OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP CHURCH

Dear Parishioners,

The tragic mass shooting in Highland Park yesterday has been another moment of profound grief as the result of gun violence. I know many people who go to that parade and they, along with countless others, will struggle with memories of panic and horror for the rest of their lives.

First of all we must hold everyone affected by this tragedy in prayer. Our Lord was a victim of violence himself and walks with us during these moments of the violent loss of life. We pray for the countless heroes, first responders and bystanders who put the needs of others before themselves. These acts of courage and compassion will never be forgotten. We must pray for children who are increasingly exposed to a world of senseless, unpredictable violence as a result of weapons.

Recently the President signed into law a bipartisan bill that addresses inadequacies in gun laws. This measure is a step in the right direction but in many ways is just the first step in a much more complicated process of addressing systemic causes that contribute to gun violence. High powered assault weapons have no place in a civil society. As the Cardinal said yesterday, the right to life is a far more precious right than the right to possess weapons whose only purpose is to kill large numbers of people.

Cities in other parts of the world, several times the size of the Chicagoland area have a fraction of the gun violence we endure. We are approaching 350 mass shootings in the United States since the first of the year. This is immoral and intolerable.

I know there are no simple solutions, but we can't just keep avoiding the necessary remedies that result in a safer more humane way of living together. No one law is going to solve the gun violence epidemic in the United State. Each measure though makes us stronger and stronger as a country in which the "pursuit of happiness" becomes more real.

Dear Parishioners,

The Foundation of a Moral Life

In light of the recent Supreme Court decision in *Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, and all the discussion we are hearing in the news from all sides about what is "right" and "wrong" on the particular topic of abortion, I thought it would be a good time to reflect on the broader topic of Catholic morality in general. I would like to shine

some light on why the Church holds particular views on specific topics, such as those on abortion or marriage for example, by looking at the basic foundations of Catholic morality more closely.

Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen is quoted as saying "Moral principles do not depend on a majority vote. Wrong is wrong, even if everybody is wrong. Right is right, even if nobody is right." So, if morality is not based on the actions and opinions of the majority then what is the foundation of our Catholic morality?

We do not believe that morality is a matter of innovation by humans, but rather it is a matter of divine revelation from God himself! We do not depend on the whim of human musings or the ever-shifting sands of cultural practices. Instead, the Catholic foundation of morality can be found in Sacred Scripture.

We can start by looking more specifically at the Mosaic Law of the Old Testament, and what we learn from the Ten Commandments. They address our basic human values: the Creator, Faith, Time, Family, Life, Marriage, Freedom, Reputation, Home, and Belongings. In these, we see that these Ten Commandments offer us basic moral guidelines that work universally across both culture and time. These human values are of the utmost importance to each of us regardless of our place or point in history. The Ten Commandments provide humanity with an outline for a moral code that aids us in respecting these universal values.

If we look closer, we also see that the first three commandments deal with our "vertical" relationship with

God, while the next seven commandments deal with our "horizontal" relationship with others. Jesus highlights these two aspects when answering the Pharisee's question about what is the greatest commandment. "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments" (Mt 22:37-40). Not only do we see these two distinct themes of the Ten Commandments defined in Jesus' reply, but He also connects the two greatest commandments to the single value of Love.

It is this value of love that brings us back even further in Sacred Scripture to the creation of man and woman. The foundation of a moral life can be traced back to the very fact that we were all created in the image of God, and then placed in relationship with God and one another. The very act of creation and the love given to us by God invites us to live a life of loving gratitude to God. Then recognizing the image of God in our fellow human beings, we are compelled to respect the dignity of each person and strive to live together with one another in a relationship that reflects both the love God has for us and our love for God.

Here we find the most basic foundation of the moral life. Love of God and love of neighbor. It is to this end that the Ten Commandments were revealed to guide us. They provide us with a better understanding of what a life of love looks like in our world, and how we should live out our lives with loving kindness as the foundation of our relationship with God and one another.

However, our divine revelation on morality does not end here. Jesus gave us more than just a simplification of the Ten Commandments! Throughout the Gospels, Jesus provided us with a fuller interpretation of the moral code established in the Old Testament.

Jesus is not seeking to provide additional legal restrictions on our actions, the Jewish Law had done plenty of that, but to help us understand and interpret these laws. "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly" (Jn 10:10). Jesus is, however, quite

clear that it is not His intention to abolish the Mosaic Law but instead to fulfill the Law. To provide us with a better approach to the moral life than the legalistic following of practices and regulations like the scribes and Pharisees. He not only explains the Law in a new way to us, but he obeys the Law in a way that demonstrates God's original intent and the inner spirit of these laws.

One significant moment in Jesus' ministry that underscores His teachings on this change in perspective on the Law was the Sermon on the Mount. The central theme of the Sermon on the Mount was "righteousness." A righteousness that comes from adhering to God's will through conduct that is aligned with the priorities of the Kingdom of God (rather than our own priorities). The Sermon on the Mount does not provide us with a "new" law, but it provides us with a lens of virtues, actions, and a lifestyle of service to others through which to fulfill the intent of the Ten Commandments and the Mosaic Law.

Of course, a significant moment in the Sermon on the Mount is the teaching of the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes present a new way of looking at the law that emphasizes a set of virtues, or the disposition to act righteously, instead of a list of specific laws to fulfill.

Some of the virtues that the Beatitudes set forth are humility, fortitude, justice, mercy, compassion, purity of heart, and active nonviolence. The Beatitudes and these virtues provide us with the values, attitudes, and personal characteristics leading us to actions that will be rewarded in the Kingdom of God, though they might not always be valued here on earth.

