Dear Parishioners,

"you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church"

This coming Monday, June 29th, the Church celebrates the Feast Day for the Apostles, Sts. Peter and Paul. These are the 2 giants of the apostolic era.

This Feast is as close as Rome gets to the 4th of July. This day is a holiday in Rome, there are fireworks, picnics and parades as the city of Rome recalls these 2 apostles and martyrs. Both are buried in Rome and their tombs have been a source of pilgrimage since the earliest of times.

As the Church venerated their memory, our new associate, **Deacon Larry Basbas** will be ordained to the priesthood at St. John Brebeuf Church by **Cardinal Cupich**. Please pray for him as he begins his priestly ministry here at OLPH. You can watch the ordination on the Catholic Chicago YouTube page. Deacon Larry will celebrate his First Mass at his home parish, St. Pascal, on the northwest side of Chicago on July 5. He will make his first appearance as Fr. Basbas at the 8:30 a.m. mass on July 2. The current pastor of St. Pascal is **Fr. Elliott Dees** who served here for his first assignment and was a great blessing.

As we approach the Feast of the Apostles Peter and Paul, I pray for our wonderful neighbors and friends in faith at Sts. Peter and Paul Greek Orthodox Church on Lake Avenue. Over the past 5 years we have developed a wonderful relationship regarding Pope Francis' encyclical, Laudato Si, "on care for our common home". This encyclical was greatly influenced by the teachings on the environment by the **Patriarch of Constantinople, Bartholomew**. We have shared the observance of the Holy Day of Protection of the Environment, alternating between our churches, each year and it has been a wonderful experience of ecumenical solidarity.

Our new statue of the Blessed Mother in the Hellerman Garden has become a sensation. Many people have stopped by to greet her. She is illuminated at night and it is well worth a visit. Our first event, in her presence took place the afternoon she arrived. I had the great privilege of blessing **Gladys Klauke** on her 100th birthday with her family. **Bob and Connie Hicks** were present representing our Centennial Committee. What a great moment to celebrate the 100th birthday of a parishioner during our 100th birthday as a parish. God Bless you Gladys!!

We continue to move forward in the reopening of the parish amid the pandemic. We get better and better at all of this. Our first week of public masses went very well.

We all need to embrace two virtues. The first is patience. We have to be comfortable with the fact that everyone has different degrees of how they feel about the process of reopening. Some want to return to the way we were yesterday, and others can't deal with the anxiety of being unsafe.

We also need the virtue of generosity. Even with opening up, only a small fraction of parishioners can attend public masses. We need to be aware that while it is great to be at mass, we must remember others before signing up for another mass. The diocese suggests attending one public mass a month for a while so that as many parishioners as possible can come to mass and receive communion. As the saying goes, we must think of "us" not "me". Most parishioners have not been to Mass since the middle of March.

Starting in July we will have a 5:00 p.m. Saturday "Drive In" Mass. The first mass will be on July 4 at 5:00. We can accept up to 160 car reservations. You must remain in your car and you will be able to hear the mass on your radio or phone. Your whole family can be in the car. The Mass will be celebrated on the porch of the Ministry Center rain or shine. You will be able to receive communion. In addition to celebrating the Fourth of July, we will be celebrating **Fr. Nick's** final Mass. You will be able to drive by the porch after Mass to extend your best wishes to him. I am really going to miss him. He has been great to live with and has made such an impact here. Best Wishes Fr. Nick!


Our "Drive By" Father's Day Blessing and communion was a great success, 421 cars! I loved seeing many of you after all these months.

Hello, OLPH! THANK YOU for welcoming me as your new associate pastor! Words cannot describe the joy and excitement I am feeling of being assigned to this great parish, especially to work alongside Fr. Jerry, Fr. Jim, and Fr. Patrick. I look forward to getting to know many of you. I know it will be a challenge for me to remember everyone's names, so I ask for your patience.

Where I am from can mean many things: I was born on the island of Guam (a U.S. territory in the Pacific) but I was raised in the Philippines, arguably the only Catholic nation in Asia, where my parents were born. Eventually, my family moved back to Guam for a brief period until finally settling in the Chicago area when I was ten years old. I miss my father, who I lost to lung cancer 28 years ago. I am blessed, however, to still have my mother, who is a youthful 89 year old. Please pray for her. I am the youngest of four siblings [two older twin sisters and an older brother]. Saint Pascal, located on the Northwest side of the City, is my home parish.

Women played a significant role in my religious and spiritual development early on. My mother and the School Sisters of Notre Dame instilled in me the many virtues that Christ himself exemplified and to which I strongly adhere today -- charity, humility, faith, and compassion. I felt the call to the priesthood as far back as the 2nd grade, but as the years progressed I ignored the occasional nudgings from God and went on with my life as usual, enjoying a career in advertising & graphic design while living in the City. Yet I always felt something was missing. Finally, in 2013 the Holy Spirit moved me to finally answer the call. The following year, I entered Mundelein Seminary where I spent two years of philosophical studies and four years of theology.

What I've learned thus far in my journey to the priesthood is what it means to "trust in the Lord with all your heart." As I go forward now, I do so by walking in this wonderful gift God has given me -- my FAITH.



