#### SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

"Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light" (Ephesians 5:14). We are at the midpoint of our Lenten journey of conversion. As always, God never gives up on us, especially those who have "fallen asleep" along the road to conversion. The most powerful stories of conversion are proclaimed during these final weeks of Lent. They have the power to shake us out of our sleep.

In a few weeks, at the Easter Vigil, the Church will proclaim "Christ our Light" as the paschal candle is carried into darkened churches throughout the world. May the darkness of sin that still pervades our lives, communities, and world, be dispelled by the Christ who comes to bring sight to the blind and light to the world.

Dear Parishioners,  
*"live as children of the light"*

These words taken from this weekend's second reading have particular power, given what we have been dealing with.

It has been a week of encountering this ever-deepening crises surrounding the coronavirus. Every day there are new concerns, new protocols. There is a sense of fear of the unknown and what might happen.

Much of the precautions are based on "social distancing", a recommendation from medical professionals to encourage a conscious effort to reduce close contact between people. This will hopefully reduce the transmission of the coronavirus.

I intellectually understand why this is very important. It is on a spiritual and emotional level that I struggle. Every instinct I have as a priest is to bring people together at a time of crises not separate them. Every time I walk over to the Church, I am feeling this sadness; where is everybody?

I know the precautions and the suspension of mass are critical to keeping people safe, but I find all of this so hard. There is a darkness to all this that we are confronting. We need to be reassured that we are to live as "children of the light".

The Gospel this weekend tells the story of the healing of the man born blind. Talk about social distancing. People were afraid of people who had some disease or disability. As Jesus heals him, he begins to realize the Jesus is the Light of the world, the one who dispels darkness.

I know we will get through this. I know the light of Christ will guide us. This experience will change us with a new perspective. We will come to a deeper appreciation of the precious gift of life. I know we will all have a much deeper appreciation of the Eucharist, as we have had to face this period of deprivation. We will all appreciate our faith community in new and profound ways.

I appreciate in ways you will never know how much your encouragement of me, and the staff mean. So many have gone out of their way to reach out to us.

Our masses on YouTube have been well received. One of our teens told me he really likes our "e-masses" after a day of "e-learning"! We will try and have a mass every day.

If you are homebound and could use some help shopping or running errands, please call the parish. Several parishioners have offered to help pick up or drop off things for people who can't get out.

While these days are unlike any other, let's make the most of them. **Pope Francis** preached this week about his hope that as families are cooped up, "May the Lord help them to discover new ways, new expressions of love, of living in this new situation. It is a beautiful opportunity to creatively rediscover affection." The Pope described the frustration of feeling like he was living in a cage, and then he began to think about how blessed he was by the people he lives with.

It's great to see our deacon, **Jim Revord** back recovering from a bad fall. He had a great suggestion, instead of washing your hands for the time it takes to sing "Happy Birthday" say a Hail Mary! Great idea.

May Our Lord, the Light of the world find a place in your heart. May together we combat the evil that darkness can bring.

## Spiritual Communion!

Our world is going through extraordinary times! Because of this the government and our Church are required to take extraordinary actions!

It is easy to understand the urgent need for action by both the government and the Church to slow the spread of this virus. If the spread of this virus can be slowed down we can buy time for the development of a treatment, buy time for the development of a vaccine, soften the rate at which our healthcare system is pressed to capacity, and avoid the situation where our doctors need to decide who they will treat and who they will not because they lack the needed equipment to treat everyone ... in the end these extraordinary actions and difficult decisions are intended to save as many lives as possible.

One of these extraordinary actions has been for most Bishops around the country to dispense Catholics from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass and allow those at the greatest risk to isolate themselves from possible contact with the virus. An even more extraordinary action has been for several Bishops around the country to cancel public Masses in their diocese completely.

This has caused a wide range of reactions among the faithful! Many have experienced relief from the anxiety caused by the thought of being obligated to attending mass in a crowded church where they would risk being exposed to this virus. Others however have experienced disbelief and anger toward these Bishops for succumbing to a “secular” way of thinking. They feel that by canceling the public celebration of the Mass these Bishops have removed access to the heart and soul of the Catholic faith at the exact time when the faithful need it most. That this decision by the Bishops to cancel all Masses is conforming to the fears and pressures of our secular society, that it fails to stand up as a witness to our trust and faith in something greater than this world, that it denies our Catholic belief in God’s divine providence, and that it fails to proclaim our Christian Hope in the Heavenly Kingdom and Life Everlasting.

