

Dear Parishioners, "No Greater Love"

Our Lenten journey has begun. Lent always begins in the heart of winter. The world of nature is dormant, even on mild days there is a winter tinge in the breeze. We are encumbered by coats, hats, and scarves. There is an introspective energy to the world that anticipates the coming Spring

and the great Feast of Easter.

As you can see in the Bulletin, we have many opportunities to enhance your Lenten journey. Beginnings are important and although the 40 days of Lent seem quite long, the days will pass all too quickly, we must get into the groove! "Now is the time" the prophet Joel declared on Ash Wednesday. Let us seize upon the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Make sure you get a copy of one of the Lenten meditation books available at the exits. Try to "do" something daily that keeps alive the Lenten journey in your heart.

Let us pray for one another. I am always aware of the collective power of transformation and reconciliation that unfolds as the Lenten days pass. Lent is challenging work if we really are getting into it. Deprivation, holding ourselves accountable, changing patterns of behaviors, seeking reconciliation is not easy.

We can find great encouragement in our Lenten theme, "No greater love." The focus of Lent draws us over and over again to the love of Jesus Christ. The gospel this weekend recounts the beginning of Jesus' ministry. The Spirit drove him into the desert for 40 days. We are invited into a 40-day journey into a spiritual desert where we are invited to encounter head on the forces of evil and sin in our lives. We must leave all that behind if we are to move forward in our desire to be a more authentic witness of Jesus Christ and his kingdom.

We are not alone in this quest for purification and a new life. There is "no greater love" than that of the Lord himself. In the desert he would encounter the love of his Father that would help him conquer the temptations of the devil and the grip of self-centeredness.

There is nothing more healing and reassuring than the experience of love freely given with no strings attached. With an awareness of Christ's unconditional love for us, there is no healing beyond our grasp, no personal struggle that cannot be conquered, we can do it!

May this be the most blessed of Lenten journeys!

We have had a lot going on recently. Last weekend's Blood Drive was a great success. Special thanks to Guilds 2 and 10 and **Mary Kay Haben**'s cookies! Thank you for your patience and consideration of this year's Annual Catholic Appeal, "Together at the Table." Congratulations to **Bob and Connie Hicks** who took home the coveted recognition of their 70 years of marriage at our Valentine's Day Mass last weekend.

One of the great traditions of January is the OLPH Junior Basketball Camp. Over three hundred children from kindergarten to first grade and their parents participated. Special thanks to Coach **Marty Kearney** and his team of assistant coaches that provided a fantastic opportunity for the kids of the parish. It was amazing to see how much the kids developed their skills over the 4 weeks. I love seeing the kids and their parents having such a fun time.

We had a recent book club discussion on Fr. Jim Martin's book, "Building a Bridge," hosted by Fr. Jim Barrett. The book is a reflection on lessons learned by Fr. Martin's outreach to the LGBTQ community. A topic like this generates a lot of issues and perspectives on this topic. I appreciate the many people who participated, the thoughtful conversation and the insights that emerged when people of good will come together. It was evident that we must continue to come together for further reflection. We are just at the beginning of this conversation as a church. This conversation impacts so many in our community. I was so moved by the stories of families coming together to love and cherish their son, daughter, brother, sister, or grandchild who is coming to terms with their LGBTQ identity.

I will be sharing with you in more details my reflections on the recent Vatican instruction, Fiducia Supplicans that encourages God's pastoral blessings on all of us, especially those who have not felt cared for by the church. The document mentions the spiritual needs and blessedness of those who are LGBTQ or couples in irregular nonsacramental unions.

Next Sunday we will have several Ukrainian Sisters of the Order of St. Basil the Great who are serving in some of the most violently afflicted areas of the war in Ukraine speaking at our masses. This weekend marks the second anniversary of the Russian invasion. Catholic Extension has recognized their heroic ministry and witness to Christ's unconditional love. It would be hard to witness a better expression of our Lenten theme, "No Greater Love."

NO GREATER LOVE

We all want to be loved. Love is a basic human need that allows us to fully thrive in our world, and it is only through experiencing love ourselves that we learn how to love others. The essence of love is God, and we witness in the Gospels how Jesus not only preaches about love but models that love for us in how He lives. When Jesus commands us to "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12), have you ever stopped to consider what it means to love as Jesus loved? Only by understanding the depth to which Jesus loves us can we truly understand how Jesus wants us to love one another.

For centuries, humans have celebrated love through music, art, literature, and drama, and we relish the telling of a great love story. Of all the stories of love that have been told and retold throughout the ages, however, there is none greater than the love story we encounter in scripture about the ministry of Jesus.

When Jesus left his home in Heaven, he became fully human and accepted the will of His Father to be the Savior of the World. For three years, he preached about the Kingdom of God and healed the bodies and the souls of all those who approached him. In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus was plagued with doubts and fears about the suffering he knew was imminent, but his love for us impelled him to offer himself up to the Roman soldiers. Christ endured the agony of a crown made of thorns and the cruelty of being flogged, to then be taken bloody and bruised to stand humbly before those who would then ridicule and mock him. The cross, which held the weight of our sins, was placed upon his shoulders to be carried to the place of his execution.



Jesus fell three times, but such was his love for us that he rose each time and continued on. When his body was stretched out on the cross, and he looked down on those who stood below, his thoughts were for the care of his mother. He did not curse those who crucified him but, instead, cried out, "Father forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). Jesus tells us "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13).

Most of us will never be asked for so great a sacrifice, but what Jesus does ask is that we care for one another, that we tend to the needs of the poor and the vulnerable, and that

we forgive one another, even our enemies. Imagine what a different world we would live in if we practiced this kind of love—the love of Christ!

In 1 Corinthians 13:4-7, St. Paul tells us that "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." And, in verse 8, Paul assures us that "Love never ends."

Before his ascension into Heaven, Jesus comforted his apostles by letting them know, "I am with you always, to the close of the age." When we face the darkest moments of our lives; when we feel afraid; when we are convinced that no one cares; all we need do is raise our eyes to Heaven, open our hearts to his Word, and reach out our arms to receive him. He is always there, walking by our side and lifting us up. There is "No Greater Love."

with **Fr. Larry** as moderator, will discuss our Lenten theme, "No Greater Love" and what it has meant to them on their journey of faith.


Kaylee accompanied by **Russell Stern** will open and close the morning with song.

(a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level, and the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.



forgiveness of Christ. Each Saturday afternoon, a Confession, also known as Reconciliation or Penance, puts us face to face with the mercy and priest is available in church to hear confessions.

Fasting

The Church requires all those between 18 and 59 years of age to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. 


