Dear Parishioners,

Many spiritual writers describe Ash Wednesday as beginning the Lenten Spring. They describe the spiritual landscape as mirroring the world of nature. Just like nature, we go through seasons, times of dying, death, regeneration and new life. Lent invites us to go beneath the surface of our life, to reenergize our passions, to allow some things to die and to nurture new possibilities.

We are all entering the Lenten Spring together! There is tremendous power in the realization that we are not alone in our quest to be holier, more faithful disciples. As a parish, we have many things planned. Please make sure you pick up a copy of the Lenten edition of the *Magnificat*. It is a daily prayer book of meditations and reflections. Please pick up our Lenten Card that is filled with resources and information about opportunities for prayer and devotion. This Sunday at 7:30 p.m., our Lenten Mission begins at St. Catherine of Labour with a stirring presentation of the play, *Damien*, by Wayne Messmer. Friday evenings we will have Benediction and the Stations of the Cross. Daily Mass is at 6:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. Every Saturday, we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m.

We need to hold in prayer the 17 candidates in our RCIA program. Lent is a special time of intense preparation as they will be baptized, received into full communion, receive the Eucharist and be Confirmed at the Easter Vigil. I joined them last week at their retreat at Techny Towers. What a wonderful group and special thanks to their catechists and sponsors.

Last week's OLPH 101, the SPRED Mass and Pre-Cana sessions were terrific. I am always grateful to Ben Tchaou who photographs so many of these events for all of us to enjoy.

The mild winter has allowed us to get an early start on a number of projects. We recently installed several bollards along the perimeter of the playground

to provide much needed protection.

We've experienced long-term difficulty with flooding around the northeast corner of the Church that required completely replacing the drainage system leading to the Grove Street sewer. We have established a smooth path for those in wheelchairs, or who use walkers or canes, to access the elevator. We ask that priority be given to those parking places for people with disabilities.

We are entering the final phase of receiving pledges for our capital campaign, "To Teach Who Christ Is". We need \$400,000 to reach our goal and have the funding necessary to accomplish all of our projects. We are reaching out to everyone. Please join us if you can.

We have already begun the transformation of our parish. Recently, I entered the parking lot off Glenview Road one evening and was so taken at the Parish Ministry Center ablaze with beautiful light coming from the Sisters' residence, Hickey Hall and the Religious Education Center. That building, once so dark, now is flowing with energy and new life made possible by the capital campaign.

We are installing the hearing loop in the Church! This is possible because of a designated gift to the Campaign in memory of Loretta Garvey. We will soon be gathering hearing-impaired parishioners and publishing information in the bulletin on how easy it will be to make a simple adjustment on your hearing device and have direct access to the sound system. What a blessing this will be! Loretta loved this parish and was so committed to the Church and the liturgy. What a wonderful gift that will allow hundreds of parishioners to more actively participate in the liturgy and other events in the Church and McDonnell Hall. The Campaign is a great opportunity to enhance our parish. Please Help!

May your Lenten journey be blessed,



# Transformation: Living Christ's Mission Today

## What is Catechesis?

After reflecting on the spiritual growth opportunities for our community, the Transformation team decided that we could best serve our parish by focusing on two broad initiatives: *Communio* (how we live as a Christian community) and *Catechesis* (knowing Christ's teachings). In many ways, it is difficult to have a robust, responsive Christian community if you do not know the actual teachings of Christ!

Catechesis is an ancient word that simply means a systematic process for providing religious instruction. The idea harks back to the earliest days of the church when oral instruction was provided to the catechumens (the early church converts) before they were baptized. While we still give religious instruction to our youth and to converts to our faith, we want to examine catechesis in the context of a more personal renewal. For many of us, our Scripture Study program has offered an opportunity to delve into the Bible and deeply examine what these living words mean for our lives today. Transformation also asks us to balance what we have learned in the past with our life experiences and to re-examine knowledge and experience in light of the world in which we now live. How does Christ's teaching apply to us in this digital age?



