

seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

"There is a wideness in God's Mercy."

This is the opening line from one of my favorite Lenten hymns. God's Mercy stretches wide, wider than our wildest imaginations. We can all too easily seek to narrow or restrict the wide embrace of God's mercy. How often self-righteous attitudes can sweep into our hearts. We somehow become the bearers of who can

receive God's mercy and who can't. We can come to believe that some people are outside of God's mercy, don't deserve God's mercy or must be condemned at every chance.

The gospel for this Sunday in the Cycle A readings is the women at the well. She is a Samaritan and a woman that no observant Jew would go near. Not only does Jesus go near her but engages in one of the great conversations of Jesus recorded in the New Testament. So much of the conversation is rooted in mercy, a "wide" mercy that transcends ethnicity, religion and gender.

As a church, much less the larger society, we do not do well with merciful thinking, merciful behavior, merciful mindfulness. We can be all too quick to judge, demean, dismiss and divide. The devil's mission is to divide and very good people all too easily fall prey to this sinful force. We can be all too quick to judge, condemn and "crucify" someone we don't agree with, or we have found fault with.

The Camboni Fathers many years ago established a "peace" corner" on the West Side of Chicago. This was a place where people could come that was safe, free of judgement, a place to encounter those who were different or those we have been conditioned to hate. The peace corner on West Madison Avenue is in the midst of one of Chicago's most violent neighborhoods.

One of the reasons this ministry has thrived over the years is because it is grounded in a conviction that the mercy of Christ's love shatters the ability of the devil to divide. Racial identity, past struggles, poverty, differing political or religious views are dissipated when we encounter the loving mercy of Jesus Christ who loves us beyond our expectations. Christ loves us so much that we may wonder like St. Thérèse of Lisieux, could he have any love left to love another person.

We can be bombarded with the cruelty of others. Lent calls us to be bearers of God's mercy not his judgement.

There indeed is a wideness in God's mercy!

Last weekend was so wonderful. I was deeply moved by several efforts on behalf of Religious Education. Special thanks to Erin Bretts, the catechists and others who helped celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation. We had a wonderful experience of Penance, Prayer and Pasta Saturday evening. I believe a new tradition has been born here at OLPH.

We had a terrific Lenten Retreat Day for the teens. Thanks to Zoe Sundstrom and the retreat team. Our seminarian Andrew Whipple did a great job. I just love seeing our Youth Ministry efforts flourish.

Thank you for your generous support last weekend of Sr. Lucia from Ukraine. Talk about a minister of mercy! She is an inspiration to me of someone compelled to love in an environment of such hatred. She was so grateful for meeting many of you. She has headed back to her monastery in Ukraine, please continue to pray for her and the people of Ukraine during this time of war.

Had a great time with our Stepping Out Ministry and their Chili Cookoff! The competition was intense! What a wonderful time. Thanks to Pat Marziani, Janis Moylan and the chefs!

I just wanted to update you on our efforts to enhance public safety here at OLPH. You know that I take public safety issues quite seriously. Both the school and parish secured grants this past year to continue to build up our safety infrastructure. We have increased video surveillance of the campus. We have a safety officer on campus during the day. There have been enhancements to our classrooms. In the coming months we will enhance the exterior lighting of our campus and upgrade some of the entrances to our buildings from a security perspective.

I have mentioned in the past that from time to time I receive anonymous letters that can be threatening in nature. Recently some in the parish received such letters targeting some members of the staff. I work very closely with the Glenview Police Department and always turn those letters over for their review and possible criminal investigation. The safety of our staff and parishioners must be insured. We are blessed with an outstanding police department here in Glenview. We just cannot tolerate those who threaten and seek harm. Please pray that the wideness of God's mercy can touch the troubled hearts of those who are driven by hatred.

This weekend is our quarterly SPRED mass at 9:00am. One of my favorite Masses to preside at. We have a terrific community that prays with and catechizes our students in the SPRED community. Can't wait to celebrate with them.

May the wideness of God's mercy be yours this Lent! Father Jerry Boland

WHAT WOULD YOU DO FOR YOUR CHILD?

What would you do if your child was faced with unimaginable violence, crushing poverty, and natural disasters?

Would you send them to another country to escape all these things and have enough faith in God that your child would survive without you at their side?

That's what thousands of teens are doing as they make the long treacherous journey from Central America.

Shelters exist to provide comfort to unaccompanied teens while the Office of Refugee Resettlement seeks to match them with US sponsors. There are facilities in the Chicagoland area that care for these traumatized kids. In the past, OLPH parish collected gently used shoes, coats, bags and Bibles, but these collections stopped during the pandemic.

Young teens (13 to 17 year-olds) are passing through our area again. The facilities need bed sheets and the kids need duffle bags.






Youth Ministry spent Saturday February 24th in retreat, deepening their understanding of our Lenten theme,

No Greater Love.


