

Dear Parishioners,

"Proclaim the gospel to every creature."

On this Feast of the Ascension, we are invited to focus on the mission of being a disciple.

I am in the midst of a diocesan effort to help pastors become more effective in forming their parishes around evangelization. This word can make some Catholics feel a little

uncomfortable as it might suggest we should be on street corners with a Bible in hand trying to recruit new parishioners.

The Word means to bring the Good News, the Gospel of Jesus into the world, the circumstances of our lives, the core of how we see ourselves as a disciple.

American culture has been reluctant to embrace the expression of faith too publicly. We live in a "live and let live" environment where religious convictions are better kept to oneself. Some of this has to do with the pluralism of American society and our constitutional preference to separate church and state.

The fact is, religious values have had a tremendous impact on our shared public life, initially Judeo-Christian values and now many other religious faith traditions effect our lives. America is at its best when religious values help to shape our life as a nation. It was religious voices that condemned slavery, that motivated Americans to confront Fascism and Nazism. It was the voices of faith communities that put the civil rights movement in a moral perspective. It is religious convictions that have challenged us as a society to resist selfishness, greed, racism, ethnic based discrimination, and a whole other host of societal evils. Seeking to eradicate poverty and violence are grounded in religious convictions that encourage the shared responsibility we have for one another. This is what community is about.

A foundational aspect of the teachings of **Pope Francis** is his challenge that we become missionary disciples. This challenges us to look to ways to share aspects of our faith with others, it calls us to worship as a community. We joyfully seek ways to invite those who have drifted away to come back to the community. Discover new ways to apply the teachings of Jesus Christ to the myriad of challenges to the quality and sanctity of human life. We seek to serve others and to witness to the Love of Jesus in our own lives to others.

As a parish we have been committed to many of these aspirations, but the times require an even firmer more visible expression of our faith.

As Jesus ascended to heaven, the disciples began to realize that the teachings and values to what Jesus had formed in them would fade away if they did not seize the opportunity to be missionary disciples of the Good News. Wow, did they ever! As we move to the conclusion of the Easter Season on Pentecost, let us renew our desire to be missionary disciples.

Congratulations to our parishioners, **Lou Marohn** and **Deacon Dave Kalina** who were recognized by Village Board of Glenview for their extraordinary service to our nation in the military.

I had a wonderful visit this week at the Northfield Township Food Pantry that each month serves hundreds of people who are food insecure. Our parishioner, **Alida Nally**, **Shiva Moshenzadeh** and the staff are so impressive. There are several OLPH parishioners that volunteer and support the Pantry. They have great plans to significantly upgrade their facility on Waukegan Road just south of Willow. We will be helping to spread the word on ways we can support the Township that provides so many social service programs.

This weekend the second collection is being taken up to support that annual Catholic Charities Mother Day's Collection. We recently had **Sally Blount** on campus who is the President of Catholic Charities. This collection supports many vital programs that assist thousands of people in our metropolitan community.

This past week the Women's Club installed their new officers; **Colleen Mocogni** as President, **Brook Cornell** as Vice President, **Ann Demand** as Treasurer, Communications Coordinator **Erin Cook** and Marketing Coordinator **Elle Cunningham**. 