In the Transformation workbook that guided our workshop, it states: "Catechesis helps us to know the person, the message, and the mission of Christ so that our entire lives are Christ-centered." As Mark Vogel, a Transformation team member, stated, "I thought I had it all worked out. I went to church every Sunday with a few friends. I had my favorite pew and donated to the church regularly. I thought I had

been doing everything right! Then I reflected on what was written in our workbook and realized that Christ is really asking much more of us. The true meaning of Christ's mission is much more challenging."

The purpose of Catechesis is to put us in communion with Jesus Christ so He can lead us to the love of the Father and the Holy Spirit. We might ask why it is of such importance to emphasize Catechesis at this time? Through the study of Christ's foundational tenets, we can realize the profound power of Christ to change every aspect of our lives, no matter where we are on our spiritual journey. We are all Catechists when we aspire to model Christ in our words and in our deeds. Christ's words can live in our actions, and they can resonate as vibrantly today as when Jesus spoke to his followers 2000 years ago. In this way, Catechesis is both personal and communal, something we receive and something we give away.

Transformation has already initiated programs that can help us rediscover the true significance of our Faith and to learn more about what it means to live Christ's mission. Fr. Nick plans to give quarterly talks, the first was on the meaning of Advent, the next will be a Lenten talk scheduled for April 1. "OLPH 101" is a fun course to learn about our Parish, and "Hearts Afire," is an in-house retreat that leads to Marian Consecration; both are being offered on designated Saturday mornings. Fr. Hickey will once again host his popular "Prayer Tastings," on March 15, 22, and 29. Other programs are now in the planning stages.

Because we exist in a much different age than the one in which Christ lived, we must consider new ways to bring Christ's message into our lives. We can still utilize and cherish the more traditional methods of communication that require talking with one another, drawing closer, and sharing stories of our faith journeys. But, it is also interesting to consider ways in which we can utilize digital media, social media, podcasts, and video to build even greater communities outside the walls of the traditional church. The reach could be revolutionary! The potential to revitalize the Church is why Fr. Lewinski, the Archdiocesan author of this program calls Transformation "a new Pentecost." It has the capacity to rekindle the spiritual fire in all of our lives.

### Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

This Sunday, those participating in OLPH's Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) will travel to Holy Name Cathedral for the Rite of Election which closes the period of the Catechumenate. With the testimony of sponsors and catechists, the catechumens and candidates for the sacraments of initiation will affirm their intention to join the Catholic Church. God has called them, and they have responded favorably. They are now elected to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. In the presence of the bishop, they inscribe their names in the Book of the Elect at the cathedral as a pledge of fidelity. Now the catechumens are called "the elect". They begin a Period of Purification and Enlightenment; the final, intense preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. You will notice that at 9:30 Mass, the elect will depart the church following the Liturgy of the Word in order to continue their preparation.

Please keep them in your prayers during Lent.

### New Hearing Loop Installed in Memoriam to Loretta Garvey

Through a generous, designated gift from the family of Loretta Garvey, new hearing loop technology has been installed in the ceiling of McDonnell Hall. This hearing loop makes it possible for hearing-impaired parishioners, their families and visitors, to easily adjust t-coil equipped hearing aids and listen directly to the sound system in either the Church or McDonnell Hall. We are especially grateful that fundraising efforts through "To Teach Who Christ Is" made this technological enhancement possible and will directly benefit many parishioners during liturgy and special events. An information session, signage, and bulletin and pulpit announcements will be provided to help inform our community of how to access the hearing loop technology.



Users with a t-coil in their hearing aids can now listen to the sound system directly through their hearing aids. Please check with your hearing care professional to see if your hearing aid is equipped with a t-coil and properly adjusted. ### Join Us for Prayer Tasting

---

All of us have a “hunger” for prayer and for a deeper relationship with God. But for a myriad of reasons a consistent, regular prayer life seems elusive for many of us. Join Fr. Tom Hickey in the “Lady Chapel” in church on three consecutive Wednesday evenings during Lent. Each evening will begin promptly at 7:00 pm and conclude at 8:00 pm.

Over the three evenings, Fr. Hickey will talk about how to develop a stronger spiritual life as well as discuss some of the common pitfalls we experience in prayer. Each week will also give participants time to sample and reflect together on a particular form of prayer from the rich storehouse of our Catholic tradition.

