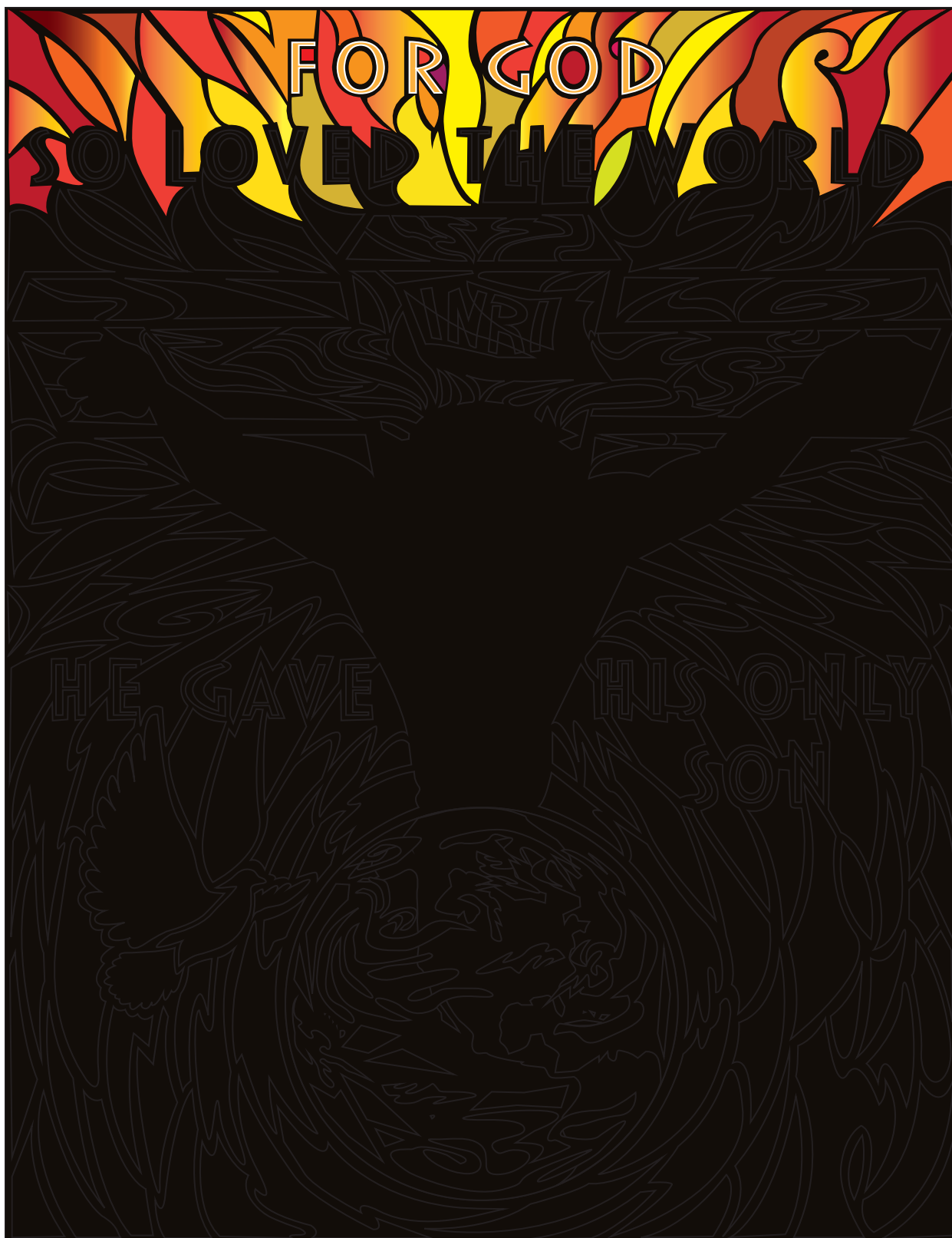

Thoughts on the

SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

The first Sunday of the season of Lent always includes a Gospel account of the temptation of the Lord Jesus in the desert by the devil. This year, the story is set against the backdrop of the first reading from Genesis, which recounts the very first temptation by the devil. That story is set in a garden of delight. The Gospel story is set in the desert.

As believers, we know that temptation comes our way in our own gardens of delight as well as the deserts of our lives. As Lent begins, our attention is drawn to that temptation within each of us to become like God—we want control, power, and answers to all of life's difficult questions. As communities of faith, we are given this season of repentance so that we can join our hearts with others on the difficult journey of conversion.

We look to God and to one another for strength against temptation.

Dear Parishioners,

"For God so loved the world, He gave us his only Son"

As our Lenten journey begins, we are invited to reflect on the ways we can become a more authentic witness to the Risen Christ.

The word **Lent**, came from the Old English word, *lencten*, (related to "lengthen" referring to the lengthening of days), which was a reference to the approaching season of spring. In the earliest of days, the penitential season in the Church always fell during the springtime preceding Holy Week and Easter. The word "Lent" became synonymous with this penitential period. It also was easier to say than the official Latin title for this season, which was *quadageisma*, which means "40 days" (or more literally the 40th day before Easter). This term identifies the season with the 40-day period of preparation before the celebration of Jesus's passion, death and resurrection.

Over the centuries, spiritual writers and mystics meditated on the connection between springtime and the penitential season of Lent. Lent is a time of spiritual renewal. In a sense a spiritual "spring". **Saint John Paul II** reflected on the season of Lent as, "a call to conversion that leads us through prayer, penance and acts of fraternal solidarity to renew or reinvigorate our friendship with Jesus in faith, to free ourselves from the deceptive promises of earthly happiness and once again to savor the harmony of the interior life in authentic love for Christ".

