"He came to testify to the light".

If you are looking for an Advent Field trip, I highly recommend a visit to the Art Institute of Chicago's exhibition (here until Dec. 31), "Among Friends and Rivals: Caravaggio in Rome." The painter, Michelangelo Merise da Caravaggio, was the sensation

of the Roman art scene in the late 1500's. He had the remarkable ability to combine a realistic scene with a dramatic use of light. Many of his paintings were religious in nature. A whole school of students and established painters emulated his manner of painting, some of the most famous of his time; El Greco, Guide Reni, Bernini to mention a few. They became known as The Caravaggisti.

He became known as the great illuminator as his ability to shed "light" on subjects in darkness communicated a meaning on a whole different level.

The contrast between light and darkness is a major theme of Advent. We hear today that John the Baptist understood his mission was to testify to the light, the light of Jesus Christ.

Caravaggio's life was a metaphor for this challenge, to find and testify to the light. He struggled with much darkness in his personal life. He was constantly getting in trouble, unable to conquer the darkness and demons in his own life. This brilliant and influential painter in the end died way to young.

Like John the Baptist, we are called to testify to the light. Advent leads us from darkness to the light only Jesus can offer. These Advent days can call all of us to be bearers of the light as Christmas approaches.

Everyone of us has to contend to some degree with the forces of darkness. Sin ultimately is about the darkness and hopelessness of greed, resentment selfishness, envy or despair.

Isaiah has sent us to proclaim glad tidings to the poor! The message of this Third Sunday of Advent is filled with words of hope, reassurance and joy. We are reminded by Paul that we must, "Rejoice always".

This weekend is called Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday to rejoice as we are now have past the midpoint of Advent. As we approach the Winter Solstice and eventually Christmas, we begin ever so slowly to see the daylight expand.

May these Advent days be filled with light, hope and joy. Despite Caravaggio's personal struggles his paintings

"Caravaggio introduced dramatic effects of light and shadow in his paintings and often used ordinary-looking people to illustrate religious stories.

"In the sixteenth century a new emphasis was placed on Mary Magdalen's role as a converted sinner. Caravaggio depicts Mary's sister Martha, dressed modestly, reproaching her sister for her wayward conduct and enumerating on her fingers the miracles of Christ. This exact moment of the conversion was obviously a tremendous challenge for the painter because the change is spiritual rather than physical. Caravaggio's solution was to manipulate the light that illuminates the Magdalen, giving her an unearthly glow. The mirror, a traditional Image of vanity, now reflects the light of divine revelation." - Detroit Institute of Fine Arts

Please remember in your prayers, **Russel Stern's** mother **Shirlee Stern**, who passed away recently. May her memory be a blessing.



New Toys for Needy Children


