Dear Parishioners,

Happy New Year!

I have never known a New Year so anticipated as 2021. For most of us the past 9 months have presented challenges we would have never imagined. We have all had to adapt to changes that have altered so much of our lives. Amid all that COVID-19 ushered in, many had to deal with illness, death of a loved one, unemployment, marital difficulties, emotional issues that in ordinary times would be so hard but so overwhelming in this context.

Every year the venerable, Oxford English Dictionary chooses a word of the year that captures the lived experience of the past 12 months. For instance, in 2019 it was "climate emergency" in 2018 it was the word, "toxic". This past year there were so many words that they just threw their hands up and said there were so many contenders, they could not come up with a winner.

In the past year, we have embraced a multitude of new words or words that carry a much different meaning; for instance the phrase "I heard he was positive" is not a good thing. Phrases like; we must flatten the curve, deal with Zoom fatigue, remote learning, we must mask up, you are in a vulnerable population, have become common place. Who had ever heard of hydroxychloroquine before last March?

If I were to suggest a word that captures so much of the past year, I would suggest the word "**essential**".

We had admired deeply, essential workers, benefitted from essential services, depended on essential supply lines.

I have come to a deeper appreciation of the relationships in my life that are essential. So many things that I thought were essential to my well being were not and many things that I took for granted that were far more essential.

My faith emerged as far more essential. I saw this affirmed repeatedly as people expressed to me their yearning to receive the Eucharist, to experience community through the parish, to find hope in a time of discouragement.

I have seen valiant demonstrations of the "essential" power of faith as people resisted the selfish, criticizing and self-righteous impulses that have plagued the larger society. I have seen how "essential" love, patience, kindness, gratitude and encouragement are.

This weekend the Church celebrates one of the oldest feast days in the history of Christendom, The Epiphany. We acknowledge the Light of Christ and its power to dispel the darkness that can easily take over. The scriptures invite us to acknowledge those who are bearers of the light in our lives.

The church looks beautiful! As this Christmas Season concludes next weekend, I praise God for those who have been "essential" to our celebrations. I speak for all of us in thanking the countless greeters and ushers who sacrificed part of their Christmas celebration to keep us safe. Considering many protocols, our music was terrific, the environments of the Church, McDonnell Hall and the Playdium were beautiful. To our lectors, Eucharistic ministers, deacons and priests, our communication and virtual production staff and our custodians, you were terrific. And **Sr. Paulanne**, what can I say; you were the link that kept all of us going.

As we begin a New Year, the light of Epiphany shines before us as a beacon of hope. The promise of the vaccine will help us begin to turn the corner on COVID-19. A New Year invites us to dream about a community of faith, more "essential" than ever!

May the New Year be blessed!

seek, share, rejoice - religious education...

“When you call on the Holy Spirit, He will come.”

Dear OLPH RE Families,

Blessings to you and your families in 2021! The most concise homily that I ever heard was given by a young Dominican priest. He stood at the pulpit, paused intentionally for a moment, looked out upon the assembly, and said, ***“When you call on the Holy Spirit, He will come.”*** Then he turned around and sat down in his chair. There was great silence in the Church for several moments until he moved on to lead us in the Creed. His simple words were powerful and memorable.

In the healing stories of Jesus, he never says, “I have saved you.” He says, “your faith has saved you.” Our faith is truly a divine gift. Let us open this gift of faith more fully this year. Let us not see religious education and faith formation as a drop-off program, a burden, another class to endure, another task to check off our list, another zoom meeting to attend.

But let us ask for the grace to discover that religious education and faith formation for what it truly is: a heavenly gift, waiting to be opened each day for ourselves and for our children. What can be more important than helping our children to discover and develop their relationship with God? Helping children to know and encounter the God of mercy, Emmanuel, who is always with them; always loves them; always forgives them.

“Do you mean to say, this is for my soul?”

Ministry with children is always with families – with their parents and grandparents, sponsors, godparents, siblings, cousins, aunts, uncles, and friends. Ministry with children is not limited to children as children rarely come alone.

A big part of my responsibility as a Director of Religious Education is to provide faith formation to adults – to care for all souls: parents, catechists, and sponsors. We provide opportunities for adults to rediscover and relearn our Catholic faith with their children, and to remind everyone that we are in this faith journey together.

Our faith is not something we do to, or for, our children, but faith is something that we do with our children. This is an important distinction that may make all the difference in our approach to teaching, learning, and living our faith with our children.

Why is that? Because we cannot teach our children our faith, or show them how to grow in our faith, or to love our faith, if we are not seeking the same for ourselves with them. If we do not continue to learn our faith, if we do not live our faith, we will not flourish as God intends for us to flourish. The idea is like the purpose of an oxygen mask that the airline stewardess asks you to put on yourself first, before you put an oxygen mask on your child, so that both of you may live. Jesus not only wants us to live, but to live abundantly in Him. And he sent the Holy Spirit to remind us of this.

More virtual retreats coming in 2021

So stay alert parents, catechists and sponsors; more virtual retreats will be coming to you in 2021, as long as we cannot gather in person. And once we may gather in person, we will celebrate at each parent/catechist/sponsor retreat. You will see how important the Christian community is to your family, and that when we call on the Holy Spirit, He will certainly come.

I really, really hope that I get to meet you and your children in person this year! It is so strange not to be able to connect names and faces and children with their parents, siblings and cousins.



Continued blessings to you and your families in 2021. You remain in my prayers. Please keep me in your prayers.

Here now are viewing options for parishioners:



3) youtube.com/user/olphglenview - We will still use YouTube for special content and archived homilies. However, we are now using Vimeo as our main archived site.


