Dear Parishioners,

We continue our Lenten journey working hard on our spiritual well-being, overcoming the temptations put in our way, and hoping to rest in the presence of the Lord. I have heard from many parishioners about their spiritual work during this season of Lent. It is inspiring to learn about the efforts everyone is putting into their Lenten promises, especially the parish children. They encourage me by their enthusiasm and devoutness to the things of God. It is never too late to start Lenten observances, if you haven't done so: dedicate some time to pray, make a small sacrifice of fast or abstinence, and offer something as almsgiving.

This Sunday's readings give us a glimpse of the fulfillment of our faith. The Gospel of Luke, during this second Sunday of Lent, narrates the story of the Transfiguration. Peter, James, and John are taken by Jesus up the mountain to pray. They witnessed the most beautiful experience of their lives, so much so, that they wanted to stay there forever. What the story of the transfiguration wants us to know is that the story of the Christian faith ends well. It was this glimpse into the end of our faith that enabled the disciples to continue their journey down Mount Tabor and eventually to Calvary.


Now, we know the end of the story; it is a beautiful end. The glimpse into the end of our Christian story enables us to continue with our faith even in the midst of the sufferings of the world. If you have gone through some dark times in your life, allow Jesus to lead you up the mountain, so he can show you that the story ends well. Saint Paul in the second reading reminds us that "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body."

Fr. Boland is now in the Holy Land leading a pilgrimage from OLPH parish. They will visit Mount Tabor, the very place where the Transfiguration took place, and they will be praying for all of us here in Glenview, that Jesus may give us a glimpse of that beautiful end of the Christian story. I invite you to say a prayer for Fr. Boland and all the pilgrims who are visiting the holy sites in Israel, and for their safe travels back home.

Every year, we all look forward to "Roundball". What a week! all the games were so exciting. Students, parents, family, faculty, friends, and parishioners had a great time watching the students play. I was amazed by the great sportsmanship student and coaches display on the court. Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos

Observing Lent in Unity with Orphaned, Abandoned, and At-risk Children....through Prayer, Fasting and Giving Alms.

For many years, hundreds of OLPH parishioners have been generously supporting the orphaned, abandoned and at-risk young people of Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (Spanish for Our Little Brothers and Sisters). On three different occasions, we have welcomed them into our church for weekend Masses (as we will do for the fourth time over the weekend of March 30-31), worshipped and sang with them, and contributed to special collections on their behalf.

Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) is a unique network of orphanage homes and outreach programs in nine countries throughout Latin America and the Caribbean. NPH is dedicated to improving the lives of orphaned, abandoned and at-risk children and young adults by delivering unconditional love, comprehensive healthcare and a quality education. The goal is to help these young people overcome the poverty into which they were born and develop them into productive citizens who become leaders in their own communities.

Approximately 3,200 youths call an NPH home their home. Since its founding in 1954 by Fr. William B. Wasson, NPH has provided loving and stable homes to over 20,000 children. NPH outreach programs served more than 100,000 people in 2018.

Many OLPH parishioners sponsor one or more NPH pequeños (as the residents of NPH are called) and have gotten to know them through writing letters back and forth. Since 2014, dozens of teens and members of the OLPH adult community (including our own Father Isaac Lara and our Youth Minister, Randy McGraw) have participated in summer mission trips to NPH Guatemala to experience how the children there live, to forge deeper and more meaningful relationships with them, and to perform service work that contributes to their comfort and well-being. Last November, Father Jerry Boland visited the NPH home in El Salvador where he participated in the festivities and Masses for the home's annual graduation and quinceañera celebrations.

The season of Lent is observed through the three pillars of prayer, fasting and giving alms. In the coming weeks, we

will be learning more about how we can apply the pillars mentioned above with our observation of Lent as it relates to the NPH mission. As a means of making all this more real and compelling to parishioners here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, we will also be learning through thirteen young people and their adult chaperone from NPH Mexico who will be hosted by OLPH families in their homes from March 20-April 1, and through their appearance at our Masses on the weekend of March 30-31. Please consider adding them and the entire NPH organization to your Lenten prayer list, fasting in their name, and offering your financial support to them during the appropriate alms giving opportunities that the parish will provide during Lent.

Back in the mid-1950s, when Father Wasson was looking to name his fledgling Mexican orphanage, he looked to the Gospel of Matthew in Spanish to find the perfect words. They were, "El Rey les responderá: 'Les aseguro que todo lo que hicieron por uno de mis hermanos, aun por el más pequeño, lo hicieron por mí.'" In English, we know that passage as, "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you that whatever you did for one of the littlest of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'" It is from that passage that the organization was named Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos.

This Lent, and this week in particular, please prayerfully reflect on Matthew's words as you consider how you will observe Lent in unity with the least of our brothers and sisters living in some of our hemisphere's most poverty-stricken areas.

Johannes Brahms' Personal Journey for Meaning: The German Requiem by Greg Athnos Saturday April 6, 9:30am, McDonnell Hall

Robert Schumann called him: "the inheritor of Beethoven". An introvert in the age of extroverts, Brahms lived with Schumann and his wife Clara. He considered Schumann his mentor and Schumann's death at an early age, after being institutionalized for a mental disorder, greatly affected him.

Though he considered himself an atheist, Brahms set upon a path searching for "meaning" in life. Surprisingly, he began reading his mother's Bible. The verses which he read began to offer him consolation; as he spent time contemplating these passages in Scripture, his spirituality deepened. This was a spiritual journey of several years of inner transformation and increasing solace.

Greg Athnos is an Emeritus Professor of Music at North Park University. He has an extensive background as director of choral organizations and as conductor of University Orchestra and Choir. He has traveled internationally as a lecturer in music and theology and has published books on the Art of the Catacombs. His schedule is filled with lectures and seminars offered to Elderhostel/Road Scholar programs, museums, retirement communities and churches.

His lectures typically include slides and taped music samplings to enhance the experience. Besides the stirring music, Professor Athnos will provide the historical context of the society of the time that shaped and influenced the composer. He will explore the intriguing backstory of this spiritual journey that unfolds in parallel to the musical expression of this conversion. The result: a moving expression of music as prayer. We will also include some discussion of his towering symphonies and his last songs.



Please join church groups and hundreds of pro-life warriors in Springfield to lobby against the following anti-life bills:

- **HB 2495**, wrongly named the Reproductive Health Act will repeal the 1975 Illinois Abortion law; will repeal the Partial Birth Abortion Ban; and will remove any and all regulations for clinics that commit abortions.
- **HB 2467**, will repeal the Parental Notice of Abortion Act of 1995, which only requires notification — not consent.

To reserve bus space on Monroe St. between College & 2nd, contact Mark Seger, City of Springfield, 217-789-2255.
