

seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...



Dear Parishioners,

"I will bless you abundantly."

Throughout this Lenten season, we will be reflecting on the word covenant. This word means an agreement between two parties. In biblical terms it is a sacred bond that was often sealed in blood.

Fr. Jerry Boland, Pastor Last week, Yahweh set a rainbow in the sky as an assurance of the covenant he made with Noah, he would never destroy the earth with a flood. Today we hear the most sacred of the Old Testament covenants, the one between, Yahweh and Abraham, "I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars in the sky."

During the consecration, as the chalice is elevated, we hear the words, "This is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant."

You are part of a covenant! You entered a covenant with the Lord when you were baptized and affirmed at your Confirmation. In many ways, Lent is our annual renewal of our covenant. On March 30th, Easter Sunday, you will renew your baptismal vows after the homily, in a way extending your end of the covenant for another year! How am I living up to my side of the covenant? How are you living out your promise to be a faith filled witness of the love of Jesus Christ?

We need to embrace the disciplines of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We need to be deliberate in our choices. In addition to going to Mass, am I "at" Mass, being attentive to God's Word and the reception of the Eucharist? Am I generous, merciful, and authentic as a person?

The Lord is always faithful to his side of the covenant, Lent gives us the space and time to renew our side of the covenant.

I was struck this week hearing confessions of our Religious Education students of their genuine desire to be better people. There is such a blessing when we encounter the genuine desire to be a holier person. I thank the Lord for all the influences on these young people's lives, their parents and families, their teachers, catechists, and coaches. It takes a village!

Another opportunity to celebrate reconciliation is this coming Saturday's event, Penance, Prayer, and Pasta. It begins with 4:00pm confessions in our Reconciliation Room. Thanks to **Erin Bretts** and the Religious Education team for hosting this event.

This weekend I am delighted to welcome **Sr. Lucia Murashko**, **OSMB**. She will be speaking at the 9:00am, 10:30am and 12:00pm Masses. She and the members of the Basilian community serve Ukrainian Catholics here in the USA and Ukraine. This weekend marks the second anniversary of the Russian invasion. The sisters were essential to the evacuation of terrified residents whose cities and towns were being destroyed. Sr. Lucia personally stayed in places of imminent disaster to help evacuate the physically disabled. She is a profound witness to me of what happens when a person embraces their covenant of faith to the Lord. Her reflections will be livestreamed and there is contact information in the Bulletin if you would like to reach out to her.

This Saturday is a Lenten retreat for all young people in the 7th through 12th grades. I am so grateful to **Zoe Sundstrom**, **Fr. Patrick Kizza**, and the Youth Ministry teams for their efforts in planning what I am sure will be a terrific experience. Please pray for our retreatants.

This Tuesday is our annual Communal Lenten Penance service. We are hosting it for parishioners of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, St Catherine Labouré and St. Norbert. It will begin at 7:00pm. Our own Fr. Patrick, will be presiding.

I am grateful to **Sara Carston** and the Parish Pastoral Council for hosting and planning last week's Mass of Appreciation and reception. This is an event to express gratitude to all those who serve the almost eighty ministries here at OLPH. As I looked out at the congregation last Saturday, I could not help but feel the power of the words of this week's first reading from the Book of Genesis, "I will bless you abundantly."

Congratulations to our newest parish author! **Daniel Gordon**, son of Maurice and Dianna Gordan has published a book, "The Passion of Love in the Summa Theologiae of Thomas Aquinas." It was published by the Thomistic Ressourcement Series.

Sisters of Ukraine SPECIAL VISIT

Sr. Lucia Murashko, of The Sisters of the Order of St. Basil the Great from Ukraine will speak to our parish community at the 9:00am, 10:30am, and 12:00pm Masses. There will also be a reception for Sr. Lucia after the 9:00am and 10:30am Masses in the South Vestibule where parishioners will have the opportunity to meet and speak directly with her.

The Sisters of the Order of St. Basil the Great's monastery in Zaporizhzhia, Ukraine, is close to the front lines of the ongoing war between Ukraine and Russia. Since February 2022, their city has been under constant missile attack. Their entire monastery shakes when the missiles land. Once, when Sister Lucia Murashko was huddled in her room during an air raid, she realized that if a Russian missile struck her monastery, she would likely fall dead onto the altar in their chapel directly below her. Accordingly, she prepared what she would say to her Lord if that came to pass. "Here I am!" she would say to Jesus, "Ah, you look so nice! I have wanted to see you for some time."

The sisters have shed many tears in recent months for their country and their people, but they haven't lost their sense of purpose. Like the Ukrainian people, their will cannot be broken. There is no time for fear or despair. In their monastery and across



Ukraine, the sisters house women and children, whose husbands and fathers are at war and whose homes and livelihoods have been destroyed.

The sisters also make frequent trips to the frontlines, realizing that vulnerable people are stranded, unable to evacuate due to health or age. They make regular supply runs to these wartorn villages less than a mile from combat, bringing food, gas for cooking, water, clothes and sleeping bags in the coldest months.

Why the sisters enter such peril again and again is true to their missionary identity. "We decided what we have to do is help those who are most in need," said Sister Lucia, who is among the sisters making these life-threatening journeys. "We have a car, we have something to share, and we have a face because we trust that God will help us."

The Sisters of the Order of St. Basil the Great are true heroes around the world. They risk their lives and give their all to refugees as they begin an unfamiliar life in a new country.

As this war continues to devastate this country, the sisters' presence will not waiver. They carry on as a powerful example of courage and selflessness to all whom they serve.

Sister Lucia, whose name poetically and appropriately means "light," said, "The source of our light is Him. It's Jesus, you know, and He just works. You just have to follow Him. He does all the things that are needed. It is He who works. Jesus inspires us, and we just do what we can."



Now that's a SUPER Sunday!






