## The "Hinges" of Holiness

Last week's article spoke a bit about the foundations of our Catholic morality, the basis for why the Church holds its particular views on moral topics, and how Jesus calls each one of us to a life of holiness that permeates our hearts, minds, and actions. This week we will look closer at how we can individually grow in holiness each day through

living out the virtues and the Greatest Commandments: the Love of God and the Love of Neighbor!

The Latin term for "Hinge" is *cardo*. From this, we get the related Latin word *cardinalis* which is defined as "serving as a pivot upon which something depends." If we bring this all together it gives us the linguistic meaning of the word "cardinal." In the Roman Catholic tradition, we not only associate the word Cardinal with the pivotal Bishops that elect the Pope, but we also have the Cardinal Virtues, the "hinge virtues" of holiness for each of us!

There are four cardinal virtues: prudence, fortitude, justice, and temperance. In the Book of Wisdom we hear, "*She teaches moderation (temperance) and prudence, righteousness (justice) and fortitude, and nothing in life is more useful than these*" (Wis 8:7). In the simplest form, a virtue is a stable disposition to act in ways that are good. These acquired good habits of the intellect and will guide our conduct according to reason and faith making it possible for us to lead a morally good life and dispose us to communion with God. Contrary to this are vices, or those habits causing us to act in ways leading us away from the moral life and damaging our relationship with God.

The first cardinal virtue is prudence, which "disposes the practical reason to discern, in every circumstance, our true good and to choose the right means for achieving it" (CCC 1835). It gives us knowledge of what we must do, when to do it, and how to do it. Would it be "prudent" to drive 100 miles per hour? If there was a life-threatening

emergency and someone needed to get to the hospital, after considering all factors involved such as traffic and weather conditions, it could be prudent in order to save a life. Imprudence on the other hand results from failure of deliberation, decision, or execution because of weakness of the intellect, a misdirected will, or an uncontrolled appetite that result in rashness, thoughtlessness, inconstancy, or negligence and failing to act in ways that are good. Consider a teenager who skips class to get out of a major test and fails to consider the consequences ruining his prospect for a good grade. Three ideas to help one's growth in prudence would be to seek counsel from wise and faithful people before making a significant decision, make judgments by weighing the options and praying for discernment before making a significant decision, and be decisive once you have discerned the best course of action, follow through!

The second cardinal virtue is fortitude, which "ensures firmness in difficulties and constancy in the pursuit of the good" (CCC 1837). It is having a resolute spirit, firmness of mind, and perseverance of faith in God's providence to overcome obstacles and do what is good. This is having the moral courage to serve God. Take for instance visiting a friend with COVID who needs physical and spiritual care. After taking reasonable precautions, having the courage to extend the hand of Christ to them despite the personal risk shows fortitude. Cowardice results from refusing to take a prudent risk because of concern for self-preservation over doing what is morally right. Take for example the person who goes along with their boss at work in misleading a potential customer to make a sale. Instead of standing up to their boss, they say nothing so as to not negatively impact their next promotion. Recklessness, however, is lacking a proper awareness or concern for real danger, and foolishly getting into a dangerous situation for one's own glory. Although it might seem courageous for a bystander to run into a burning building, without any training, safety equipment, or knowledge of someone in need of help, this is not a display of fortitude, but rather careless risk-taking. Three ideas to help your growth in fortitude would be to practice patience, strengthening yourself against

temptations and persevering through difficulty, exercise constancy in the endurance through challenges to do good works, and avoid settling for a small existence, but in prayer strive to glorify God.

The third cardinal virtue is justice which "consists in the firm and constant will to give God and neighbor their due" (CCC 1836). This is not punishment, but a positive thing. In our relationship with God, his due is in worship, service, and gratitude. In our relationship with neighbor, it means dealing fairly with others and recognizing the equality and dignity of each individual. Justice comes in two forms: commutative (one individual to another), and distributive (one individual to society). For instance, justice is making sure that everyone has the same opportunity to educate their children in the faith by accepting a smaller scholarship so another family that needs the support has the same opportunity to attend the parish school. Injustice is the failure to give another what is due and may strike against either the individual or the common good either intentionally, through ignorance, or in a moment of passion. Take for instance the pregnant teenage girl who has an abortion. This is injustice to the dignity and right to life of the child that is killed, but it could be done in ignorance because of her understanding about when life begins. Three ideas to help one's growth in justice would be to worship more, giving God the gratitude and praise he is due, volunteer for something like the pro-life movement to help protect the unborn and the infirmed, and pay your right taxes and church offering to support the common good of the community.

