Thoughts on the

SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

Paul in his letter to the Romans quotes Moses from Deut 30:14. "The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart." The way of salvation is close. It is plain and easy. It is in us.

It is also there for all of us, "For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek: the same Lord is Lord of all."

The simplicity of this message is echoed in our Lenten theme from Joel 2:12:

"Return to me with all your heart."

How do we do that? Well, prayer is a good start.

"Return to me with all your heart!"

This year's Lenten theme is in many ways the spiritual center of our faith journey. The Lord is reaching out to us with compassion and conviction. What do I need to leave behind if I am truly in search of a deeper relationship with Christ?

Lent invites us to renewal, to deepen our reliance on Christ. Now is the time, the prophet Joel challenges us to proclaim a fast, gather the people, blow the trumpet. We are all in this together; none us is without sin; none of us is without a need to be closer to Christ.

There is such power when the community of believers declares its need for renewal. Thousands entered the doors of our Church this past Wednesday to be signed with ashes and to begin the Lenten journey.

We have many opportunities to assist you in your spiritual journey. Every week there will be liturgies, gatherings and events to accompany you. Please check the bulletin or the website. Daily mass draws many people. We celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation every Saturday at 4 p.m. If that doesn't work, do not hesitate to ask one of the priests after mass to hear your confession or simply call the parish office and we will make time for you. Back by popular demand are the Little Black Books for Lenten reflections.

Our Lenten project this year will be to support the NPH program that provides a safe and supportive environment for at risk children in Central America. Several children will be spending a week here at OLPH. We need host families for children who will be here. There is information in the bulletin if you are able. It will certainly be an enriching experience as many families will testify who hosted children last year.

I would like to close with a prayer written by Andrew Costello, that I pray every day of the Lenten Season:


Lent: More or Less

Illinois Bishops Warn Against Extreme Abortion Legislation in General Assembly

Illinois' Catholic bishops issued a statement against recently-introduced abortion legislation. House Bill 2495 and Senate Bill 1942, misnamed the Reproductive Health Act, include so many harmful provisions the full effect of these bills can hardly be imagined.

This package of legislation would repeal the state's Parental Notice of Abortion Act, which requires a

parent or guardian be notified when a minor seeks an abortion. The legislation would also repeal the state's current ban on partial-birth abortions, define abortion as a fundamental right, eliminate legal protections for hospitals and health care personnel who refuse to participate in an abortion, and dramatically change the current landscape of abortion law in Illinois.

Furthermore, the Illinois Bishops statement included the following:

"Abortion is not health care. It is the intentional taking of innocent and defenseless human life. Moreover, provisions in the law that allow healthcare providers to



live and work in accordance with their sincerely-held moral beliefs are not wrong. Freedom of religion and conscience protections are fundamental rights, enshrined in our state and federal constitutions, and they must be respected.

"Opposition to these bills do not require one to assume a pro-life political position. Opposition should be the natural result of applying

reason, fairness and a basic respect for human dignity to the examination of their contents. We cannot further devalue human life to the extent proposed in this legislation without dire consequences for ourselves.

We hope to lead all people of goodwill to rise up and be heard in opposition to these terrible efforts. Accordingly, in the days ahead, we will be distributing more information and calls to action. Today, we ask for your prayers and support as you certainly have ours."

Contact your state legislator to voice your opinion on House Bill 2495 and Senate Bill 1942.




