Dear Parishioners,

"Hosanna"

The Liturgy of Palm Sunday is one of the most dramatic in terms of shifting moods. The Liturgy begins with the retelling of Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem. jubilant crowds chanting, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" They were convinced that Jesus was the new David, the one who would liberate Israel from Roman

occupation.

One of the moving experiences for a pilgrim to the Holy Land is to follow in the footsteps of Our Lord, reenacting his journey from the top of the Mount of Olives to David's Gate where Jesus entered the city of Jerusalem. In some ways little has changed. From the top of Mount of Olives Jesus overlooked one of the great cities of the ancient world. One big difference was the existence then of the temple which would have dominated the "Skyline". As the Gospel that begins this weekend's liturgy is proclaimed one can't help but feel the euphoria of people waving palm fronds and olive branches.

The euphoria and jubilation was very short lived.

Those who were cheering Hosanna would soon be shouting. "Crucify him!"

We are going from Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem to the solemn proclamation of Our Lord's passion and death on a cross.

This week the Church commemorates the events of Our Lord's passion, death and resurrection. I really encourage you to participate in these solemn liturgies which are so powerful, so moving. I find these liturgies to be some of the most solemn in the course of the year.

During the Palm Sunday liturgy, the Passion of Our Lord by the evangelist Mark is proclaimed.

The proclamation concludes with Joseph of Arimathea who brought linen to wrap his body after he had been taken down from the cross, took him to a tomb and rolled a stone against the entrance to the tomb.

Jesus born in a stable and buried in a borrowed tomb.

When families gather for celebrations, there are often moments in which people start remembering and retelling significant events in their collective history, from the mundane to the profound. This week, we the family of believers retell the foundational moments of our Christian faith from the euphoria of Palm Sunday to the Upper Room, to the crucifixion on Calvary, to the sealing of the tomb. All of this must be retold for next week to make any sense.

Please pray for all those who are in the final days of preparation to be baptized and received into the Church next Saturday, especially our candidates here at OLPH.

The schedule of services and special events is listed on the next page in this week's Bulletin.

We are still in the afterglow of Round Ball. This year's tournament was as good as ever. I am so grateful to the Men's Club that organizes and financially supports the Tournament. Tom Cronin and Artie Collins and a legion of volunteers do an extraordinary job. Also, thanks to Dr. Amy Mills, the faculty and staff, that make things happen. Special thanks to our Athletic Director, Kyle Aksamitowski, Linda Smith and their crew. The games were a blast to watch and take over the campus. I am suffering from Post Roundball Depression Syndrome!


The Ceremony will be held in McDonnell Hall at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church on Palm Sunday, March 24 following the Noon Mass.

Seven Churches Visitation

Holy Thursday March 28 from St. Catherine Labouré Church

On Holy Thursday, after the Mass of the Lord's Supper, there is a very beautiful and ancient tradition of visiting seven churches. Each Church will have an Altar of Repose of the Blessed Sacrament, so while the rest of the world goes to sleep, Catholic pilgrims will be traveling late into the night keeping Jesus company on the eve of his Crucifixion.

This is a time for intense prayer and devotion in the presence of the Most Holy Sacrament as we enter into the holiest days. Visiting the altar of Repose in seven churches stems from pilgrims visiting the seven churches of Rome as a form of penance.

Join us in the visitation of seven churches around Chicago. We are planning on leaving by bus at 8:30pm, after Mass of the Lord's Supper at Saint Catherine Labouré Church. We will visit seven Churches in the Archdiocese of Chicago in which we will pray with Jesus and contemplate the mysteries of our faith.





Holy Saturday Blessing of Easter Foods

11:30am Holy Saturday, March 30

We invite you to join in **Swieconka**, meaning "the blessing of the Easter baskets", the Slavic Easter celebration at OLPH on Holy Saturday.

The tradition is said to date from the 7th century in its basic form, the more modern form containing bread and eggs (symbols of resurrection and Christ) are said to date from the 12th century.



In this service, foods traditionally eaten for breakfast on Easter Sunday are blessed. Choose your favorite basket to fill with:

Eggs - a symbol of new life and the resurrected Christ

Ham - an acknowledgement of the New Law, putting aside the Old Law which forbade the eating of pork

Lamb - made of butter or cake dough, symbolizing Christ as the Sacrificial Lamb

Horseradish - a reminder of Christ's suffering and the bitter herbs offered Him on the cross

Salt - symbolizing wisdom needed in our daily lives

Bread - the essence of nourishment for our bodies and the appearance under which Christ is present

This joyful celebration draws people from all over the area and it is a great way to kick off the Easter Celebration following the solemn observance of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday.

Fr. Paul is leaving Chicago

After five unforgettable years in Chicago, I am returning to Eastern Africa in July. I will be based in Nairobi, Kenya, to continue the work of establishing Hekima University in Molo, Kenya (the first four-year Jesuit University in East Africa). I am sad to leave Chicago and the United States, but excited for the opportunity to be on the ground, equipping young Africans with the skills that will transform their lives and bring hope for generations to come.

My time in Chicago has been truly fulfilling. I spent two wonderful years at Saint Ignatius College Prep, fundraising under President John Chandler's mentorship, as well as teaching economics and theology. I then worked with colleagues of the Midwest Jesuits to raise muchneeded funds toward building Hekima University. That work continues with Fr. Endashaw Debrework, SJ, an Ethiopian Jesuit who was regional director of the Jesuit Refugee Service in Eastern Africa.

It has been a grace to serve at OLPH. I am always touched by your devotion as parishioners, your charity to many causes and your hospitality to international priests like me. I



am grateful that I have come to know many of you as friends in the Lord. None of this would have been possible without the kindness and generosity of the pastoral team: Fr. Jerry Boland, my countryman Fr. Patrick Kizza, Fr. Jim Barrett, Fr. Larry Basbas, Deacon Jim Revord, Deacon Christopher Weiland, and our dearest Sr. Paulanne Held. We can all agree that they are exceptional leaders and disciples.

To mark these five years and to say farewell,
