

Thoughts on the SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

In today's Gospel we witness the last evening Jesus spends with his disciples before his death. He has already made it clear that his followers will show their love for him by serving others. To live that kind of love, they will need the active presence of God in their midst.

Jesus tells his disciples that he and his Father will come and make their home with them. He also tells them that the Holy Spirit will be among them to teach them and remind them of all that Jesus had taught.

Good stewards recognize that God is in their midst and that the Holy Spirit is guiding them. How often do we acknowledge God's presence in our lives? How often do we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us?

Dear Parishioners,

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

As the Easter Season begins to draw to a close, we are focused on a major theme, "Easter Peace." All of us have places in our lives of turbulence and tumult. The Lord calls us to the path of peace in which we seek to be released from that which keeps us from feeling at one with the Lord and with the world around us.

This time of the year there is much evidence of the power of the Risen Christ, leading us to the path of peace. It takes courage to release the hold that resentments, misunderstandings, ego can have on us. Think of how much energy gets wasted on the forces that keep us from being a more loving and merciful person or community.

In the first reading we hear how the early Church worked out one of the challenges that could have destroyed the Church in its infancy. How would the Jewish Christians accept the emerging community of Gentile Christians who did not observe Mosaic law? They worked it out. The Council of Jerusalem was called, and the community resolved this divisive issue and as a result thrived as they embraced the inclusive message of Jesus' proclamation of the Kingdom of God, in which all are invited.

Every so often a couple, a family, a faith community must convene a "Council of Jerusalem" to heal divisions, reconcile hurt, bridge the divide, heal. In the spirit of peace, let's all seek to embrace "Easter Peace" where it is needed in our lives.

Last weekend we had two extraordinary liturgical moments that spoke to me of the power of Easter peace.

We were blessed to celebrate **Father Patrick Kizza's** First Mass. It was a celebration of family, faith, the priesthood and the remarkable energy of the Ugandan Church. I was thrilled to meet his parents, **Ssalongo Matayo Lubega** and his mother, **Nalongo Imelda**. Many members of his family traveled from Uganda. There were several Ugandan priests as well as the Ugandan Choir. There was this powerful sense of the Universal Church. Though separated by oceans and continents, our common faith in the Risen Christ transcends, distance, language and culture. It culminated as we sang the recessional, the African anthem; "Ffe tukumba, tukumba, ffe tukumba, mu kkubo Iya Yezu!" We are marching, in the light of God, we are marching in the light of God!

Last Sunday we celebrated our quarterly SPRED mass with the Sacrament of First Holy Communion. **Declan Keddy, Caroline MacVay** and **Will Personnette** came to the Lord's table for the First Time. Declan is just learning how to walk and his goal was to walk down the main aisle for his First Communion. He did it! We were all deeply moved by the faith of these three children, the loving support of their families and the dedication of their catechists. The vision of the SPRED ministry in the church is at its best when it includes everyone. The liturgy was a profound affirmation of the power of "Easter Peace" and the spirit of the Council of Jerusalem.

Monday is Memorial Day. It can often be seen as the unofficial beginning of the summer season. This is unfortunate because Memorial Day is a day of remembrance. We recall the sacrifices of those who died in service to our country. It is a day when many visit cemeteries to visit the graves of loved ones. The first Memorial Day was in response to the Civil War. **President Lincoln** wanted to have an annual day of national reconciliation as families from both the North and South recalled the losses to their families as a result of the War. It was the power of grief



SPRED Ministry

SPRED is a program of faith formation designed to meet the spiritual needs of persons with intellectual, developmental, and/or learning disabilities.

SPRED (SPecial REligious Development) is a ministry that welcomes children, teens and adults with developmental and other disabilities to develop an awareness of God in their lives and an awareness of themselves as persons with dignity deeply loved by our God.

Our Sunday, May 19, First Communion Mass included special adaptations that enhanced our shared Mass experience. The altar was prepared by our SPRED Catechists and Friends with cloth, candles, and flowers. Our Mass was joyous as we celebrated First Communion with our families.

Although the SPRED program is not unique to OLPH, it is a very special program and one that is not available to many parishes or religious communities. Imagine the difficulty of bringing faith to your child with special needs in an area where there is no such program as SPRED. Our goal is to let people both within and outside of our parish know that they can find a home at OLPH.

Two proposals for you to consider....

Prayer Partner

Be a hands-folded volunteer. One of the most important activities you can do for Youth Ministry is to pray regularly for the youth in our parish. Youth Ministry Adult Advisory and Support Team!

Be a hands-on volunteer. Meet with the Youth Ministry Adult Team three times a year to pray, brainstorm, plan, evaluate, set goals, establish priorities and celebrate! As a member of the team, help with one or two activities during the year. Your ministry would be a ministry of advice, encouragement and support for youth ministry and a presence with the young people who attend an event. The goal? All our Youth Group activities should include at least one other adult from the greater Church community.

Examples?

Attend a Food Faith and Fun activity (usually Saturday or Sunday evening) and meet the young folks and join in the activities planned for that meeting. Help plan and carry out an event. Volunteer to drive a group to a service activity. Pick up the pizza! Help shop for food for dinners and for the Brown Bag Lunch Projects. Cook dinner for Hilda's House Homeless Shelter. Join in a Scripture Study meeting. Attend Stations of the Cross with the teens. Help stuff envelopes for mailings. Be a chaperone for a Cubs, Sox or Blackhawks outing. Attend a Teen Mass. Supervise fun night activities in the Playdium. Go bowling. Participate in Habitat for Humanity. Attend an overnight high school retreat. Attend a Confirmation Retreat. Share your story and your faith on an informal basis. You have lots of opportunities.


