Dear Parishioners,

"Come by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while."

These words spoken by Our Lord in this weekend's gospel are well suited to this time that finds us in the heart of summer. I hope and pray that everyone will find some time to "rest a while". The rhythm of summer invites us to slow down, kick back and relax.

Summer days pass quickly!

Recently, all the priests gathered for a Convocation with Cardinal Cupich at Pheasant Run. It was a wonderful gathering. The opening talk by Bishop McElroy from San Diego was terrific. He challenged us to work for unity in our ranks. Divisions within the presbyterate can have painful implications in terms of our corporate ministry in this local church. In a group process led by the consultant Dominic Perri, we were clustered into the four generations that define us. Priests ordained before the Vatican Council, those ordained during the Council, those ordained after the council and the millennial priests. It was a fascinating discussion on how the generation each of us was ordained in effects our vision of Church and how we interpret and face challenges in our ministry. Cardinal Cupich covered many topics but a lot of the focus was on the initiative, *Renew My Church*.

This fall, the Cardinal is requesting all the parishes send representatives to a summit he is convening on a process called, *Divine Renovation*. This is a process leading to parish renewal that has been developed by Fr. James Mallon, a Canadian priest. This process has been widely acclaimed and will build on the efforts we undertook when we participated in the Transformation Process. I will keep you informed.

Last week we installed our Parish Pastoral Council under the leadership of Laura Flentye. The Council plays a crucial role in assisting me in the governance of the parish. Strong, committed lay leadership

is crucial to a dynamic and vital parish. I really appreciate the sacrifices members of the Council make to serve our parish so well. We have an action-packed agenda for the coming year.

Summertime allows us to maintain our beautiful campus. We had to replace five trees that were dying because of disease. This prompted a review of our landscaping plan. We are blessed to have the landscape development expertise of Van Zelst Inc., that does a great job. We are looking to develop a three to five-year plan to address our gardens and irrigation needs. Considering the Holy Father's Encyclical, *Laudato Si*, we want to have sustainable perennials that will bring color and beauty. Irrigation systems will make the gardens much less labor-intensive and will help us be more responsible in terms of water conservation. Some of these gardens will provide a possibility to be memorialized for a family or in memory of a loved one. Contributions will help defray some of the costs. If you are interested please contact me.

Our recent pilgrimage to France and Spain was a great success. We had beautiful liturgies at the Cathedral in Nice, The Basilica of Lourdes and the Basilica of Our Lady of Montserrat in Spain. We were blessed to visit the Vence Chapel in France that was designed by Henri Matisse in gratitude for the care he received from the Dominican Sisters when he was suffering from cancer.

We had a great celebration of Sister Marie Krippner's life last weekend. Three generations of her students were present at the liturgy. Special thanks to Sr. Paulanne and Sallyanne Corbett who prepared the liturgy. Kaylee Darrow and Russell Stern led us in beautiful music. Following Mass, Mary Fran Dolan and Beth O'Grady hosted a wonderful reception on the rectory porch. Sr. Marie will always be remembered here!

The 8:15 Alarm

You could say I have an “on and off, more off than on” relationship with Facebook. However, on occasion, I’ll scroll through my newsfeed to see what’s happening. Recently, I came across a post that was somehow connected to someone I know. You know, those deep connections that after clicking and scrolling, you realize it’s maybe someone you went to high school with? Or a friend of someone you went to high school with, which means you kind of know them? Although I didn’t know the originator of the post, it intrigued me. Even though I didn’t know, personally, the person she posted about, I could tell he was a good friend of hers who had recently passed away in an accident. The post continued to say that shortly after he had passed way and his phone was returned to his parents, they


discovered an alarm on it that asked, “Who did you help today?” The alarm went off every day.

Remember, it was his phone. It was an alarm that was meant for his eyes only. It was a reminder for him to reflect on his day and how he was living and doing for others. Perhaps this wasn’t a surprise to those that knew him.

Perhaps they already knew he was the kind of guy that made an impact on many. Though I didn’t know him, this post impacted me as well.

