## SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

Chapter 21 is the final one in the Gospel of John. It seems as if it were added as an appendix to his Gospel that was concluded in the previous chapter.

It is fitting that Jesus' last appearance to his disciples happens when they are fishing. Jesus called the first disciples when they were also casting nets into the sea, saying, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people." (Matt 4:18-22) From fisherman to fishers of men.

After catching nothing all night, Jesus directs the seven disciples in the boat to cast their nets on the other side of the boat. Almost immediately they catch 153 fish.

This is an important reminder to all of us that without Jesus we will struggle through the night. Let Jesus direct us and like the light at daybreak, he will help us find the way.

Dear Parishioners,

*"Lord you know I love you."*

This weekend's Gospel is one of the most touching of the Easter appearances of the Risen Lord. We hear Our Lord imploring to Peter, "do you love me?" Like the Lord we yearn for reassurance. Like the Lord, we need to know we are loved.

The Gospel invites us to ponder on the ways we witness our love for the Lord. How is it evident to others that we love the Lord? What is the source of the deeper motivations that guide our decisions and choices?

Our faith community here at OL is about supporting one another in our quest to be a holier community of believers. From our youngest to our most senior members, we are all in this faith journey together.

A great manifestation of our deeper bonds as believers is to share in the banquet of the Eucharist. This weekend, we have the first of several celebrations of First Communion. This is such a profound day for all of us.

A parish is many things; on some levels we are like a large extended family. I felt this very powerfully this week as we faced the tragic death of our 7th grade teacher, **Mr. James Ariel**. He died last Saturday in a car accident. All this week we have been comforting one another in our grief. James was a credit to his family and was beloved by his students. He was a science teacher and a baseball coach at Loyola Academy. As a first-year teacher he was so present to his students. May he rest in peace.

Last weekend, **Fr. Paddy** led another group of our teens in the Kairos Retreat. 70 teens experienced a powerful encounter of the reality that Jesus Christ is in their lives. Fr. Paddy devotes much time to this retreat experience that has a profound impact on our teens. Last Sunday, **Randy McGraw** brought several teens to experience the Sunday Mass at St. Sabina, one of our sharing parishes.

You may have noticed the dumpsters by the Sharing Room. We are beginning the next phase of the implementation of our capital campaign, "To Teach Who Christ Is". We will be developing the third floor of the Ministry Center, which will add several additional meeting spaces. Given the age




## Help us Celebrate our Centennial Jubilee



## Parish Engagement Ministry

### Liturgical Ministers

***"When the Christian goes to church, he leaves the world of ordinary human existence behind and steps into the hallowed spot set apart for God" (Romano Guardini).***

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish is blessed with a beautiful church, and we are fortunate to have dedicated priests to celebrate our Liturgies. It is not every parish that is able to offer a vigil Mass every Saturday afternoon and six Masses every Sunday. Our weekend Masses are enhanced as well by the loving support of our liturgical ministers, who generously volunteer their time.

Each weekend, there are 134 spots to fill: 61 Eucharistic Ministers, 14 Readers, 21 Altar Servers, 30 Greeter/Ushers, and 7 Mass Coordinators. One would think that a Parish the size of OLPH would have no trouble filling these positions. Sadly, however, we have several open spots every weekend and would welcome more volunteers to serve in our Liturgical Ministries. At the moment, our greatest need is for Altar Servers and Greeter/Ushers, especially at the 12:30 and 6:00 pm Masses.

Our liturgical ministers are at liberty to choose their Mass preference as well as how many times a month they would like to serve. Some individuals elect not to be regularly scheduled but to serve as substitutes when needed.

Training sessions can be set up at any time and usually take no more than an hour. If you are interested in participating in one of these ministries or just have questions, please contact me at [mandre@olphglenview.org](mailto:mandre@olphglenview.org).

Following are brief descriptions of each of our Liturgical Ministries as well as some testimonies from those who serve.

### Eucharistic Ministers:

Assisting the priest in the Sacrament of the Eucharist demonstrates that the liturgy belongs to the entire faith community — a parish family breaking bread together.

### Readers:

The Readers deliver the first and second Scripture passages, lead the congregation in the Prayers of the Faithful, and also read the announcements. Readers are given a book containing the scripture readings plus commentary to help them prepare. By preparation and effective proclamation, our Readers strive to make the Word of God clearer and more meaningful to the congregation. ### Altar Servers:

***Of Altar Servers, St. Pope John Paul II said, "Above all, you are servers of Jesus Christ, of the eternal High Priest. Thus, you, altar servers, are called in particular to be young friends of Jesus. Be determined to go deeper and to cultivate this friendship with him. You will discover that in Jesus you have found a true friend for life."***

Altar servers carry the cross and candles in procession and assist the priest during the liturgy. The movements of the altar servers reflect the ceremony and the ritual that are rich traditions of our sacred liturgy. Training of both girls and boys begins in fifth grade. In addition to needing three servers at each of our Sunday liturgies, we also need servers willing to be scheduled for our 8:30 am daily Mass.

