

## seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

*"Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?"*

As we move into the latter part of summer, the gospels are taken from Jesus' discourse on the "bread of life". This is Jesus' most extensive meditation on the Eucharist. These teachings of the Lord evolve from today's recounting of the feeding of the multitudes.

There is a constant tension between abundance and scarcity. The pandemic heightened a sense of panic at times that resulted in grocery stores being overrun with people hoarding certain products. Remember the toilet paper crises? A contributing factor to the current rise in inflation is the result of supply lines that have been interrupted and there are too many people wanting to buy a car, build a house, etc.

As the Gospel unfolds this weekend, there was a panic that set in. Where could enough food be provided for the hungry multitudes? There is no scarcity to God's grace, God's mercy, God's love.

We can never exhaust the well of God's love for us. We are reassured that the Lord will provide for us even when it seems unlikely. God continues to surprise us with his presence, his majesty, his mercy.

This time of year, the fields of the earth are producing another bounty of food that will sustain us.

This journey in the next several weeks of exploring the Bread of Life Discourses have special meaning. For the past year and a half most were forced into a "eucharistic fast" because of the pandemic. So often people would write to me with their suffering as a result of not being able to come to the table of the Lord. Perhaps you can remember the first time you received communion after months of being unable to participate in the Eucharist.

Each weekend, I am deeply moved by the joy people experience coming to mass for the first time after such a long period of separation. When the multitudes were fed, they came to believe! This year, for me, the breaking of the bread means so much more. Deo Gratias!

We are now two months into Phase Five in which many of the restrictions imposed on us as a result of Covid have been lifted. I want to give you an update.

As we entered this new phase, I introduced it as incremental in nature, not an overnight transformation. We have successfully opened our Masses with no occupancy limits. The parish office is open. In-person meetings can take place. The Playdium is up and running. Each week the pace of parish life increases.

We all are aware that Covid is not over, and the Delta Variant is proving to be a worldwide challenge to the progress we are making. Some practices of liturgy and gathering are still being impacted and I want to exercise an abundance of caution while still moving forward.

Many people have been vaccinated, but many have not. I am especially concerned about children under the age of 12, people who cannot get vaccinated because of health issues, and those while vaccinated have a higher risk of infection due to their health situation.

Our current Mass schedule will stay in place for the foreseeable future. There needs to be one Mass that provides an option for those who are not comfortable being in the Church and being around many mask-less people. The Drive-In Mass provides this alternative. I just ask for patience and understanding so that OLPH can continue to include everyone in our worship. We will continue to monitor the Mass schedule. The current timing of the Masses reduces the crowds of people coming and leaving at the same time.

I feel we should still observe some mitigations that reduce risk. For right now, the Holy Water fonts, missalettes, and order of services that are publicly touched by many people increase risk. Until the Delta Variant subsides, we will delay their reinstatement. We are daily sanitizing the church and the rest of our facilities.

I would encourage you to go to the website on your phone and download the order of service. It is okay to use your phone at Mass for this purpose. We have put QR codes on the pews so you can make your offering at Mass if you are uncomfortable with the basket. We will reinstate the offertory procession and the children bringing up food when we have made further

In the early months of the pandemic, we applied for the Payment Protection Program. With about 120 employees I was very anxious about how we were going to keep everyone employed with the Church shut down and no income. Through the hard work of our former Director of Operations and Finances, **Jim Dollard**, Finance Council members **Bob Michels** and **Tom Zidar**, along with **Amy Mills**, **Barb O'Hara Matzkin** and the advice of **Bob Huffman** we qualified for the loan. This loan stabilized our financial situation, and I did not have to lay anyone off. In addition to the PPP loan, all of you generously maintained your giving which helped us face this unprecedented financial challenge

Through the hard work of our new Director of Operations and Finances, **Mary Lynne Januszewski** we were informed by the Small Business Administration that our application to have the loan forgiven was accepted. Thank you to Mary Lynne and our friends at Glenview State Bank that went through the meticulous process to achieve this forgiveness of the loan.

I am looking forward this week to the Annual Men's Club Kickoff Party, on Tuesday at Valley Lo Club.

Special thanks to **Margaret Waldron**, the Missionaries and the adult volunteers for making this year's Totus Tuus program such a success. We had a week of beautiful weather, great fun and many opportunities to explore the faith of our young people.

Last week I presided at the 9:30 am Mass in McDonnell Hall. **Deacon Jim Revord** gave a great homily, and it was wonderful to see so many children there. The 9:30 am Mass is a child-friendly Mass. Even with the observance of protocols, it is an uplifting celebration for families with young children. I might add that many come to this Mass just to experience its spirit and vitality. The Mass brings out the youthfulness in all of us.

