Dear Parishioners,
"Remain in my love."

This weekend's gospel from John is often proclaimed at weddings. It is wonderful to fall in love, it is wonderful to be in love, it is quite another challenge to remain in love.

Staying in love is not only a challenge for those who are married, but also a challenge that

we face in several other aspects of our lives. It can happen to the person who becomes burned out in their career. The passions that led a person to become a lawyer, a teacher, a priest, a doctor, a nurse, whatever can fade over time. We stop growing professionally and begin to become very cynical. We become obstinate to change. We begin to see the very people we are supposed to be serving as the "enemy."

I worked for many years in priest personnel, facilitating priests going through a change of assignment. Some were just so resistant to the reality of change. They felt entitled. They had long since forgotten their vocational call to be "one who serves" as opposed to one who is served. Their life was embroiled in conflict and blaming, taking no responsibility for their own life and joy.

How do we remain in love as a spouse, a parent, a friend, a disciple?

Keeping ourselves alive personally, professionally, emotionally, and spiritually is a daily challenge. We need to take care of ourselves! We need to stop blaming others, criticizing others and take responsibility for our own life.

The Easter Season is a great opportunity to allow the spirit of new life and new possibilities to take hold. After a long winter let the energy of Spring unleash itself in our hearts. Build up others rather than tear them down, build bridges of new possibilities rather than walls of isolation. Do not be afraid of new ideas, new ways of doing things. We are a work in progress!

The readings of this week make a compelling case to remain in the love of Christ. "Love one another as I have loved you!" In the Letter of St. John this weekend we hear the challenge "Love one another, because love is of God." As Peter proclaims in the passage from the Acts of the Apostles, "God shows no partiality." He loves us all!

How do I remain in love as a person of faith? Celebrating the Eucharist, opening my heart to the Word of God, being honest with myself regarding my struggles with sin, approaching others with kindness and a generosity of spirit can keep me connected and growing as a person of faith.

One of the best ways to "remain in love" is the Eucharist. This weekend we celebrate First Communion with our second graders in the school and next weekend with the Religious Education candidates. First Communion celebrations are the holiest days of the year for a parish as we praise God for the gift of all these children who are coming to the Lord's table for the first time. I cannot wait to celebrate with them. I am so renewed as a person of faith by their witness to receiving Our Lord's Body and Blood for the first time. Please pray for them!

One of the great examples of faith in "remaining" in the love of the Lord is **Sister Rosemary Connolly** of Misericordia. Since 1969 she has been an apostle of Christ's love to the community of Chicago. She is marking her 75th anniversary as a Sister of Mercy. My family has known her for many years. She is the embodiment of the invitation, "Love one another as I have loved you." Congratulations Sr. Rosemary! We all love you and are grateful for your ministry beyond words.

we can understand the magnitude of Christ's love for us and how our response to this love can be lived.

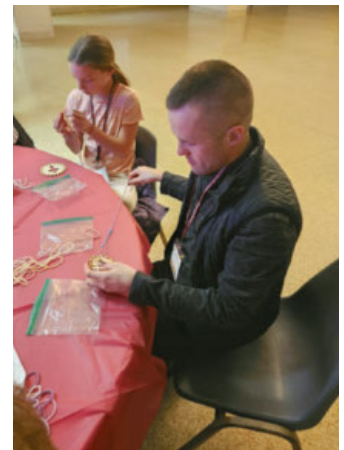

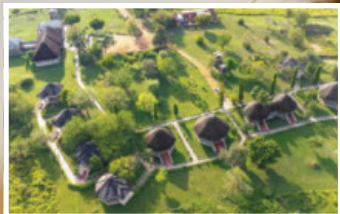
GAIL'S STORY:

WHAT WOULD YOU DO FOR YOUR CHILD?

What would you do if your child was faced with unimaginable violence, crushing poverty, and natural disasters?

Would you send them to another country to escape all these things and have enough faith in God that your child would survive without you at their side?

That's what thousands of teens are doing as they make the long treacherous journey from Central America.

Shelters exist to provide comfort to unaccompanied teens while the Office of Refugee Resettlement seeks to match them with US sponsors. There are facilities in the Chicagoland area that care for these traumatized kids. In the past, OLPH parish collected gently used shoes, coats, bags and Bibles, but these collections stopped during the pandemic.

Young teens (13 to 17 year-olds) are passing through our area again. The facilities need bed sheets and the kids need duffle bags.
