

## seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

*"When I am weak, I am strong"*

Powerful words from the passage we hear this weekend from Paul's Letter to the Corinthians. He speaks a truth that seems counter intuitive. How can we be strong out of our experience of weakness?

I cannot help but think of this long journey of the pandemic that began when we shut down in March of 2020. We can easily forget those days of fear, loneliness, and frustration as we were forced to adapt to profound changes to our personal and communal life. When I locked the doors of the church that Saturday, I would never have imagined that 16 months later, many have still have not been able to return to Mass among a multitude of other things.

Despite the weakened reality that COVID hurled at us, it has uncovered a tremendous strength of our parish community. There have been untold acts of bravery, compassion, and resilience. Much of this coming from the most vulnerable in our midst. I have heard stories of people shopping for elderly

neighbors, providing meals for families that had to grieve alone. At the Rectory, we were overwhelmed by the acts of kindness and concern for us. Neighbors looking out for each other.

The aftermath of the pandemic will take a long time to process and reflect upon. As a pastor, one can get trapped by the bureaucracy that it takes to administrate a parish of this size. It can force you to get removed from the "front line" of pastoral ministry, which is what drew me to the priesthood in the first place.

The cycle of birth, joy, sadness, love and mercy, of achievement and failure and ultimately sickness and death are all blessed moments to embrace the Spirit of the Risen Christ. While I found myself frustrated by the COVID restrictions, I experienced so many moments when the power of the sacraments deeply moved me.

This has been a tumultuous time for us personally, as a community and as a nation. This weekend we celebrate America's birthday. 245 years ago, our nation was born. In our weakness, we became strong, declaring our independence, healing and being born anew in the aftermath of the Civil War, joining the free world to combat the tyranny of World War 1 and World War 2.

From the depression to the Viet Nam War, the struggles for Civil Rights to the devastation of Sept. 11, America keeps reinventing itself, ever stronger. America finds itself again in a tumultuous period reflected in deep divisions, civil unrest, the insurrection and gun violence that plagues us. In 1776 the founding fathers chose the Latin phrase, "E Pluribus Unum" as our national motto. The phrase means, "one out of many" reflecting the desire to foster unity out of diversity.



What a testimony to our founding fathers and the Judeo-Christian principles we were founded on if we could move beyond the rhetoric of destructive ideologies to a commitment to form "a more perfect union". The divisions threaten us, but we can embrace a new national moment to reject these forces of evil. Our children deserve a future of living in a country where life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness is achievable to all our citizens. There is no greater symbol than the Statue of Liberty that stands in the harbor of New York. Lady Liberty holds a torch of hope.

I am delighted to welcome **Karen Daniels** to our OLP Team. Karen will be our Assistant Manager, Parish and Business Operations. Karen and her husband **Tim** and their children have been very involved in parish life. Welcome Karen!

Next Sunday at the 9:00 mass, we will be installing the Parish Pastoral Council. We will be welcoming our new members. **Tom O'Brien** will become President. I am grateful to **Susan Logan** who was awesome in leading us this past year. I also want to honor her predecessor, **Maria Grable** who did a tremendous job holding us together as a council as the pandemic began. Susan will be our delegate to the Vicariate Pastoral Council. Thank you to **Bob Pirsein, Cindy Moody, Maria Grabel** and **Tim Daniels** for their outstanding service to the Council.

## *Did you know about...* CHALICES?

“**T**he Celtic cross and the green stone between the base and the cup represent my Irish heritage,” says Fr. Jim Barrett as he holds his silver chalice. “The waves in the stone symbolize the waters of Baptism, because Grace flows in through Baptism and out through the Eucharist, which is why the cup is wider than the base.”

Just as water and wine are absolutely necessary for the offering of Mass, a chalice to hold them is also required. Since the water and wine become the Blood of Christ, it is appropriate that the chalice be made of “noble and durable” materials and beautifully crafted. Thus, a priest’s chalice is a very personal item for him, one that carries much devotional significance. The priests at Our Lady of Perpetual Help each have a different chalice with different meaning attached.

Still, the basic design of the chalices is largely the same. There is a base which holds up the cup, into which is poured the water and wine, and from which is drunk the Precious Blood. But between the base and the cup is the node: a ball or cylinder that makes elevating the chalice more stable during the consecration. At one time, priests held their index finger and their thumb together from the time of the consecration of the bread, until their fingers were purified with water over the chalice after communion. The node made holding the chalice and drinking from it possible without spilling the Blood of Christ. Some priests still hold their fingers, called “canonical digits,” together during the most sacred part of the Mass.

