

Dear Parishioners,

“Discipleship and True Patriotism”

It's that time again for amazing fireworks, mouth-watering barbecues, dazzling parades, bug sprays, suntan lotion, and, of course, a display of the Stars and Stripes on every major thoroughfare. HAPPY INDEPENDENCE DAY, everyone! But before we proudly wave or raise our beautiful American flag, it's crucial that we understand what TRUE PATRIOTISM is -- and isn't -- and how it relates to being good DISCIPLES OF CHRIST.

True patriotism seeks to strengthen and celebrate the “we” in “we the people of the United States.” It is about coming together for the common good. When Jesus taught people to love their neighbors as themselves and treat others as they would be treated, he was teaching us to seek the common good. We are called to seek what's best for everyone, beginning with the last, the least, the most vulnerable, and the most forgotten, especially the disabled and homeless veterans. Selfishness is neither a Christian nor American virtue. If we are to follow Christ, we cannot be blind to injustice within society. A true patriot loves his/her homeland, and that love must inspire efforts to work peacefully toward the universal good of ALL citizens.


True patriotism is also about preserving, fortifying, and protecting our democracy, not destroying it! While no government is perfect, a true patriot doesn't hate the government but rather works to improve it. God calls us to be good citizens, not mere complainers who don't bother to lift a finger. Good citizenship is key to our ability to show the nature of Jesus Christ to our fellow Americans.

Furthermore, true patriotism is recognizing that we are all different from one another, and that it's our differences that make us a beautiful and unique nation. We can agree to disagree on a lot of issues, but we must never resort to shaming, rejecting, name-calling, and worse of all, violence. It's simply un-Christian to do so. Jesus never pandered to divisiveness, nor did he fuel racist or ethnic divisions. So, why should we (if we claim to be his followers?) As we celebrate our nation's independence this weekend, remember that we can be true American patriots and true disciples of Christ by waving the Old Glory with pride, but doing so in the Spirit of God -- that is, the Spirit of LOVE, RESPECT, UNITY, and PEACE. Let us act as one true Body of Christ and as One People, diverse yet unified. It's how we can advance the Kingdom of God and make the United States of America a beacon of light for the world.

As our great President Abraham Lincoln said, “My dream is of a place and a time where America will once again be seen as the last best hope of Earth.” May the PEACE and JOY of Christ be with all of you this Fourth of July weekend!


I will be ordained a priest on July 30 for my home diocese of Lugazi in Uganda.

Planned Offertory Program (POP)

In the past, usually in the Fall, through the **Planned Offertory Program (POP)**, we have invited parishioners to prayerfully reflect on the gift of treasure they are able to share with OLPH, specifically their support of the General Offertory Collection. This year, we are giving that invitation a slightly new look, with less paper, less postage and a different commitment schedule.

Given that the parish runs on a fiscal year (July 1 – June 30), we have decided to align the POP campaign and commitment schedule with the fiscal year. This will make budgeting, forecasting and planning more relevant to the current period of time. We are also providing a link on our website to a form where each family can participate by filling out their commitment for the upcoming fiscal year. (Go to the homepage of our olphglenview.org website or click on the QR code following this article to access the form.)

The OLPH Parish budget for FY22-23 includes many expense line items increasing between 5% and 10%, with other percentage increases even higher. If we can get our General Offertory collection for FY23 back to its FY21 level, we will be able to cover salary increases, the restoration of certain employee benefits suspended during COVID, increased energy and insurance costs, a fully opened church building for liturgies, fully active ministries, and, lastly, needed maintenance/repairs scheduled for the upcoming year. We will also be able to cover our Faith Formation costs, maintain our subsidy to the School, as well as our First Fruits commitment. **In order to do all this, it is projected that we will need to see the General Offertory line increase by at least 7-8%.**

Your participation in the POP helps provide the direct support needed to achieve our parish goal of fiscal responsibility and gives us the ability to plan and budget, as we continue to ensure

the vibrancy of our parish. We invite each of you to renew your commitment to the POP, and, if possible, consider an increase of 5-7%, if you are able to do so. If you are new to the parish or have not participated in the POP in past years, we invite you to do so in the upcoming weeks. Your commitment to the Planned Offertory Program, supporting our ministries and stewardship work at the parish level and beyond, would be greatly appreciated. Any level of commitment is encouraged, and any gift is valued.

May God bless you for your prayerful and intentional consideration of your level of support of our parish operations. May you also have a safe and restful summer!

Q & A with Angela

Everything you wanted to know about R. E.
(but were afraid to ask.)

Each week, in the summer Bulletins, our Director of Religious Education & Youth Ministry, **Angela Romero** will answer questions and help parish families understand the benefits and importance of our Religious Education program here at OLPH.

What is Religious Education?

The OLPH Religious Education Program helps families guide their children in our Catholic faith, completely grounded in Jesus Christ. In the Gospel of Matthew, we hear Jesus say, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19-20).

The Religious Education program is one way that we respond to this directive as a parish. Religious Education is about encountering Christ and having an ongoing relationship with Him and His Church. The goal of our Catholic faith is to be a saint in heaven. We strive to accompany our students and their families on their journeys towards sainthood.

The OLPH Religious Education program offers a variety of classes to students in PreK through eighth grades. Families have the option to send their children to weekly classes: a more traditional model with a Catechist, a member of the parish who has volunteered to share their faith with our children; or to join us for the Family Catechesis program which invites families with students in Pre-K through fifth grades to meet monthly and grow in faith together.

These classes allow students to learn about the fundamentals of our faith such as the 10 Commandments, the Sacraments, the Mass, prayer, and so much more. The Religious Education program also prepares students to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion in second grade and Confirmation in eighth grade.

Children are prepared for these Sacraments over a period of two to three years alongside their family and our community. Religious Education is a vital part of OLPH!

OLPH Religious Education registration for the 2022 – 2023 school year is now open! Go to www.olphre.org to register any time before August 31, or simply click on the QR code below to access the registration form and register today! Religious Education is available for all students entering Pre-K 4 through 8th grade.

This year we will be offering both traditional, in-person weekly classes and Family Catechesis. Families can choose which option works best for them. Our weekly classes are led by a Catechist for students

in a classroom setting. Classes will be held onsite on Tue., 4:30 to 5:45pm; Tue., 6:30 to 7:45pm; and Sat., 9:00am to 10:15am.

Families with students in Pre-K4 thru 5th grade have the option to register for our Family Catechesis program in lieu of in person classes. Families meet the first Saturday of each month on site for two-hour sessions. Family Catechesis is a wonderful way to get to know other families and grow in community together.

Religious Education includes Sacramental preparation as well! We prepare children for receiving the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion in 1st and 2nd grade, receiving the Sacraments in 2nd grade. We prepare children for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in 6th, 7th and 8th grades, receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in 8th grade. These are very important and exciting years for your children to join us in Religious Education!

This year's weekly classes will begin after Labor Day, and Family Catechesis will meet for the first time this year on Saturday, October 1st. We are excited to see all of our students and families back in person on campus this year!