Just as we welcome people who enter our homes, these dedicated individuals welcome with a smile all those who enter the doors of our church, ensuring that they have the proper materials to actively participate in the liturgy. Greeter/Ushers also assist people with seating, choose the gift-bearers, and are prepared to assist in case of an emergency.

### Mass Coordinators:

If someone is absent, they find someone in the congregation who can fill in. The Mass Coordinator also chooses a Eucharistic Minister to help with the purification procedure after Communion. They ensure that everyone knows their role so all runs smoothly.

## Ignatian Volunteer Corps

Shortly after I retired, I read a notice in the OLPH bulletin about an information meeting for **Ignatian Volunteer Corp (IVC)**. I attended because I was looking for a volunteer opportunity, even though it sounded like a big commitment. That was five years ago, and the meeting started me on an unexpected path that has been both rewarding and enriching. IVC is a national Jesuit organization that matches retired volunteers with schools and other organizations that serve materially poor and marginalized communities. The Chicago chapter has about 60 members. Volunteers commit to two days of service per week for 9-10 months per year. IVC also supports volunteers with monthly meetings featuring social service and spiritual development, a spiritual mentor, and an annual retreat at Bellarmine Retreat House in Barrington.

I've been a volunteer for the past five years at Chicago Jesuit Academy, a school for boys in grades 3-8 on the West Side of Chicago. The mission of the school is to do whatever it takes to put these boys on a path to succeed in high school and beyond, despite the many obstacles that derail so many of the youth in the area. My post retirement success and accomplishments from tutoring these students is far different from my pre-retirement

work, but just as rewarding. Personal attention and encouragement are part of the formula that results in Chicago Jesuit students' high school graduation and college enrollment rates far exceeding the averages in their neighborhood.

IVC volunteers work in schools, hospitals, shelters, literacy programs, senior centers, food pantries, etc. If you are retired and looking for an opportunity to give back, and also enrich your own life, consider attending the IVC information

On January 25th, a bipartisan group of House representatives introduced H.R.763, the **Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act (EICDA)**. The legislation seeks to reduce national carbon pollution emissions by over 90% by 2050. This legislation has been given a strong statement of support by the US Council of Catholic Bishops.

**Global warming is a social justice issue** because the people that will be harmed most are the poor and future generations. This legislation is a cost-effective way to address the root cause of climate change: growing carbon emissions from burning fossil fuels.

**EICDA is a market-based, revenue-neutral approach** which would impose a fee on the carbon content of crude oil, natural gas, coal, and products derived from those fuels, at the point of production or import. Its intent is to gradually reduce fossil fuel usage and encourage the innovation and use of "clean" energy sources. Proceeds from the fee would be distributed monthly to American taxpayers in the form of a "dividend" check. The dividend would help off-set any increase in fossil fuel prices. Agriculture is exempted. Border adjustments will insure America remains internationally competitive. Studies indicate that a large majority of taxpayers, including those in lower income brackets, would benefit from the dividend program. The program is expected to grow jobs and GDP.

## evOLve: Adult Education Ministry

### God and Mystery of Human Suffering

**Saturday, May 18, 9:30am, McDonnell Hall**

Everyone encounters the reality of suffering in their own personal lives and the lives of those they love. For Christians, the experience of suffering can challenge their faith in the goodness of God.

It is hard not to puzzle over the Ultimate Mystery of God. We describe God as All Loving and All Powerful and yet from our human point of view those assigned attributes seem to be in conflict at times. Some theologians have posited that perhaps we need to rethink these descriptions. That an All Loving God may have chosen to limit His Power since God chose to give free will to His human creation and He does not manipulate their freedom to choose even when they choose paths that are not loving or life affirming.

In this presentation, we will discuss the interpretations of suffering found in Scripture and the Christian tradition. And we will explore some of the resources in the Judeo-Christian tradition that can help us to endure and to grow in our faith in times of suffering.

**Robin Ryan**, CP, PhD will be our presenter and lead us in this discussion. He is a Passionist priest and theologian of Systematic Theology at Catholic Theological Union. He is the author of the recently published *Jesus and Salvation: Soundings in the Christian Tradition*.