The node on Fr. Barrett’s chalice is made from Malachite. On Fr. Jerry Boland’s chalice, the node is inscribed with “Fides, Spes, Caritas,” Latin for “Faith, Hope, Charity,” the three Theological Virtues described by Saint Paul in his Letter to the Corinthians. Nearly all chalices have a cross on the base, which is supposed to be facing the priest when the chalice is placed on the altar at the offertory.

Chalices are required to be made of precious metal that cannot break, deteriorate, or absorb liquid. If the chalice is made from a different material, the inside of the cup should be gilded. Because the chalice is used by a priest throughout his years of service to the church, it is often a special gift given to him at his ordination by his family.

Fr. Barrett’s mother and father gave him his chalice when he was ordained in 1982. Fr. Boland’s family also gave him a chalice at his 1981 ordination. But he has two others: one from the parishioners at Holy Family Church, commemorating his 25th anniversary of ordination; and one given to him by his priest-mentor. “I often use a chalice given to me by Fr. Bud O’Brien who was a great influence on me in the early years of my priesthood when I served at St. James in Arlington Heights.”

## seek, share, rejoice - church history

Fr. Patrick Kizza has two chalices. In America, Fr. Kizza offers Mass with a chalice given to him upon his ordination, by the Knights of Columbus. When he returned to Uganda to celebrate his first Mass at home, Fr. Kizza's family gave him his African chalice. Fr. Larry Basbas has a "temporary" chalice, which he hopes to replace with his "dream" chalice by the anniversary of his ordination. Because chalices are made from precious metal and are often handcrafted, they can be very expensive. Hence, families and priests sometimes wait until they have the funds to purchase or commission a very beautiful and personalized chalice.

Following Ugandan custom, Fr. Kizza's chalice will be buried with him. However, many priests leave their chalice at the last parish where they served before they died. Thus, the chalices of former pastors Fr. Myles McDonnell and Fr. John Flavin remain in the sacristy. Fr. McDonnell's was given to him at his ordination in 1945, Fr. Flavin's in 1960. Both are engraved with dedications on the underside of the base. Fr. Jerome Hartmann, who was ordained in 1947 and who served at Our Lady of Perpetual Help after he retired, also left his chalice to the parish. These chalices can continue to be used as a commemoration of the men whose priesthood was a gift to the parish, just as the current priests use their chalices to offer the Eucharist for the people of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.



## Creation Care Ministry

### What you can do to protect our planet this summer

OLPH community, many of you have heard about the detrimental effect on our planet of our continuous use of disposable plastic. That is a reality. As one example, roughly 11 million metric tons of plastic flow into our oceans each year—an annual figure that could nearly triple by 2040 without urgent action.



- Every year, 500 billion plastic bottles are produced worldwide.
- Plastic in the ocean already amounts to more than 150 million tons of waste.
- By 2050, the oceans could contain more plastics than fish.

Plastic has become a constant element in our lives. It's everywhere: product packaging, cosmetic ingredients, textiles, mobile phones, etc. It's even in the chewing gum you might be chewing on right now! Its omnipresence is such that many would find the mere fact of giving it up a difficult task. **Reducing the consumption of plastics therefore requires not only a change in habits, but also a change of mindset.**

While on the subject of single-use plastics, which account for half of the plastic we use each year, they have an average useful life of 12 to 15 minutes and yet can take up to 500 years to disappear, according to Life Out of Plastic (LOOP). **Plastics outlive us and will outlive our children.** (See the graphic on the next page of this Bulletin.) The good news is that it is in our hands, as consumers, to turn this situation around. We have the power to make manufacturers change the way they produce. How? By changing the way, we consume. Minimizing the consumption of plastics is much simpler than it seems. Here are some tips that can change your life and the life of the planet:

### TIPS FOR REDUCING YOUR PLASTICS CONSUMPTION

- 1) Avoid single-use plastics such as drinking straws.

Single-use plastics, such as plates and cutlery made from this material, make our lives easier, but seriously harm the planet. These types of products have viable alternatives and there is an urgent need to choose these such as bamboo cutlery.

- 2) If you go shopping, remember to take a cloth bag.

We go to the supermarket at least once a week to fill up our fridges. If every time we go we use reusable bags (cloth, string or wicker) the health of our planet will improve. From now on remember to take yours when leaving the house.

- 3) Avoid regular chewing gum... it's also made of plastic!

Most chewing gum currently on the market contains plastic. Try to buy less chewing gum. You can also opt for natural and organic chewing gums.

- 4) Replace plastic Tupperware with glass or steel containers.

- 5) Replace the cling wrap with reusable products.

Reusable food wraps made from sustainable cotton and beeswax allow you to cover your food without harmful plastics.

Cling wrap that ends up in waterways is easily confused for jellyfish and often chokes turtles and other marine life. \
