Dear Parishioners,

"Our God is rich in mercy."

Throughout this Lenten journey I have been struck by the word mercy. It has been a significant theme in the Sunday scriptures this year. Mercy describes a way in which compassion or forgiveness is shown toward someone whom it is within one's power to punish or harm.

As we encounter the reality of sin in our lives, we are confronted with the truth that "our God is rich in mercy" as we hear in this weekend's second reading. God would have every right to punish us for our sinfulness yet all he demonstrates is incredible mercy. He rejoices when we choose to become a better person.

This reassurance we need to hear! There is "no greater love" than the merciful love he seeks to bestow. If we are willing to change our ways, we will encounter the power of His redemptive love. It seems so easy, so obvious but many of us are haunted by the residual memories of poor choices, missed opportunities, acts of unkindness or cruelty we have perpetrated on another person.

The way of mercy demands of us the willingness to be merciful as the Lord is merciful. How do my actions reveal the heart of a merciful person? When we slip into the web of gossip or hearsay, when we judge another person with little interest in their situation, when we close our hearts to kindness or generosity, we have drifted far away from the blessed mercy we are called to embrace and witness.

I worked very closely with **Cardinal George** in his dealings with priests. Whenever I would bring him to a meeting where there was going to be controversy or "hot topics" to be discussed, he would close the opening prayer at such gatherings with the phrase, "may charity guide our discourse." How lacking is this virtue in our current public discourse? Charity being a byproduct of mercy. How many family gatherings these days can be impacted by approaching topics that will divide people into their political corners.

I think of the bullying tactics of some who will seek to destroy those whose opinions or perspectives they cannot even give the decency to listen to. How quick some are to throw around moral judgments with little regard for the facts or circumstances?

"Our God is rich in mercy." Whom have I been merciless with? Who are the people I have mistreated with harsh words or actions? Where does the merciful love of God need to be in my life, my relationships, my choices?

We are drawing close to the great feast of St. Patrick. We have a wonderful St. Patrick's party planned here on March 16 by the Men's Club. There will be Irish music, dancers, food and beverages! Come join in the fun!

I was thrilled to hear that our parishioner **Judge Jack Hagerty** and his family are being inducted into the Irish American Hall of Fame. For 70 years, he and his family have produced the longest running Irish orientated radio show in the United States. The Irish Hour is broadcast every Saturday from 11:00am to 1:00pm on 1490 AM radio station. My family has listened to this broadcast as long as I can remember. After Jack's father's premature death many years ago, the family took on the production of this great radio show. Congratulations!

One of the great celebrations around St. Patrick's Day is the annual St. Patrick's Family Mass at St. Juliana. I am honored to be this year's principal celebrant and homilist. The Mass will be on March 14 at 7:00pm at St. Juliana.

Congratulations to the OLPH 8th grade basketball team on winning the Catholic League Championship. What a great team! Also, congratulations to the Loyola Girls Basketball team as they claim the title 2024 IHSA State Champions! How awesome is that! 



Please consider donating clothing items you will no longer need to the SRC. We welcome *in-season, gently used* items which will be passed on to those in need. We also welcome gently used housewares.


Feed the Hungry at Catholic Charities/Des Plaines



WHAT WOULD YOU DO FOR YOUR CHILD?

What would you do if your child was faced with unimaginable violence, crushing poverty, and natural disasters?

Would you send them to another country to escape all these things and have enough faith in God that your child would survive without you at their side?

That's what thousands of teens are doing as they make the long treacherous journey from Central America.

Shelters exist to provide comfort to unaccompanied teens while the Office of Refugee Resettlement seeks to match them with US sponsors. There are facilities in the Chicagoland area that care for these traumatized kids. In the past, OLPH parish collected gently used shoes, coats, bags and Bibles, but these collections stopped during the pandemic.

Young teens (13 to 17 year-olds) are passing through our area again. The facilities need bed sheets and the kids need duffle bags.
