Dear Parishioners,

*"He rebuked the wind and said to the sea, Quiet! Be still!"*

One of the more familiar biblical scenes is the one captured in this weekend's gospel. Jesus appears to be sound asleep while the boat he and the apostles are in is being assaulted by a violent storm.

Jesus brings calm to the turbulent waters.

Most of us have some part of our lives that is besieged to a degree by troubled waters. Our health, financial worries, or a family member struggling. It does not take much for our sense of calm to be upended.

Since the announcement that our state was entering Phase 5, I have felt a calming of the troubled waters that were a result of the pandemic. While we are not over it, with the passing of each day, an emergence of confidence that Covid is behind us is reassuring.

For me, my faith was a source to great strength navigating all that transpired since the pandemic began. Whether it is a pandemic or a personal struggle, our faith can calm the troubled waters like nothing else.

I am convinced we will emerge as a stronger parish because of the challenges we had to face.

We have begun the daunting task of reopening. There are all sorts of unintended consequences as we return but we are moving forward.

I had the wonderful opportunity to preside at Mass this week at Chestnut Square. We have several parishioners who live there, and it was such a blessing to see folks I have not seen in a year and a half.

This weekend the 9:30 Playdium Mass returns to McDonnell Hall. The 7:30 am Sunday morning Mass returns on July 4. The 6:30 am daily Mass returns on Monday, July 12.

There are some adaptations we need to make out of an abundance of caution. We will be unable to have communion in the cup, hearing confessions in the confessionals and the communion service pre-ceding the 6:30 Mass. I also want to encourage all of us to be aware that people are at different levels of comfort with the reopening process. There are those who are concerned we are moving too fast and others that we are moving too slow. I am committed to being as sensitive to everyone as we re-engage parish life.

We had our first meeting of the Renew My Church grouping at St. Norbert. We were introduced to the vision of this strategic plan and the need for every parish to reflect on its blessings and the challenges that must be faced as we build a new reality of a vibrant, life giving Church.

One of the key challenges of the Glenbrook Grouping (OLPH, St. Catherine and the Catholic Community of Northbrook) is the task of evangelization. All parishes have experienced significant declines in mass attendance, pre-COVID. The challenge of the post-COVID Church is to reach out to many who have drifted away after months of restrictions on public worship.

This weekend we observe Father's Day. Fathers matter. We celebrate the men in our life that provide, encourage and witness their faith. Happy Father's Day!

## Feast of Our Mother of Perpetual Help - June 27

To give thanks to our patroness for her protection during this challenging year, our priests will recognize the feast of Our Mother of Perpetual Help at all Masses on Sunday, June 27. This feast day is for the miraculous Icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help.

The tapestry that hangs over our Tabernacle in the Lady Chapel is an inspired reproduction made of metallic fabrics, detailed embroidery and precious gemstones.

### Brief History

The image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help was venerated centuries ago in Crete and from there sailed to Rome. Who created it or when, we don't know. A private family held the image until the Blessed Mother appeared to the little girl of the household and told her she wished her picture to be placed in a church, "between my beloved Church of St. Mary Major and that of my beloved son, St. John [Lateran]."

In 1499, the picture was exposed for veneration in St. Matthew Church, midway between Sts. Mary Major and John Lateran, where it remained for three centuries. In 1798, war destroyed the church, but the icon was preserved by Augustinian monks, who took it with them to their new monastery in another part of the city.

The Redemptorists came to Rome in 1855 and built the Church of St. Alphonsus Liguori on the site where St. Matthew Church had been. On April 26, 1866, the miraculous icon was carried in solemn procession to the Church of St. Alphonsus, where it has remained ever since. Over the centuries, countless healings and special graces have been attributed to it.

### The Meaning of the Icon

Icons are meant to help us connect directly with God. Each element has a specific meaning. As you contemplate the icon, its beauty and meaning will slowly unfold before you.

- The Greek letters:
  - **MP ΘΥ** = Mother of God
  - **Ο ΑΡ Μ** = the Archangel Michael; to Mary's right
  - **Ο ΑΡΙ Ο** = the Archangel Gabriel; to Mary's left
  - **ΙC ΧC** = Jesus Christ; below Archangel Gabriel
- Mary's eyes, filled with compassion and love, are directed toward us. Our Lady's gaze is fixed on us, her children on earth. She is our source of constant comfort and hope.
- Our Lady is clothed in the colors of virgins (red) and of mothers (blue).
- Jesus, depicted as a young boy, wears the colors of a king.
- The star on Mary's veil reminds us that she is the dawn announcing the coming of Christ.
- Our Lady's hands hold her Son securely, and her right hand directs our gaze to Him.
- The Christ Child grasps His mother's hand as though He is frightened by what He sees.
- In His hurry to reach His mother, Jesus has almost lost one of His sandals. He became human, like us, in all things but sin.
- On Our Lady's left and right we see the reasons for Jesus' fear. On the right, Gabriel is holding a cross and four nails. On the left, Michael is holding a lance, a pole with a sponge, and a vessel of vinegar. This vision of the instruments of the crucifixion has driven the Child to His mother's protective embrace.