The fourth cardinal virtue is Temperance which "moderates the attraction of the pleasures of the senses and provides balance in the use of created

goods" (CCC 1838). It achieves balance, composure, and freedom from extremes in our lives. This applies to food (abstinence), drink (sobriety), sex (chastity), or sensual pleasures (purity), but it also applies to shopping, gambling, work, exercise, online activity, and social status. Temperance is about exercising restraint or constraint from being overzealous or enslaved by anything in life. Take for instance putting in long hours at work to get ahead. Working hard to advance is a good thing, but it is temperance that makes sure it does not start impacting a person's marriage or relationship with their children. Intemperance, on the other hand, results from a lack of control over the pleasures of life that weakens the control of reason and enslaves them to their cravings. It is seen at "All-You-Can-Eat" buffets where people eat until they feel ill just looking at another bite of food. Insensibility, however, is lacking enjoyment in things God has made for our happiness, or negligence in the care of things required for natural preservation. Three ideas to help growth in temperance, and avoid intemperance or insensibility, are to practice moderation in food, drink, and time on electronic devices, avoid excess in the material things by enjoying what you already have, and building healthy habits of spending quality time with family, friends, and in the activities you enjoy in life.

Building these Cardinal Virtues, the "Hinges of Holiness", into our lives will aid us in establishing a stable disposition to act in ways that are good, strengthen the intellect and will that guide our conduct according to reason and faith, help us to lead a morally good life, and to live out the Greatest Commandments each and every day: the Love of God and the Love of Neighbor!

Each week, in the summer Bulletins, our Director of Religious Education & Youth Ministry, **Angela Romero** will answer questions and help parish families understand the benefits and importance of our Religious Education program here at OLPH.

## What is asked of Religious Education families outside of the classroom?

Religious Education is an opportunity for children to learn about Christ and His Church, and to grow in faith. However, weekly Religious Education classes cannot accomplish this goal without the help of the families of our students. Families are asked to engage in the parish and our community outside of the Religious Education classroom.

Parents are the first teachers of the faith and parental involvement in the Religious Education program is a must no matter which learning model your family chooses! We are partners in the religious education of your children, with key support and involvement beginning at home.

Parents are always welcome and encouraged to attend a class, and there will be various activities throughout the year where we count on parent support and attendance to help engage the students in the faith. All parents are expected to volunteer in some capacity with the program and there are plenty of opportunities to choose from! We ask our students

to invest significant time into their religious education, and by volunteering with the program and our parish, parents can model that investment. The best way for a parent to share their faith with their child is to live your own faith, allowing your children to follow your example.

We expect and require that all families in our program are registered and active parishioners here at OLPH. That means that this is your parish, where you attend Mass on Sundays, participate in the parish life, give back, and more. ## Planned Offertory Program (POP)

In the past, usually in the Fall, through the **Planned Offertory Program (POP)**, we have invited parishioners to prayerfully reflect on the gift of treasure they are able to share with OLPH, specifically their support of the General Offertory Collection. This year, we are giving that invitation a slightly new look, with less paper, less postage and a different commitment schedule.

**Given that the parish runs on a fiscal year (July 1 – June 30), we have decided to align the POP campaign and commitment schedule with the fiscal year.** This will make budgeting, forecasting and planning more relevant to the current period of time. We are also providing a link on our website to a form where each family can participate by filling out their commitment for the upcoming fiscal year. (Go to the homepage of our [olphglenview.org](http://olphglenview.org) website or click on the QR code following this article to access the form.)

The OLPH Parish budget for FY22-23 includes many expense line items increasing between 5% and 10%, with other percentage increases even higher. If we can get our General Offertory collection for FY23 back to its FY21 level, we will be able to cover salary increases, the restoration of certain employee benefits suspended during COVID, increased energy and insurance costs, a fully opened church building for liturgies, fully active ministries, and, lastly, needed maintenance/repairs scheduled for the upcoming year. We will also be able to cover our Faith Formation costs, maintain our subsidy to the School, as well as our First Fruits commitment. In order to do all this, it is projected that we will need to see the General Offertory line increase by at least 7-8%.

Your participation in the POP helps provide the direct support needed to achieve our parish goal of fiscal responsibility and gives us the ability to plan and budget, as we continue to ensure the vibrancy of our parish. We invite each of you to renew your commitment to the POP, and, if possible, consider an increase of 5-7%, if you are able to do so. If you are new to the parish or have not participated in the POP in past years, we invite you to do so in the upcoming weeks. Your commitment to the Planned Offertory Program, supporting our ministries and stewardship work at the parish level and beyond, would be greatly appreciated. Any level of commitment is encouraged, and any gift is valued.

May God bless you for your prayerful and intentional consideration of your level of support of our parish operations. May you also have a safe and restful summer!
