Dear Parishioners,

"Live as children of the light, for light produces every kind of goodness." This weekend's passage from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians is great to reflect on as we have passed the midpoint of our Lenten journey. As the amount of light increases each day, hopefully we are seeing more light in our lives through Lenten reflection and sacrifice.

This past week, Cardinal Cupich appointed over 20 new pastors. One of them is Fr. Elliott Dees who will become the new pastor of St. Pascal's Parish on the northwest side of the city. Congratulations to him!

I have been reflecting on the challenge of vocations this Lent. Having been involved in Priest Personnel for many years, I am very familiar with the challenges of declining numbers of priests and ever increasing needs. When I came to OLPH about three years ago, there were two priests at St. Catherine, four priests at St. Norbert, two priests at Our Lady of the Brook and four here at OL. Now there are no priests at Our Lady of the Brook, one priest at St. Catherine and two priests at St. Norbert. The pastor of St. Norbert, Fr. Heinz, has been making a remarkable recovery from a brain tumor. We have held steady and, "keep your fingers crossed," I hope we will have no changes in the clergy staff here at OLPH next year.

The fact though is that there will be fewer priests to serve our parishes in the future. One of the driving themes of Cardinal Cupich's, *Renew My Church* effort is to build parish communities that are vital, life-giving and energetic. Viable and life-giving parishes will face whatever challenges lie ahead.

I met this week with a joint meeting of our Parish Pastoral Council and Finance Council and we reviewed the past 12 months. A lot has been accomplished! We have made great progress in embracing the recommendations of the Transformation Initiative.

We have reached 94% of our capital campaign, *To Teach Who Christ Is*, as we approach \$5.2 million pledged.

We have undertaken many projects to enhance our parish and its many ministries. Our parish school and religious education programs are thriving. The Finance Council has made great progress in improving our financial oversight of the school and parish. This all happens because of the leadership we have and the awesome support we receive.

Roundball was a great success with one exciting game after another. It was great to announce the 2017 recipients of the Zanoni Award; Tony and Pat Indovina. What a great couple who have been involved in so many things, most notably our annual Christmas Party for the kids at St. Sabina. They represent the best of us!

In meeting with the Finance Council, we are still lagging in our weekly collections. If you can help us close the gap, I would be so grateful. I know there are so many "asks," especially this year. If we can close the gap it will help us to continue supporting all our programs.

There will be a meeting on Tuesday, April 4 at 7:45 a.m. in the Church regarding the Hearing Loop system. A specialist will be available to answer questions and to explore options for any hearing-impaired person. Additionally, the current sound system is being evaluated so upgrades can be considered to better improve the sound in the Church for all of us.

## RECONCILIATION

### The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Confession, also known as Reconciliation or Penance, puts us face to face with the mercy and forgiveness of Christ. Each Saturday afternoon, a priest is available in church to hear confessions from 4:00 - 5:00.

### The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

RCIA is the process by which adults of other faith traditions, or of no faith tradition at all, come to join the Catholic church. People interested in RCIA attend a series of sessions, usually beginning in the fall, where they learn Catholic doctrine and become familiar with Catholic tradition. Seventeen RCIA Candidates have been preparing to join the Church. Over the next several weeks, their journeys of faith will be shared. Please join us in prayer as the candidates, and their catechists, make final preparations for the Easter Vigil.

#### Nate Jordan

I have always felt the presence of God in my life, regardless of not being raised within an organized religion. In my early teen years, I often found myself praying and asking God for his help and protection. My prayers were always centered on me and rarely



involved me praying for others. As a child, my family would spend nearly every weekend in the mountains of Colorado, often well over 10,000 feet in elevation, and I recall my family talking about God citing "how much closer can you be to God than this, without

being in heaven!" Ultimately that was the extent of my religious teachings.

In 2001, when I met my wife Linn, my relationship with God became much deeper. Linn was raised in the Catholic faith and we often attended mass together on Sundays. Linn never forced the Catholic faith on me, but rather supported my journey as I found myself being called little by little. This said, I still felt there was something missing. Several years ago, we researched RCIA and I found myself always finding an excuse to devoting the time and commitment required. After all, I was busy with a full-time job, two young children and ultimately a life that left little time for much else. Deep down I knew I wanted to make the commitment to RCIA but was worried about what I might have to give up to make the commitment. This past Fall I had an epiphany to how selfish I had always been when it came to God, and decided I needed to make a change.

The RCIA process has been monumental in my life, as I have learned the art of selflessness. I have learned the meaning of serving God, which is ultimately praying for/with and serving others. I now realize the beauty of every scripture and how to apply it in my life. I now realize the beauty of praying

for others, not just me. I now realize how to accept each day as a blessing. And, I now realize how big God's presence is in my life. Perhaps if I had only known how meaningful the RCIA journey would be, I would have traveled this path sooner. Nevertheless, I am grateful to be here with all of you.

#### Shirley Ocana

My name is Shirley Vanessa Ocana. I have been a Catholic since birth. I grew up in a very Catholic home. I did my first communion in fifth grade, but I never did my reconciliation. My journey with my faith first started with my grandma. My first memories ever are of my grandma singing lord you have come to the seashore in Spanish. That was my lullaby as a baby, my grandma would sing it to me every night.

As I grew older I started to question my faith. The biggest question came, when someone I loved dearly passed away; and then six months later (not having recovered

from the previous death) my grandma passed away. All I could think was "why my grandma?" "why am I going through this again?" I felt betrayed, and depressed. For the following four years, I did absolutely nothing that had to do with my faith. As



time went by, I started to look for my faith again, to be close to, not only my loved one's spirits, but to Jesus Christ, and most importantly God. So, I went to my previous church; and I had the worst experience going back, that I decided not to go back there.

When my now husband and I started dating my parents kept pushing me to do my reconciliation. His mom would constantly tell me "I wish you could make him go back to church like we use to go." So, at the end of last year I started to think of where I could do my reconciliation. I had previously nannied

## Diaper Drive Collects Nearly 13,000 Diapers!

Thanks to the overwhelming generosity of OLPH parishioners and the Glenview community, the diaper drive was a terrific success! The drive, sponsored by Guild 35 of the Women's Club, collected close to 13,000 diapers.
