

IDOT letter nixes Holding Tracks

The Village of Glenview has received a copy of a letter from Illinois Department of Transportation Acting Secretary Omer Osman to state Senators Laura Fine and Julie Morrison that commits IDOT to eliminating a proposed 2-mile long Holding Track next to the existing Union Pacific tracks through west Glenview and a 3-mile Holding Track through Lake Forest that were part of the larger \$200+ million project to expand Amtrak Hiawatha service between Chicago and Milwaukee from seven to 10 daily round trips.

Osman stated **"IDOT will not agree to freight train holding tracks in either Glenview or Lake Forest"** as part of this project. The letter further states, **"You have my commitment that IDOT will not be moving forward seeking federal support for this project."**

MAY is MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH.



Stigma against people who suffer from mental health/illness conditions, along with their families, is made worse when they experience discrimination from society. Many times it prevents them from seeking care. Misunderstanding surrounding mental illnesses are widespread and those who suffer from the illness say that stigma has a very negative effect on their lives.

There is a belief that patients are untreatable or that people with disorders are difficult, not intelligent or incapable of making decisions. That is not true, and stigma can lead to abuse, and isolation, and exclude people from healthcare or support. They face rejection, and bullying which can make their recovery longer and more difficult.

Navigating life with a mental health condition is very tough, and the isolation, blame and secrecy that is often encouraged by stigma presents huge challenges in getting needed support. Globally there is a big unevenness in the decline of skilled human resources for mental health. Shortages of psychiatrists, psychiatric nurses, psychologists and social workers are among the main barriers to providing treatment and care in low and middle incomes.

With the closing of so many community mental health centers many patients are left with very little support and therapy. Within the present health system people are too often treated in facilities which resemble human warehouses rather than places of healing. Because of the mental health centers closing, jails are now the new centers for the mentally ill. They lack proper care with few doctors and no proper medication.

No one is immune to mental illness woes. We now see more celebrities who have battled mental illness being open about living with it. Learning how to cope with stigma and how to avoid and address it are important tools for all to learn.

Within our families we need to talk openly to raise awareness, compassion and understanding, so we can put an end to the fear and shame. Talk, explain to your children about the homeless living in tents, sleeping on park benches, and carrying their belongings in large bags and grocery carts when you see them on streets in Chicago or TV. Educating starts at home, teach your children about bullying when they see someone act, talk, walk, or look different.