The Sermon on the Mount represents a shift in thinking that extends even to our present day. It represents a call to "universal holiness" for all of us. We are called not to a holiness reserved for the scribes and Pharisees in the day of Jesus, and not to a holiness reserved for the clerics and Saints of our current day. Rather, Jesus is calling each one of us to a life of holiness that permeates our hearts, minds, and actions - a life that, through the virtues of the Beatitudes, fulfills the Ten Commandments, fulfills the Greatest Commandments, and fulfills the very foundation of our Catholic moral life, the Love of God and the Love of Neighbor!

We are however not being called to a life of holiness without help. Jesus not only instructs us and gives us the example of His own life, but we are being called to a life of holiness as a disciple and follower of Jesus himself.

Saint John Paul II tells us that "Following Christ is thus the essential and primordial foundation of Christian morality ...this is not a matter only of disposing oneself to hear a teaching and obediently accepting a commandment. More radically, it involves holding fast to the very person of Jesus, partaking of his life and his destiny, sharing in his free and loving obedience to the will of the Father... Jesus asks us to follow him and to imitate him along the path of love, a love which gives itself completely to the brethren out of love for God ... Jesus' way of acting and his words, his deeds and his precepts constitute the

moral rule of Christian life" (Veritatis Splendor 19-20) and forms the foundation for all our Catholic moral teachings.

Ask Angela

Everything you wanted to know about R. E.
(but were afraid to ask.)

Each week, in the summer Bulletins, our Director of Religious Education & Youth Ministry, **Angela Romero** will answer questions and help parish families understand the benefits and importance of our Religious Education program here at OLPH.

What is Family Catechesis?

Family Catechesis is a learning model that allows families to walk their faith journey together as a family alongside others in our community. The program is designed to help children in Pre-K through fifth grades and their parents to grow together in faith. "Family-centered catechetical programs are opportunities for parents to catechize their children directly, for spouses to catechize each other and for children to catechize one another and their parents" (National Directory for Catechesis #61.2). Family Catechesis is a program that allows families to learn and pray together. It includes monthly in-person sessions for both parents and their children from October to May, and supported learning at home during the rest of the month.

Here at OLPH, Family Catechesis takes place on site the first Saturday of each month from 9:30am to 11:30am. The remainder of the month families will work through the material assigned at home together. This model can help accommodate the busy schedules our families juggle and allow parents to become involved in new ways in the faith lives of their children.

Family Catechesis at OLPH is open to families with students in PreK through fifth grades. If your family has children in sixth, seventh, or eighth grades they are welcome to participate in the program alongside their family, but will need to enroll in weekly Religious Education classes in order to receive specific preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation. Family Catechesis is a wonderful option for families who wish to explore their Catholic faith together while also getting to know other families in our community!


This year we will be offering both traditional, in-person weekly classes and Family Catechesis. Families can choose which option works best for them. Our weekly classes are led by a Catechist for students

in a classroom setting. Classes will be held onsite on Tue., 4:30 to 5:45pm; Tue., 6:30 to 7:45pm; and Sat., 9:00am to 10:15am.

Families with students in Pre-K4 thru 5th grade have the option to register for our Family Catechesis program in lieu of in person classes. Families meet the first Saturday of each month on site for two-hour sessions. Family Catechesis is a wonderful way to get to know other families and grow in community together.

Religious Education includes Sacramental preparation as well! We prepare children for receiving the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion in 1st and 2nd grade, receiving the Sacraments in 2nd grade. We prepare children for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in 6th, 7th and 8th grades, receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in 8th grade. These are very important and exciting years for your children to join us in Religious Education!

This year's weekly classes will begin after Labor Day, and Family Catechesis will meet for the first time this year on Saturday, October 1st. We are excited to see all of our students and families back in person on campus this year!

Planned Offertory Program (POP)

In the past, usually in the Fall, through the **Planned Offertory Program (POP)**, we have invited parishioners to prayerfully reflect on the gift of treasure they are able to share with OLPH, specifically their support of the General Offertory Collection. This year, we are giving that invitation a slightly new look, with less paper, less postage and a different commitment schedule.

Given that the parish runs on a fiscal year (July 1 – June 30), we have decided to align the POP campaign and commitment schedule with the fiscal year. This will make budgeting, forecasting and planning more relevant to the current period of time. We are also providing a link on our website to a form where each family can participate by filling out their commitment for the upcoming fiscal year. (Go to the homepage of our olphglenview.org website or click on the QR code following this article to access the form.)

The OLPH Parish budget for FY22-23 includes many expense line items increasing between 5% and 10%, with other percentage increases even higher. If we can get our General Offertory collection for FY23 back to its FY21 level, we will be able to cover salary increases, the restoration of certain employee benefits suspended during COVID, increased energy and insurance costs, a fully opened church building for liturgies, fully active ministries, and, lastly, needed maintenance/repairs scheduled for the upcoming year. We will also be able to cover our Faith Formation costs, maintain our subsidy to the School, as well as our First Fruits commitment. **In order to do all this, it is projected that we will need to see the General Offertory line increase by at least 7-8%.**

Your participation in the POP helps provide the direct support needed to achieve our parish goal of fiscal responsibility and gives us the ability to plan and budget, as we continue to ensure the vibrancy of our parish. We invite each of you to renew your commitment to the POP, and, if possible, consider an increase of 5-7%, if you are able to do so. If you are new to the parish or have not participated in the POP in past years, we invite you to do so in the upcoming weeks. Your commitment to the Planned Offertory Program, supporting our ministries and stewardship work at the parish level and beyond, would be greatly appreciated. Any level of commitment is encouraged, and any gift is valued.

May God bless you for your prayerful and intentional consideration of your level of support of our parish operations. May you also have a safe and restful summer!


