

Dear Parishioners,

"Together at the Table"

This is commitment weekend for the Annual Catholic Appeal. Each year we are invited as members of the Catholic Community of the Archdiocese of Chicago to support the larger mission of the Church.

Fr. Jerry Boland, Pastor We live in the third largest Archdiocese in the United States, and we face many challenges responding to the needs of our faith community.

This weekend's gospel is appropriate for this effort. The Gospel recounts the miracle of the healing of the leper. Illness in the ancient world was a source of fear and judgement. Because leprosy was so contagious, people who were afflicted were driven from the community and were isolated in remote areas. There was also the declaration that they were unclean in the eyes of Jewish law and were forbidden to be near others.

This miracle is profound in many ways. Through this miracle, Jesus brings the leper back to the table of community life. He is no longer marginalized but restored as a member of his village and faith community.

The resources of the Appeal are meant to bring as many people as possible "to the table." This may be the table at which the poor, the sick, the broken do not feel welcome. The resources generated by the Appeal support lowincome parishes, the Archdiocesan ministries that reach out to young adults, families, and children. Resources that assist in the formation and ongoing development of priests and seminarians. Resources to provide scholarships for children attending Catholic schools. The Appeal also supports Catholic Relief Services that assists those suffering from natural disasters around the world.

Funds that are raised above our goal remain in the parish. We invest this money in projects that benefit all of us. The installation of the carpet in the Church for instance was funded by money that exceeded our goal. Some of these funds will help offset the new bells system and clock tower in the Church. With funds raised this year we would like to explore an elevator for the Playdium and to enhance the renovation of the kitchen in McDonnell Hall.

These two projects will be a major help in making our facilities accessible for everyone! The Playdium is a

fantastic asset, but it is really challenging for a person with a disability to enter. Many of our events in McDonnell Hall involve hospitality. An upgrade to the equipment and space will serve generations of parishioners.

I am most grateful for your consideration of supporting the Annual Catholic Appeal. I know you are faced with many requests. The process will take place at the liturgies this weekend. Thank you for your patience!

This coming weekend is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of our Lenten journey. Our Lenten theme is, "No greater Love." Through our observance of Lent, we will see firsthand the power of the love of Christ which will give us the strength to deepen our faith.

A calendar and the schedule of Ash Wednesday services is included in the bulletin and website. I will also be distributing ashes at the train station that morning.

We have many services and programs to assist your Lenten journey. We will have meditation booklets for your use. They provide daily meditations on the scriptures and thoughts to consider. Lent is 40 days, but it will fly by, so we need to hit the ground running!

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are the spiritual disciplines of Lent. Through our liturgies, our parish mission, our opportunities to receive the sacrament of reconciliation we truly experience a season of grace as we encounter the reality, there is "No Greater Love" than that of Jesus Christ.

On Sunday, February 25 we will have a special reflection at our liturgies from sisters who are members of the Order of St. Basil the Great and they serve on the frontlines of the war in Ukraine. These sisters were recipients of the Catholic Extension 2023 Lumin Christi Award. Their visit will coincide with the second anniversary of the Russian invasion. Through your generosity we have sponsored several Ukrainian refugee families. These sisters demonstrate there is "no greater love" every day assisting those whose lives are being shattered by the war. It will be a moving experience.

Congratulations again to our eighth graders from the school who were confirmed by **Bishop Casey.** I am so proud of them. I cannot wait for our Religious Education candidates who will be confirmed soon.