- March 15: We will discuss “lection divina” or the divine reading which is one of the most ancient forms of prayer found in the earliest centuries of the church.
- March 22: We'll explore "Ignatian Prayer". Employing our imaginations will be taught. This prayer method aids us in entering into scenes from the gospel to lead us to deeper conversation with the Lord.
- March 29: The focus will be on “Centering Prayer”. Centering Prayer has been made famous by figures like Thomas Merton and Thomas Keating. It is an apt form of prayer for those who need to get out of their heads.

Materials will be distributed at each session further explaining each form of prayer. Come and bring a friend!

Theologian Jack Shea: *The Woman at the Well Meets the man Born Blind and Lazarus*

Saturday, March 25, 9:30 a.m. in McDonnell Hall

During this Lenten season, we will read three long stories from the Gospel of John; The Woman at the Well, The Man Born Blind, and The Raising of Lazarus, on March 19, 26 and April 2, respectively. These are inspired masterpieces of spiritual illumination and instruction. But they are difficult to “catch on the fly”. They need interpretation in order to speak to our lives today. In our interactive session, we will work with these stories so they bring us both consolation and challenge.

John Shea is the Director, Program and Processes Development at the Ministry Leadership Center. He has published 17 books of theology and spirituality, three works of fiction, and two books of poetry. Dr. Shea is a theologian and storyteller who lectures nationally and internationally on faith-based health care, contemporary spirituality, storytelling in world religions, and the spirit at work movement.



*“The parables therefore serve a double function, well named by Walter Brueggemann, in his analysis of the prophetic calling: the need to criticize in order to energize. We cannot renew dysfunctional and oppressive systems without first discerning, naming and unmasking the inherent corruption. The guardians of powerful systems will go to great lengths to ensure this does not happen. The subversive pedagogy of criticizing in order to energize is risky business, yet without this daring, innovative endeavor, civilization loses its life-blood, the creativity of the human spirit is compromised, and destructive ideologies eat away at the living fabric of creation itself.”*

This is a quotation from *Christianity's Dangerous Memory: A Rediscovery of the Revolutionary Jesus*, by Diarmuid O'Murchu, which is the book for the next Book Club meeting on March 20. Richard Rohr considers O'Murchu to be a spiritual genius. O'Murchu says that Jesus lived dangerously. He did not fit into the conventional culture of his day. He questioned many of its core beliefs. He sought to empower the oppressed, and he paid the ultimate price for living this way. Yet 2000 years of tradition has replaced this revolutionary Jesus with an earthly prince – a ruler and hero- rather than the prophetic rebel who changed the course of history.

This stunning new book, written for adult faith-seekers, helps us meet the revolutionary Jesus once again. Diarmuid O'Murchu writes for everyone wanting to understand Jesus for themselves, those who know in their hearts that Christian faith is much bigger, deeper, and more challenging than churches have ever acknowledged or proclaimed.

### Why I have remained in the Catholic Church

Many of my family and friends have given up the practice of their faith. They often push me hard on why I remain a Catholic, in spite of the glaring scandals that I have seen.

When I look back on my life, I cannot but think of the years when it would be most attractive for me to give up the dream of living the life of a Jesuit priest. Why not be the same as my brothers and so many friends? So many of them have left the church in disillusionment.

One thing happened to me when I was in my darkest hours in seminary. I read carefully that prayer the priest recites before receiving Holy Communion. It concludes like this: "Make me always faithful to your commandments, and never let me be parted from you." I heard God telling me that faithfulness is a gift, a grace. I need to storm heaven, begging God constantly that he would keep me faithful. It is only the grace of God that can keep alive in me the ideals of my early zeal. And so I pray, again and again, "God, I really want to belong to you. I want to grow more and more in love with your son, Jesus."

One of the things that I most love about my Catholic faith is that it gets me, in a structured way, to want to turn away from sin, from what destroys love in my life. And I learn to constantly articulate the desires of my heart that I will continue to grow in love every day of my life to my very last breath.