Both of these reactions are understandable. Without question you can make a sound argument for both positions. But the reality is that we are all subject to the decisions of our Bishop, and in the end Bishops across the world may have little to no choice in this matter as more and more governments are putting mandatory “lockdowns” and limits on public gatherings in place that will force them to cancel the public celebration of the Mass in their diocese.

Given this situation, whether it is forced upon us by the cancellation of Masses by our Bishop or by our own choice to avoid exposure to this virus, many of us will be without access to attending even a weekly Mass, let alone the daily Mass that many faithful Catholics normally attend.

I know this pain first hand! Attending mass every day is core to my personal practice of the faith. It hurts my heart deeply not to be able to attend Mass every day. It is how I start my day ... it is how I nurture my relationship with Christ ... it is how I energize the joy and love of God in my life ... it is how I lift my spirits ... it is where I turn in times of prayer for myself, my family, my friends, and others.

However, not having the ability to attend Mass is the reality of these extraordinary times in the world. So what do we do now? How do we react? Where do we turn to fill the void in our faith lives left by the absence of Mass?

Before we decide what we should do, it would be good for us to step back and first make sure we fully understand why it is that we attend mass in the first place? If we have the proper understanding of the purpose of the mass our response is likely to be more properly directed, complete and fulfilling!

**Adoration** – The Holy Mass is first and foremost an act of loving adoration to God. It is worship of God our Father Almighty. All that exists owes its existence to Him. Because of this simple fact God alone is worthy of our honor, praise and awe-struck adoration.

**Thanksgiving** – All that we are and have comes from God’s generous hand. Every good, every blessing finds its source in God alone, and our very existence is dependent on His will. In response to God’s endless generosity, which we often don’t even notice, thanksgiving is the only acceptable response.

**Atonement** – We are all sinners, and while we do our best to rationalize and minimize it, all sin is a grave offense against God, incurring His just wrath. But while we all deserve hell, we are not without hope, and we have the assurance that if we turn to Christ in repentance and faith, we can find forgiveness and healing.

**Enrichment** – At Mass, we hear different readings from the New Testament, the Old Testament, the Gospel and Psalms each day. The Word is opened up in the homily, and our minds are enriched by the truth of God. Going regularly keeps the Word of God fresh in our minds and in our hearts as we go through each day.

**Petition** – The Mass is a powerful form of prayer. In fact, it is the most powerful prayer the Church possesses. Bringing our requests before the Lord is one of the most effective ways to obtain all that we need both spiritually and physically.

**Nourishment** – We receive the Eucharist. In it we receive something infinitely great, we receive miraculous nourishment for our souls that can’t be found in anything else. We receive Christ himself, and in doing so we become one with Him, and our eyes are opened to the love of all our brothers and sisters in the world.

So if this is the purpose for why we go to Mass, we can now consider how we might accomplish these objectives when we cannot attend Mass?

**Adoration** ... We can still give God glory and praise by setting aside all else in our life for one hour on Sunday, or as often as possible. We can remove ourselves from the distractions of our lives and the secular world by coming to a sacred place like church where every design element and every image helps remind us of God. But if this is not possible, we can find a quiet corner in our own home or out in nature to help us to enter into prayer, conversation and relationship with God.

**Thanksgiving** ... No matter what sorrows, hardships or challenges we face in our personal lives and in our families, we have also experienced God's blessings. In addition to the abundance of personal blessings we've received, we also share, as brothers and sisters in Christ, in two of the most amazing gifts we can imagine ... the gifts of hope and salvation. Through humble prayer and praise, we can thank God by expressing our gratitude for all the spiritual and material blessings in our lives.

**Enrichment** ... No matter where we are or what is going on in the world, we always have access to the Word of God in Sacred Scripture through the Bible. In addition to this, the readings for each day can be easily found on the internet at the USCCB website. And if you would prefer to hear them read aloud, they also offer recordings of these each day. As for the homily, well you guessed it, they also offer a 2 to 4 minute video reflection every single day. We always have the Word of God available to us, and there are so many Catholic resources to help opened our minds and enrich us to the truth of God.

**Petition** ... Beside our personal needs, and the needs of our family and friends that need to be lifted up in prayer ... with everything going on in the world right now, there is no doubt that the world needs our prayers as much as at any other time in history. Beyond the spread of illness around the world that is currently so top of mind, there is no shortage of violence, poverty, prejudice, natural disaster and general disrespect for human dignity that needs our prayers. If we pray together, as we would at Mass, we can make a difference. It might not be obvious right away, but somewhere in the world, those prayers will be answered in some way!