## *Parish profile:* DEACON JAMES SSEBUNNYA

Over the past two summers, we have been blessed to have had **Deacon James Ssebunnya** here at OLPH. Dcn. James will be leaving August 22 for the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio, to complete his final year in school. We hope you have gotten to know him during his stay here. However, because of COVID, we understand that opportunities have been limited. For that reason, **Mark Mitchell** has written this wonderful profile piece about James. Please try to connect with James and wish him well before he embarks on the next part of his journey.

"I once walked into the sacristy before Mass, and Sister Paulanne said the cantor couldn't come, and then she gave me a hymnal. I didn't know most of the songs in there, so I came up with some religious songs from childhood." That was Deacon James Ssebunnya's first experience cantoring at Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Now it is one of his regular duties during the week, in addition to assisting the priest, reading the Gospel, and preaching. "Music is my hobby, so it's no burden. And my supervisor during my pastoral spiritual year was a great preacher – I want to model myself on him."

James grew up in Mukono, in central Uganda, where his family were coffee farmers, as well as producing the food on the dinner table. "I went to Catholic elementary school, then [high school] seminary in Nyenga for six years, then Katigondo National Seminary. I'm a trained teacher and I was active in teaching ministry during my pastoral spiritual year."

Three years ago, James was sent by his bishop to the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio, to complete his priestly formation. James' Vocations Director is an alumnus of the Josephinum, and his fruitful priestly ministry inspires many. Although it may be a little challenging to be far away from one's own family, James looks at it differently. "I will have to be obedient as a priest, and accepting this seminary assignment proves my ability to be obedient. I look at it positively as a great moment to learn more, to gain broader perspectives, to discover different outlooks, and to come back to my diocese changed and for the benefit of my diocese and my bishop."



James spent his first summer in the U.S. at Notre Dame parish in Clarendon Hills. Attending a wedding in downtown Chicago, he met fellow Ugandan Fr. Patrick Kizza, and the two became friends.

In the summer of 2020, Fr. Jerry Boland welcomed James to Our Lady of Perpetual Help, but because the pandemic had the parish largely shut down, James did not get to know many people. Fr. Boland again generously received James, now a deacon, back for his last summer in the USA, and he will be here until late August. "I used to run and play soccer, but I tore my ACL playing basketball and had to have surgery. It's a long recovery so I'm using the time to teach myself to play the piano." James does physical therapy at Athletico

here in Glenview: "Being sidelined is an opportunity to be humble – I have to wait to be told what I can and cannot do, I have to ask how long before things get better. I see people at rehabilitation in worse condition than I am, especially elderly people, and I realize God wanted me to receive graces from this experience." Yet, it is not the soccer that James missed most. "I couldn't stand or even sit for a long period of time because my leg was immobilized and in a lot of pain. So I missed the Easter liturgies, the most important celebrations of the ecclesiastical year, and that was a much greater pain for me."

Upon his return to the Josephinum, James will complete his studies in preparation for ordination to the priesthood. He will serve in a local parish on the weekends, and he and his fellow deacon will alternate planning seminary liturgies for an entire week. "My bishop [Christopher Kakooza] has opened three

new parishes since I left. He's not doing it for fun; he's doing it because there is a genuine need. The Church in Uganda is thriving and I hope it stays that way. I will probably also be in teaching ministry again. So if I am busy at seminary it is good preparation for being a priest at home."

Of the many gifts and challenges that are part of the priesthood, James already knows which priestly ministries draw him most. "I'm dying to hear Confession. That, and celebrating Mass are what makes a priest unique among the people of God. But I also have great care for visiting the sick and celebrating funeral Masses. I know the pain of losing a loved one because my father died 11 years ago; and I know that when someone has experienced loss and is grieving, you can't say, 'I don't have time.' Even if I am pulled out of bed, I will say 'I'm here.' Now, ask me to go to a meeting and I'll probably say I'm too busy. But my zeal is for these four ministries of priesthood: hearing Confession, celebrating the Mass, visiting the sick, and celebrating funeral Masses."

While here in America, James has come to enjoy a good Omaha steak and barbecue ribs; but his favorite Jackfruit, which is found all over Uganda, is hard to come by in the States. James' favorite saints are St. Therese of Lisieux whose Little Way has formed his spirituality; St. John Vianney whose availability to penitents is an inspiration for him; and St. Jude Thaddeus who has been a powerful intercessor for James. "On my diaconate ordination day this spring, I was the only candidate, so I got to plan the music for the Mass. I chose "Oh God Beyond All Praising" for post-communion because that song really touches me. It's my favorite."






