Dear Parishioners,

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light."

Merry Christmas! The earth rejoices as we recall that most blessed night when Jesus Christ was born into history. This is the season of remembrance and celebration. We can easily be transported back to Christmases of the past by a song or a scent.

We are brought into the Christmas of the present and future as we see the eyes of wonder in the face of a young child.

I pray this Christmas finds you in good spirits and health. So much happens in our lives over a year.

During our preparations for our Centennial Anniversary a few years ago, we discovered a tradition that was observed by our first parishioners, many from Trier, Germany. They would sing Silent Night in their ancestral language of German and then in English the language of their new country and home.

"Stille Nacht, Helige Nacht! Silent Night, Holy Night! The original song was written from a poem written by a pastor, Fr. Joseph Franz Mohr and put to music by Franz Xaver Gruber. On Christmas Eve 1818, this beautiful hymn was first sung. It quickly would become one of the most cherished and beloved

Christmas Carols. There is such reverence for this hymn that it is never sung before Christmas Eve in German and Austrian communities. The church it was first performed at was St. Nicholas in Oberndorf, Austria. The church's pipe organ had been damaged by a recent flood, so it was performed with a guitar accompaniment.

This beautiful hymn evokes the image of a calm, bright and silent Christmas Eve night in a forest overlooking a little village. It speaks of the wonder of a tender and mild newborn child. As the priest was walking, he was overwhelmed by a sense of peace. It became somewhat of a miracle as the Germans paused on Christmas Eve 1914 during World War I, for a truce by invoking this hymn in German. The Hymn of the Christmas Truce was matched by the singing of the hymn in French by soldiers on the other side. They exchanged simple gifts across the border of war. A remarkable moment made possible by this glorious hymn.

As we observe the 104th anniversary of this hymn being sung in the sanctuary of OLPH, my prayer is one of peace! Peace in our troubled world as this Christmas Bethlehem is in darkness. Peace on the streets of our cities plagued by gun violence and poverty. Peace in our hearts as we all have anxieties and fears.

Silent Night, Holy Night! All is calm, all is bright. Round yon Virgin Mother and Child,

Holy infant so tender and mild. Sleep in heavenly peace, Sleep in heavenly peace.

To all of you I thank God for the gift of you in my life as your pastor. This parish has a remarkable history of being faithful to the

profound beauty of that first night of life in Bethlehem and recalled by our ancestors of faith.

May this beautiful hymn find a place in all our hearts this Christmas Eve. We will certainly be observing this 104th year as we sing this glorious hymn.

May your Christmas be blessed! May you find peace on this Silent Night, this Holy Night!

matters, with OLPH cooks preparing and delivering a warm meal. We also make casseroles, freeze them and have them available in the Sharing Room to hand out in emergency situations.