We all have alarms on our phones. There are alarms that serve as gentle reminders to get up and start the day. To pick a child up from school or practice. Or to pray. (Nothing like a little nudge throughout the day to stop what you’re doing and pray). But now, after reading an oh-so-small piece of this man’s personal story, the question on his phone alarm has left an impression on me, someone he never met. Since reading this post, I’ve renamed my 8:15 pm alarm (originally set as a gentle reminder to pick up my daughter) on my phone to “Who did you help today?”

I like the alarm in the evening so that I can reflect on my day. Somedays the answer is easy and I know exactly how to answer the question. Somedays I help quite a few people. But honestly, some days



it’s hard. Who did I help? Did I honestly do anything for anyone else? On days that I failed, I make a conscious effort before going to sleep to do better the next day.

The 8:15 alarm, a reminder to reflect on what I have done for others, is good for me. It reminds me to look past myself, to think about other people’s needs and act on them outside of a daily routine. I hope this snapshot of a post will inspire you to honor a man’s memory – a man whom most of us never met – by challenging yourself the same way he did. I know the gentle prompt on my wrist will continue to influence me and challenge me until it becomes easier to answer the question “who did you help today?”

How might you answer that question today? Perhaps you could set your alarm today so that tomorrow you can be reminded to contact the Religious Education Program to learn more about who you can help today. Catechists are needed for the 2018-2019 RE school year. Over 900 children in the OLPH community are waiting for you.

Creation Care Ministry Summer Tips (part 1 of 2)

It's hot out there! Cooling your home efficiently (and cheaper) is good for the planet, and for you! Below are tips from the Department of Energy. Learn more at: www.energy.gov/energysaver/spring-and-summer-energy-saving-tips

Use Your Windows to Gain Cool Air and Keep Out Heat


- If the night is forecast to be cool, turn off your cooling system and open your windows while sleeping. When you wake in the morning, shut the windows and blinds to capture the cool air.
- Install window coverings to prevent heat gain through your windows.
- Close the coverings during the day to block the sun's heat.

Operate Your Thermostat Efficiently

- Set your thermostat as high as comfortably possible in the summer. The smaller the difference between the indoor and outdoor temperatures, the lower your overall cooling bill will be.
- Keep your house warmer than normal when you are away, and lower the thermostat setting to 78°F (26°C) only when you are at home and need cooling. A programmable thermostat can make it easy to set back your temperature.
- Avoid setting your thermostat at a colder setting than normal when you turn on your air conditioner. It will not cool your home any faster and could result in excessive cooling and unnecessary expense.

Use Fans and Ventilation Strategies to Cool Your Home

- A ceiling fan will allow you to raise the thermostat setting about 4°F with no reduction in comfort.
- Turn off ceiling fans when you leave the room. Remember that fans cool people, not rooms, by creating a wind chill effect.
- When you shower or take a bath, use the bathroom fan to remove the heat and humidity from your home. Your laundry room might also benefit from spot ventilation. Make sure bathroom and kitchen fans are vented to the outside (not just to the attic).

What a remarkable demonstration of their concern for the poor, through living their faith, putting their words into action and helping to "Shelter the Homeless."

I believe the teens at OLPH are just as passionate about helping others as their peers at St. Norbert's. Plans are underway for our own week-long mission trip with Habitat for Humanity next year. We also need adult volunteers so I am calling on anyone interested in this project to let me know of their interest. Also in the works are fundraising opportunities to offset the cost of the trip.

Transform Your Faith: Join Scripture Study!

What is Scripture Study at OLPH?

Small groups of parishioners meet weekly to study a specific book of the Bible. New sessions kick off twice a year.

How does it work?

Starting in September and again in the New Year, we choose a single book of Scripture for focus. The highly engaging Threshold Bible Study series provides readings, commentary from a theologian, and questions for reflection. Once a week, on days and times selected by participants, small groups meet to share prayer, fellowship, and insights. Meetings also include a short video commentary by a member of our pastoral staff.



Why join?

Participants find that the small-group format energizes their personal study by adding new perspectives and the combined wisdom of a small community. In sharing and reflecting, we find the Holy Spirit showing us new connections between the message of Scripture and the circumstances of our individual lives.

What's next?

Our upcoming study, the Gospel of Luke, starts Sept. 4 and concludes on Nov. 19.