### A Prayer to Our Lady of Perpetual Help

*Most holy Virgin Immaculate, our perpetual help, our Mother Mary:  
You are the mother of Our Lord; the queen of the universe;  
the advocate, the hope, and the refuge of sinners.*

*We, who are in great need of your Son's grace, have recourse this day to you.  
Our parish is most grateful for the many graces you have bestowed upon  
us in the past.*

*We place in you our prayers for our eternal salvation.  
Accept us as your children and shelter us under your mantle, you who are  
the mother of mercy.*

*From you we ask for a true love of your Son, Jesus Christ.*


*Through you, we hope to die a holy death.*

We are busy investigating the needs of the organizations we serve and assessing our own volunteer capacity in considering changes we might be making. ### Current Need for Gift Cards

Our Lady of Tepeyac (OLT) recently merged with two neighboring parishes and the new parish, which occupies OLT grounds, has been named **Mother of the Americas**. This name sits so well with OLT parishioners as Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared on the mountain of Tepeyac. Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patroness of the Americas, so OLT maintains her as patron saint of both the old parish and the new parish community.



Sharing members have been meeting with this parish's new pastor, **Fr. Tom Boharic**, both via Zoom and in person. He is filled with vision and we are delighted to offer support wherever we can.

Fr. Boharic is also working to serve families in the community as they face the loss of teens through gun violence. He is hoping OLPH can provide donated gift cards to stores, such as Walmart, Jewel, Walgreens, Target and McDonald's, for him to distribute to families in times of such tragedy. Families in his community are barely making ends meet and the unexpected expenses related to a funeral can deprive the family of funds to live from day to day.

## Did you know about... ALTAR STONES?

In the ancient Church, frequent persecutions resulted in many martyrs. These persecutions also resulted in Christian communities having to move their worship underground – literally. Roman law prohibited burying the dead in the city itself, for the sake of efficient land use and sanitation. Accordingly, the roads leading into Rome were lined with tombs for the wealthy. The poor were most often entombed underground in disused mines and stone quarries. These were called catacombs. From about the year 150, when Christians began worshiping in the catacombs, they used martyrs' tombs as the altars, taking inspiration from the Book of Revelation: "When he opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God and for the witness they had borne." (6:9)

After the year 313, when the Emperor Constantine officially permitted public Christian worship, the tradition of offering Mass over the tomb of a martyr was preserved. Two of the first great basilicas in Rome, the Vatican Basilica and the Ostian Basilica, had altars built directly over the tombs of Saint Peter and Saint Paul respectively. The altars remain in the same positions to this day; hence, the basilicas are called St. Peter's and St. Paul Outside the Walls. Yet, not all churches could be built over a martyr's tomb; and so the altar stone was created.

The altar stone is a square of marble into which are placed at least two relics of saints; one must come from the body of a martyr. This stone is then set into the altar, and is the location where the chalice and host are placed for the consecration. It is also where the priest kisses the altar at the beginning and end of Mass, honoring the saints' relics contained therein. Even if an altar is wood, an altar stone is set into it. At one time, in order for a Mass to be offered outside – whether in a park or on a battlefield – a portable altar stone was necessary.

An altar must be consecrated by a bishop in order to be used for the consecration of the bread and wine at Mass. This usually occurs when a church is dedicated, though it also occurs when a new altar is installed. At the consecration of an altar, it is anointed with holy oil, incense is burned on it, and it is blessed with "Gregorian water," containing salt, wine, and ashes. This can be a messy process, since the bishop is in full vestments, and Mass then continues with the consecration on the newly oiled and sprinkled altar. The altar is also given a titulus; that is, the altar is named. The primary altar of a church is named after the patron saint of the church, though other altars may carry different names. In this way, the altar is the central and most important part of the church, not the other aspects of the building.

At Our Lady of Perpetual Help, the church contains four altars with four altar stones: the main altar; the original altar in the Lady Chapel (the altar on which the tabernacle sits); the altar facing the people in the Lady Chapel; and the altar in McDonnell Hall. The main altar and the tabernacle altar in the Lady Chapel were consecrated by **Samuel Cardinal Stritch**, Archbishop of Chicago, when the church was dedicated in 1953. The altar in McDonnell Hall was dedicated by **Wilton Cardinal Gregory** when he was an auxiliary bishop of Chicago in the early 1990s. The newer altar in the Lady Chapel was installed after 1971 and consecrated with its altar stone.

Though each altar in our church contains at least two saints' relics, the record of which saints they are have been lost. The archives of the archdiocese does not keep that information. Currently the mystery is under investigation in various storerooms of parish buildings.

Since Mary was divinely assumed body-and-soul into heaven, the relics in the altar stones cannot be hers. Which saints' relics do you think are in our four altar stones?





## Drive-In Mass Update: Safety Issues

To improve the flow of our Drive-In Mass, we recently changed the way we deliver communion. Instead of having priests and Eucharistic Ministers walk to each car to give the eucharist to parishioners, we have instead been giving communion to cars as they leave the parking lot.

This has led to a potentially dangerous situation. When there are priests/ministers on both sides of the car, drivers tend to drive away as soon as they receive communion, forgetting that on the passenger side, there may be a priest/minister who is still in the process of giving out the eucharist to the rest of the people in the car.

This has almost resulted in having our priests dragged along and almost run over.

To all drivers, please:

- 1) **Be mindful of priests/ministers on both sides of the car.**
- 2) **Put the car in PARK while receiving communion.**
- 3) **Check to make sure everyone in the car has finished receiving communion and be especially aware of anyone receiving communion in the back seat.**
- 4) **Look and see that the priest/minister has stepped back and away from your car before putting your car back in gear.**
- 5) **Only then, proceed forward and exit the parking lot.**

We are always trying to create the best experience possible for parishioners attending our Drive-In Mass and all of our liturgies. Safety is the first and most important priority for everything we do. Adhering to strict safety measures makes everything we do possible.




