Dear Parishioners and Friends of OLPH,
"Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen Indeed!"

This is the ancient Paschal Greeting, that replaces "Hello", to this very holy day in many parts of the world. Since the earliest days of the Christian community, there is great rejoicing as we have concluded our Lenten journey, witnessed the solemnity of Holy Week and now enter the eight days of the Easter octave.

What an Easter it is here at OLPH! I welcome all of you to our Easter celebrations. This Easter Sunday is like a great family reunion. It is awesome to see so many of our college kids home for Easter. Families that are separated for much of the year are gathered. Neighbors and old friends, your presence here is a blessing. For countless people, OLPH is your spiritual home. May this Easter be a time of many graces and blessings for all of us.

The Easter promise of new life is very evident here. Hundreds journeyed here to OLPH on Holy Thursday as people were absolutely taken by our spectacular Altar of Repose. At the Vigil on Holy Saturday, we received 16 new members to our faith community. We recently celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation for over 200 of our 8th graders in the school and religious education program. Later in the Spring, almost 200 children will make their First Communions.

For those who have been away, our parish has been involved in the Parish Transformation Initiative. It has been a powerful process of looking at the many ways OLPH is reaching out to position ourselves as a vital parish for the future.

This past year, we participated in the diocesan capital campaign, To Teach Who Christ Is. We have raised almost

\$5.2 million and are on our way – hopefully – to \$5.5 million. The campaign funds will provide thousands of children scholarships to Catholic schools and resources to enhance our religious education efforts.

At the parish, we are already seeing many projects that will transform our beautiful facilities. We have renovated an apartment for Sister Paulanne and Sister Joan, renovated and upgraded our Religious Education Center, and installed a Hearing Loop system in the Church to assist hearing-impaired parishioners. We have also created a new meeting room, named Hickey Hall, that is already in almost constant use.

This summer, we will replace the steps and plaza in front of the Church and reconfigure the parking along Church St. to better assist parishioners with disabilities. We will be installing a STEM Lab in the parish school for our junior high students. This lab will feature the latest curriculum in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. We will be renovating the second floor of the new Parish Ministry Center for additional meeting space, office space and youth ministry.

With your faithful support, we are hoping to become an even better sign of an "Easter" parish. We continue to help hundreds of families in need.

Easter invites us all to be born again in the spirit of the "Risen One". Where is new life being born in your life...in your family's life...in your work? How can we embrace the power of Easter so that our lives deepen in meaning and purpose?

The coming Spring will be as busy as ever! It is a joy to have so many choose to share Easter here at OLPH.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Risen Lord,

This year's Easter gospel comes to us from Saint Matthew. He describes Easter morning. Women go to the tomb at dawn on the first day of the week. An angel appears and speaks to them: *"Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples."*

In these words, we find the essential Easter message directed to each one of us today in our uncertain world and amid the painful burdens we carry: **do not be afraid, come and see, go and tell.**

Easter eases our fear when we come to know God's triumph in the resurrection of Jesus. Easter invites us to come and see with fresh eyes what God has done in conquering sin and death. Easter summons us to go and share our faith and hope with others.

When we hear this message and recognize Jesus Christ as the Risen Lord of life, how can we not praise and thank God? How can we not walk together with new confidence and hope? In a time when violence and death-dealing forces seem rampant in the world and even in our own neighborhoods, we truly need new confidence and hope. And when we listen to the Lord, as we have been trying to do in the Archdiocese of Chicago, to seek directions for the renewal of our local Church, we surely need new confidence and hope.

Pray with me that we may all truly hear the words—*do not be afraid, come and see, go and tell*—and so draw new life from them for our loved ones, our world, our city and metropolitan area, our Church, and our very selves.

The Jewishness of Jesus



with Rabbi Evan Moffic

Rabbi Moffic will speak about his recent book, *What Every Christian Should Know About the Jewishness of Jesus: A new Way of Seeing the Most Influential Rabbi*

Christianity, as a religious movement, did not exist in the lifetime of Jesus. It was after his death and the experience of his resurrection

that his followers kept alive an oral tradition that later contributed to the writings of the gospels in the years 70-90 A.D. The spread of the Christian message was due in large part to the missionary preaching and writings of St. Paul who brought Jesus' message to the gentile communities that formed the basis of the early Christian churches.

Jesus lived and died as a Jew. Understanding the Jewishness of Jesus is the secret to knowing him better and understanding his message in the twenty-first century. Walking through Jesus' life from birth to death, Rabbi Moffic serves as a tour guide to give Christians a new way to look at familiar teachings and practices that are rooted in the Jewish faith and can illuminate our lives today. Among the critically acclaimed highlights of this book, Rabbi Moffic:

- Gives fresh insight on how Jesus' contemporaries understood him
- Explores how Jesus Jewishness shaped him
- Offers a compelling new perspective on the Lord's Prayer

Rabbi Moffic looks at the teachings and life of Jesus through the eyes of his own faith tradition and does so with deep respect. His intent is to discover under-appreciated relationships between Jesus, Christianity and Judaism. Rabbi Moffic has spoken at many Christian churches and learned much from ongoing dialogue with many Christian religious leaders. Evan Moffic is a Rabbi of the historic Congregation Solel in Highland Park, Illinois. He was ordained by the seminary of Reform Judaism, the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati in 2006.

OLPH Is Greening Up—Just In Time for Easter!

With the joy of the Risen Lord that we celebrate today we can think of no better way to begin the Easter Season than to redouble our efforts as a Parish to protect God's Creation.

With that in mind, recycling efforts will start being incorporated into major parish events in 2017, with the hope that a variety of recycling activities and initiatives will ultimately be a routine part of the day-to-day operations of our Parish.

The effort follows the teachings of *Laudato Si'*, the encyclical written by Pope Francis, that it is the responsibility of all Catholics to preserve and protect the Earth's resources.

A group of parishioners comprising the Creation Care Ministry, working with Father Boland and Parish staff, has been meeting to come up with the best way to get started. Recycling has not typically been offered at events. However, moving forward, all major parish events will have recycling containers alongside the garbage containers. Signage will identify what type of waste to place in the containers. In addition, volunteers will be at the 2017 events, encouraging participation and educating people about the importance of recycling.

Widespread involvement of all of us is key to the success of this effort and we ask for your help in changing our approach to recycling at OLPH going forward. The only way to make this work is for parishioners to really get involved. We want recycling to become second nature at OLPH; just a normal part of the culture of our Parish.

To kick off our focus on recycling, the Ministry will have donuts following every Mass on Sunday, April 23 outside the South Entrance of Church. Please join us to learn more!

Also, we want to remind you that on April 27 at 7:00 p.m. we are hosting the film "Before the Flood" produced by Leonardo DiCaprio and others in Hickey Hall. We would like this to be a family event so please bring the whole family! Popcorn and drinks will be served.