**Nourishment** ... Although we currently cannot receive the Eucharist as we do at Mass, we do have an often-forgotten option ... "Spiritual Communion"! The Act of Spiritual Communion isn't as much a part of the Catholic vocabulary and consciousness today as it was in the past, though it is just as real an opportunity for Eucharistic Grace as ever. In his encyclical, "Ecclesia de Eucharistia" ("A Eucharistic Church"), in April 2003, Pope John Paul II encouraged the

practice of Spiritual Communion, "which has been a wonderful part of Catholic life for centuries and recommended by saints who were masters of the spiritual life." St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most holy sacrament and lovingly embracing Him" at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive Him in Sacramental Communion. This clearly rings true for so many of us today who are currently unable to attend Mass!

Through the Act of Spiritual Communion, we can receive strength from the grace of the sacrament during times of separation and longing for the Eucharist. An example of Spiritual Communion is often found in Eucharistic Adoration. Those who come to spend time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, are in the proper spiritual disposition, and long to receive the Lord into their heart are receiving Spiritual Communion, even though they may not have called it by that name.

The opportunities for receiving Spiritual Communion are limitless, but particular circumstances such as the extraordinary actions of our Bishops today make it increasingly appealing to the faithful. Spiritual Communion needs no special instruction and no particular prayer or formulary is required; it only requires the same spiritual disposition as the actual reception of sacramental communion and a turning to Jesus with our open heart.

So how can we properly prepare ourselves and make a fruitful Act of Spiritual Communion? There a few basic steps you will want to follow:

### 1) Repentance

### 2) Firm Belief that Christ Died for You

### 3) Remembrance of the Benefits Coming from Christ's Sacrifice

### 4) Act of Spiritual Communion

### 5) Gratitude

The ways of achieving this are countless, but I will outline two here that might help you.

One option is to "Actively Participate" in the broadcast of a Mass on the radio, television, internet, or through a podcast. The key here is to be an active participant ... entering into the prayers and participating in the responses (either verbally or mentally).

If you do this the Mass will take you through the requirements outlined above, and then during Communion you can recite one of the ancient Acts of Spiritual Communion (see below for one such example) or speak from the heart with the same intent.

Another option is to simply follow the prayers outlined below, and they will lead you through the steps above:

### 1) Repentance

I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do. Through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God

### 2) Firm Belief that Christ Died for You

I believe, O Lord, and confess that You are truly the Christ, the Son of the Living God, who came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the first. Accept me this day, O Son of God, as a partaker of Your mystical supper.

I will not reveal your mystery to Your enemies, nor shall I give you a kiss like that of Judas, but like the thief, I confess to you: Remember me, O Lord, when you come into your kingdom. Remember me, O Master, when You come into Your kingdom. Remember me, O Holy One, when You come into your Kingdom.

### 3) Remembrance of the Benefits Coming from Christ's Sacrifice

May this spiritual partaking of Your holy Mysteries, O Lord, be not for my judgment or condemnation but for the healing of soul and body. God, be merciful to me, a sinner. God, cleanse me of my sins and have mercy on me. I have sinned without number, forgive me, O Lord.

Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

### 4) "Act of Spiritual Communion" (by St. Alphonsus Ligouri)

"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire You with all my heart. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, I ask You to come spiritually into my heart.

I embrace You as if You were already in my heart and unite myself to You completely. Please do not let me ever be separated from You."

### 5) Gratitude

Having been made worthy in a mystical way to partake of Your immaculate Body and precious Blood, O Christ Our God, I acclaim and bless, worship and glorify You, and proclaim the greatness of your saving acts, now and forever and ever. Amen

So let us remember during these extraordinary times in the world when the government and our Church are required to

take extraordinary actions and we find ourselves unable to attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass ... that the Mass is not all about us! We simply aren't the primary audience ... but it is for God, and it is all about Him!

While we are now being put to the test, and something we love, something we long for, something we live for has been taken away from us ... The Most Holy Mass and The Eucharistic Sacrifice ... through dedicating ourselves to personal acts of Adoration, Thanksgiving, Atonement, Enrichment, and Petition we can still fulfill the purpose and participation in the Mass with our lives.

And through an Act of Spiritual Communion we can still experience the Nourishment and Graces of Christ's loving embrace in our heart and in our life! In these times of trouble, we will not abandon our faith.

We will trust in God through these times of worry, fear, trial, and tribulation! And until that glorious day when we can return to union with Him in the Eucharist, we will open our hearts to Christ in Spiritual Communion.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help ... Pray for Us!

Amen.
