SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

The first Sunday of the season of Lent always includes a Gospel account of the temptation of the Lord Jesus in the desert by the devil. This year, the story is set against the backdrop of the first reading from Genesis, which recounts the very first temptation by the devil. That story is set in a garden of delight. The Gospel story is set in the desert.

As believers, we know that temptation comes our way in our own gardens of delight as well as the deserts of our lives. As Lent begins, our attention is drawn to that temptation within each of us to become like God-we want control, power, and answers to all of life's difficult questions. As communities of faith, we are given this season of repentance so that we can join our hearts with others on the difficult journey of conversion

We look to God and to one another for strength against temptation.

Dear Parishioners,

"For God so loved the world, He gave us his only Son"

As our Lenten journey begins, we are invited to reflect on the ways we can become a more authentic witness to the Risen Christ.

The word **Lent**, came from the Old English word, *lencten*, (related to "lengthen" referring to the lengthening of days), which was a reference to the approaching season of spring. In the earliest of days, the penitential season in the Church always fell during the springtime preceding Holy Week and Easter. The word "Lent" became synonymous with this penitential period. It also was easier to say than the official Latin title for this season, which was *quadrageisma*, which means "40 days" (or more literally the 40th day before Easter). This term identifies the season with the 40-day period of preparation before the celebration of Jesus's passion, death and resurrection.

Over the centuries, spiritual writers and mystics meditated on the connection between springtime and the penitential season of Lent. Lent is a time of spiritual renewal. In a sense a spiritual "spring". **Saint John Paul II** reflected on the season of Lent as, "a call to conversion that leads us through prayer, penance and acts of fraternal solidarity to renew or reinvigorate our friendship with Jesus in faith, to free ourselves from the deceptive promises of earthly happiness and once again to savor the harmony of the interior life in authentic love for Christ".

Lent is an invitation to "return to the Lord with your whole heart". Lent is a gift; may it truly mark a new spring in our spiritual lives. It is not too late to establish some plans to make this Lent fertile ground for new life. Whether we are giving something up or deliberately doing something positive, to remind us of our need for conversion, don't miss the opportunity to make this the best Lent possible. At first glance forty days seems like a long time but like all things the days will pass quickly, and Easter will be upon us.

Our gospel this weekend begins; "At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for 40 days and forty nights." That same Spirit is leading us into a period of spiritual conversion and renewal.

This week's bulletin is full of invitations to assist your Lenten observance. Please get a copy of our Lenten prayer books. They can provide a structure to your daily prayer. Check out our Lenten calendar. Almost every day there is something going on to keep the Lenten spirit alive.

Thank you for your consideration of this year's Annual Catholic Appeal. The theme. "Come follow me and heal our world", reminds us of the many dimensions of the work of the Church that are supported by the Appeal.

Last week's celebration of Ministry Appreciation planned by the Parish Pastoral Council was terrific. Thanks to the President of the Council, **Maria Grable** and the members of the Council who worked so hard. It was a time for me of being especially aware of the legion of parishioners that ministerally serve our parish. Special thanks to **Bob Pirsein** for planning such a beautiful liturgy.




OLPH Book Club