Lent is an invitation to "return to the Lord with your whole heart". Lent is a gift; may it truly mark a new spring in our spiritual lives. It is not too late to establish some plans to make this Lent fertile ground for new life. Whether we are giving something up or deliberately doing something positive, to remind us of our need for conversion, don't miss the opportunity to make this the best Lent possible. At first glance forty days seems like a long time but like all things the days will pass quickly, and Easter will be upon us.

Our gospel this weekend begins; "At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for 40 days and forty nights." That same Spirit is leading us into a period of spiritual conversion and renewal.

This week's bulletin is full of invitations to assist your Lenten observance. Please get a copy of our Lenten prayer books. They can provide a structure to your daily prayer. Check out our Lenten calendar. Almost every day there is something going on to keep the Lenten spirit alive.

Thank you for your consideration of this year's Annual Catholic Appeal. The theme. "Come follow me and heal our world", reminds us of the many dimensions of the work of the Church that are supported by the Appeal.

Last week's celebration of Ministry Appreciation planned by the Parish Pastoral Council was terrific. Thanks to the President of the Council, **Maria Grable** and the members of the Council who worked so hard. It was a time for me of being especially aware of the legion of parishioners that ministerally serve our parish. Special thanks to **Bob Pirsein** for planning such a beautiful liturgy.

Get set! Roundball is just around the corner. The Queen of Hearts raffles on Wednesday nights are a lot of fun.

Fr. Patrick has received his visa in Uganda and is scheduling a return flight. It will be great to have him back. His father is feeling better and Fr. Patrick had a great time distributing the soccer balls that we collected.

I am very grateful for your words of support concerning my extension as your pastor. I am very blessed to be here.

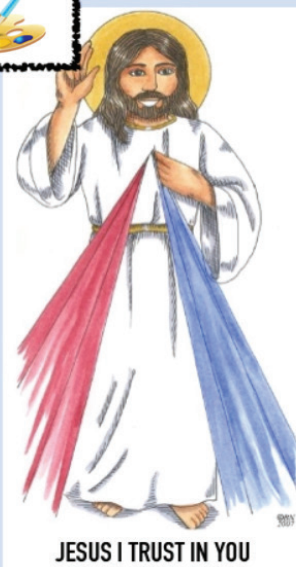


Divine Mercy Children's Art Contest

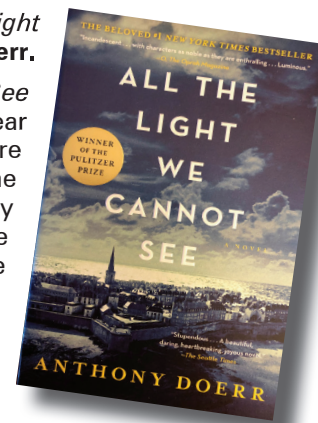
OLPH Book Club

Our book this year is, *All the Light We Cannot See* by **Anthony Doerr**.

All the Light We Cannot See begins during the final year of World War II. Hours before Allied airplanes bomb the French city of Saint-Malo, they drop leaflets that warn the inhabitants to evacuate. The two protagonists, 16-year-old Marie-Laure LeBlanc, a French girl, and 18-year-old Werner Pfennig, a German soldier, are introduced. Neither had evacuated Saint-Malo.



Read how the two are pivotal to the story line. You will find their stories provocative and compelling. Two people encounter each other during the horrors of war. They bring "light" to a world darkened by war. (Cliff Notes)

They say, "a mother's work is never done," but, truly, no one's work is ever done. The dishes washed today need to be washed again tomorrow. Nor does any lawn ever stay mowed, no car ever stays repaired, and no musical instrument ever stays in tune. Such is the nature of things. So, if we're going live with things, then we need to be good at repairing, refurbishing and polishing them—over and over again.

What's true of the laundry, the car and the piano is also true of our relationships. We don't stay in perfect harmony with each other very long, nor do we stay in perfect harmony in our most important relationship of all—with God. Something is always pulling us apart. But it doesn't have to stay that way, not if we can get good at putting things back together again, and again, and again.

"God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son" to repair the breach between himself and humankind. And if we learn to master four essential "tools" of everyday relationship repair, we can do our part in this great project of salvation.

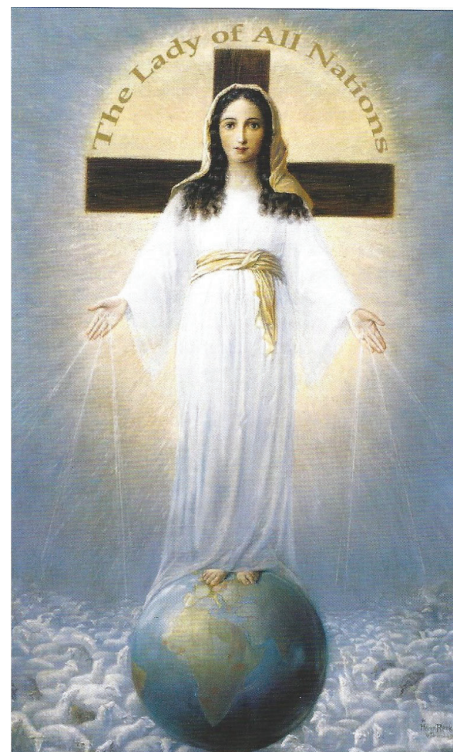