You probably have spoken with or met our Parish Office Manager, **Laura Kearney** at some point in time, either because she helped you solve a problem, or she may have served you dessert at an event, or you saw her smiling face greeting you at church. But you might not be aware of everything she does here at OLPH, so we thought we would do a *Parish Profile* on Laura so you can get to know her a little better.

OLPH Please tell us a little bit about your background and how long you have been a part of OLPH.

Laura Kearney (LK) I have been working at OLPH for almost 13 years. I started out as the Parish Receptionist. I loved meeting and greeting the parishioners and guests. While working the front desk during the day, I planned dinner parties for the priests and ministries. I loved cooking for the guests, decorating the tables and, of course, greeting everyone as they arrived. I also helped with our first Capital Campaign, assisting as hostess for the Meet and Greets with Fr. Hickey.

OLPH Can you tell us what your responsibilities are here at OLPH?

LK I am the Office Manager, reporting to the Director of Finance and Operations and helping Fr. Jerry when asked. I assist with the Monday morning counting of the weekend collections. I handle all the banking for Sister Paulanne, making sure that every donation that comes in her name is deposited into her account. I coordinate all Parish mailings. I am the Administrator for our online giving program, Give Central, assisting parishioners with questions about sign up, downloading donations from Give Central to our parish data base and running transaction reports for Sister Paulanne, CRHP, RE, Needy Family Fund, etc. as needed. I participate in monthly Staff Meetings and then communicate to my staff so that we are all up-to-date and on the same page with all that is going on in the parish. I schedule all meetings and events in our Parish Calendar for our School, RE and ministries. I assist the Director of Communications, by proofreading the Bulletin and all parish mailings.

OLPH What is the best part of your job?

LK Any time I can meet and greet. I love to help at any time, not just 9-5p.m., Monday-Friday. If I can be of help on Saturday or Sunday, I will be here. This is what energizes me. I feel that my job title should be "Parish Helper," because that is what I call myself.

OLPH What role do you have in the Reopening Process?

LK During this time of Reopening Our Church, Fr. Jerry asked me to head the Greeter/Usher committee. I was so happy to step up. I have many volunteers who are so willing to assist with greeting and ushering at daily Mass, Sunday Mass, Baptisms, Funerals, Weddings and Reconciliation, but I have no problem filling a spot in



case of a cancellation. It is not a job to me; it is a way to worship and praise; being a part of OLPH is what makes me smile.

OLPH What is the most important thing that parishioners should know about the Reopening Process?

LK We must take it slow and be very patient. This virus kept us away from the place we love most, our Church. If we rush back too quickly; if we do not wear a mask at all times; if we do not sanitize our hands before entering the Church; and, if we do not take the time in between services to sanitize the Church, we risk spreading the virus and going back to watching Mass on TV and being isolated again. Parishioners understand and they have been very patient and cooperative.

OLPH Please tell us an interesting fact about yourself.

LK I love to take a walk every morning and say my Rosary. It is so peaceful and quiet at 6:00 a.m. It is just me and God. What a great way to start my day!

OLPH Now that the quarantine is winding down, how will you celebrate?

LK Spending more time with my daughter, Colleen; she is expecting her first baby on Thanksgiving. We can't wait to go shopping and decorate the baby's room and plan the family baby shower. What a celebration.....a gift from God! I am so blessed. Also I am so blessed to be a part of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish and I look forward to when the Masses are overflowing again, Russell Stern and the choir are filling the Church with beautiful music, and I can hug my "sisters and brothers" again!

Fall Religious Education Registration is now open! Register today!

Religious Education Registration for the fall of 2020 is here!

With the Covid pandemic, our first priority at OLPH is the health and safety of everyone. OLPH Religious Education will follow public health, government and Archdiocesan recommendations and protocols. We will be social distancing, temperatures will be taken before entering the buildings and each classroom will be completely disinfected before and after each session. Masks are encouraged. Please contact us with concerns.



Three new class days

In order to limit the number of students in each class and on the campus at the same time, we offer three additional class days this year. When we know numbers and what families prefer, we will assign classes. (If we do not have enough students for a particular day or time, a second choice may be necessary.) The new Sunday class, between Masses is only 50 minutes long. Those attending Sunday morning classes will meet 30 times instead of 24 and attend a special event each semester.

Appeal for Catechists

With smaller classes and three new days of class, we are in great need for Catechists. Times are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday afternoon (4:30-6:00), Tuesday evening (6:30-8:00), Saturday morning (9:00-10:30) Sunday morning (8:40-9:30) and one Friday evening and Sunday per month for the Gather and Grow program. All grade levels needed. Have your own class or be a team teacher. Young and old welcome to volunteer.

Additional Options for traditional in classroom sessions

Options other than the traditional classroom 24 session classes are Gather and Grow (a family program involving parents and children), e-learning, and Home Schooling. Gather and Grow has its own curriculum. With e-learning and Home Schooling, the curriculum would be the same as the traditional classroom program. Children signed up for e-learning and Home Schooling would be expected to join other students for two activities per semester.

Seventh and Eighth graders are not eligible for e-learning or Home School options as they are preparing for Confirmation and part of the dynamic is sharing the process with their classmates.

Fees remain the same this year

Fees for Religious Education are the same as last year. A limited number of scholarships are available. **Ability to pay should NEVER keep you from enrolling your family in any of the programs.** Please contact the Rel. Ed. Office to discuss scholarships, payment plans and financial issues. We will work something out.


