Jordan was inundated with land mines from previous conflicts between Israel and Jordan.

In a remarkable gesture of interfaith grace, King Abdullah of Jordan donated property adjacent to the site for the development of Christian Churches, monasteries and pilgrimage facilities. There are now Orthodox, Catholic and Lutheran churches along the shore where we commemorate the baptism of the Lord. It is always the

highlight of a pilgrimage to the Holy Land to step into the waters of the Jordan renew one's baptismal vows.

In this land now torn a part by a horrific war, Bethany-Beyond-the-Jordan speaks of a powerful possibility of a religious place so sacred and respected. For this holy site to have become a reality it required an enormous commitment from Israel, Jordan, the Muslims, the Jews and the Christian community to work together. Efforts like these are so rare in this deeply divided part of the world but it happened!

It will be a long time before pilgrims will be able to return to this beautiful place but it to me embodies the challenge of the prophet Isaiah who we hear today. War leaves everything in its path a wasteland. Isaiah dreams of a place where valleys will be filled, and mountains will be made low. Anything is possible if we embrace the Good News!

As one drives from Jerusalem to Bethany-Beyond-the-Jordan, you travel through the most barren part of the Jordanian desert. There is nothing but mounds of sand as far as the eye can see. As you approach this holy site on the Israeli side of the Jordan River you are transformed by the luscious beauty of the trees and vegetation that prevails because of the water of the Jordan River.

Life thrives in a place surrounded by the severity of a lifeless desert where temperatures soar during the day and plummet at night.

John invites us to be transformed by the waters of baptism and the Holy Spirit. May our Advent be a journey of coming upon the life-giving waters of the Jordan. May



Advent Candle Lighting Sign-up



A New Tradition at OLPH!

OLPH Pilgrimage Walk to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe

The Way and the OLPH Scripture Study Ministries will coordinate the first annual OLPH pilgrimage walk to this incredible shrine on the vigil of the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12). It is the most visited shrine in the US dedicated to Guadalupe and the second most visited in the world after the Basilica of Guadalupe in Mexico City.

Why is it meaningful to walk to the Shrine for the feast?

This Shrine has a very special connection with the original Basilica of Mexico. In 1996, a digital replica of the original image of Our Lady of Guadalupe was received at the site of today's shrine. This was the first replica to officially be sent to an international destination from the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico. In 1997, the Rector of the Basilica in Mexico blessed and named this site as

the Cerrito del Tepeyac de Chicago, or Little Tepeyac Hill. The Rector poured soil brought from the original Cerro del Tepeyac in Mexico City and blessed and enthroned the image of Our Lady in the new Cerrito.

This important visit consolidated a significant and permanent relationship between this site and the Basilica of Mexico, making it a place where pilgrims can fulfill their pledges or promises to Our Lady of Guadalupe as if they were being fulfilled at the Basilica of Mexico. In 2013, Francis Cardinal George canonically declared that the Cerrito del Tepeyac de Chicago would be known and formally

established as the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Today, just like in Mexico, people walk to the Shrine to visit Our Lady. Walking slows us down, helps us spiritually connect with nature, and quiets our minds so we may hear God speak in our heart and possibly answer deep questions. That is what a pilgrimage is all about. Join us for this new Advent tradition!


A Peek at our Week
