Dear Parishioners,

*"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord"*

We have the rare occurrence of the Feast of the Assumption on a Sunday. This weekend we have the privilege of honoring the Blessed Mother at all our liturgies. The opening line of this week's gospel is taken from Luke's version of the Magnificat, Mary's song of praise. These were the words she uttered upon her visit to her cousin

Elizabeth. Mary's Magnificat is one of the eight most ancient Christian hymns and the earliest Marian hymn.

This is one of the most recited verses. It is prayed every day by those who pray the Divine Office at evening time.

Whenever we pray, we proclaim the greatness of God. It is this awareness that opens us up to the reality that the power of God is majestic and life giving. While we focus on the ways that we are working to improve our spiritual life, the Magnificat reminds us that even more powerful are the ways that God is working in our lives. As Mary exclaims, "the Almighty has done great things for me!" Today let us pause and recall the great things God has done for us! Reflect today on your blessings, your joys, your gifts. We come to the Lord's table this weekend mindful of all that God has done and will continue to do for us. This gratitude embellishes the reality that eucharist means thanksgiving. This Magnificat invites me to consider yet another title for Mary, "Our Lady of Gratitude".

To make this Feast Day ever more special we will be dedicating our statue of the Blessed Mother in the Hellerman Garden. The image of the sculpture is one of most popular of the many images of Mary. Our statue is entitled, "Our Lady of Grace". With her arms open to the world, Mary has become the great vessel of God's grace, giving birth to Our Lord. As we seek her intercession, we can't help but be surrounded by grace.

The vision for the garden and the statue were part of our dream to mark the 100th Anniversary of OLPH with a generational gift. The garden and the statue of Our Blessed Mother will comfort and inspire generations of future parishioners of OLPH.

I am so grateful to **Louis and Myrna Hellerman** who have so generously provided for the Garden and to **John and Katie Nicolau, Greg and Jeanne Eisinger, Mike Monticello and Karin Ulstrup, Kevin and Irene Shaughnessy and Ed and Mary Kay Haben** who provided for the creation of this beautiful statue. Thank you!


The statue was carved in Italy with marble from the same quarry that Michelangelo and Bernini used. This marble is extremely durable to which anyone who has visited Rome can attest.

The statue was completed and shipped just days before the world closed down because of the pandemic. She may still have been in the sculptor's studio if she didn't make the voyage when she did.

Many of our centennial celebrations were canceled because of COVID. But through God's "grace" and Mary's intercession this garden and image of the Blessed Mother has consoled literally thousands of people during the long months of the shut down when people faithfully visited her every day to find strength. - Trail mix
- Peanut butter or cheese and crackers
- 100% juice in box or can
- Dried fruit
- Fruit cup or applesauce
- Plastic spoon and napkin



## *Did you know about:* **AMERICAN NUNS & SISTERS?**

**T**he tradition of women gathering into religious communities of prayer and devotion is as old as the Church itself, mentioned by Saint Paul in two of his letters. These communities were comprised of widows and professed virgins, whom Saint Athanasius called “spouses of Christ.” In the 3rd Century, the father of monasticism, Saint Pachomius, founded the first convent in the Egyptian desert for his sister and her religious community of widows and virgins. Saint Jerome was a great supporter of the Monastery of Paula in Bethlehem. Finally, in the 4th Century, no less than Saint Augustine wrote the first rule for women joined together in religious congregations. A woman living under vows in one of these communities was given the affectionate nickname *Nonna*, meaning ‘old, wise mother’ – a name still used in Mediterranean countries for ‘grandma.’

Over time, different communities of nuns developed diverse spiritualities and charisms, or missions. Many communities were founded to care for widows and orphans. These often began instructing women and girls in trades. In turn, they became teaching orders of sisters. Other communities cared for the physical needs of the poor; these evolved into nursing and hospital orders. And some communities of nuns have always been dedicated solely to prayer. These sisters withdraw entirely from the world and live in a secluded, or cloistered, community having only minimal contact with outsiders. They are contemplative nuns. No matter what the charism of the

community, religious sisters have produced countless saints over the centuries.

When the United States was still just a group of European colonies, the first nuns to arrive were a community of Ursuline Sisters who established a school in New Orleans in 1727. Still in existence today, Ursuline Academy is the oldest Catholic school in America. Today there are 50,000 nuns in the United States, representing 200 different orders. The following are the five largest communities, along with their histories and charisms.

**School Sisters of Notre Dame (SSND)** trace their origins to France in 1597, educating poor girls for free. In the 19th Century, Karolina Gerhardinger studied with the sisters to be a teacher. Karolina was a lay instructor in Bavaria until 1833, when with two companions, she took vows and established the Poor Teachers Sisters of Notre Dame. Moving into a disused convent, Karolina took the name Sister Maria Theresia of Jesus. In 1847, she and five other sisters left Bavaria for the United States, where they soon staffed three parishes in Baltimore, and built a school to teach German women and girls who had immigrated to America. Today the School Sisters of Notre Dame administer 12 high schools across the United States in addition to serving in many other service-related missions. In 1985, Saint John Paul II beatified Maria Theresia of Jesus.

**Religious Sisters of Mercy (RSM)** were founded by Catherine Elizabeth McAuley, a lay catechist who inherited a large estate from a Protestant woman for whom she had worked. In 1828, under the guidance of the Archbishop of Dublin, the Sisters of Mercy were established as an entirely new order of nuns, with both a contemplative identity and an active mission. In the ten years before Mother McAuley died in 1841, she established an additional

11 communities in Ireland and England. They taught poor girls for free, and wealthy girls for a contribution. The Sisters of Mercy were also called upon to take up nursing duties during epidemics and as military nurses.

In 1843, the first bishop of Western Pennsylvania, Michael O'Connor, recruited seven Sisters of Mercy from Ireland to serve in America, under the leadership of Sister Mary Frances Xavier Warde, who had been Mother McAuley's closest friend. She arrived in Chicago in 1846 and opened St. Francis Xavier Academy,

which would become St. Xavier University and Mother McAuley Liberal Arts High School. By 1920, there were 39 communities of Sisters of Mercy with their own schools, orphanages,

shelters, and hospitals. Today the Sisters of Mercy run 56 grade schools and high schools, as well as 19 colleges, and they have founded dozens of hospitals. In Chicago, besides St. Xavier's and Mother McAuley High School, Mercy Hospital and Misericordia are apostolates of the Sisters of Mercy.

**Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (IHM)** are an entirely American order, founded in Monroe, Michigan, when Fr. Louis Gillet asked Sister Theresa Maxis Duchemin to leave her religious community in Baltimore and come to Michigan to teach in 1845.

With two companions, she opened St. Mary Academy one year later, and established a new religious community dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The sisters started educational institutions in Detroit and throughout Pennsylvania. The IHM sisters now have 20 high schools and colleges in both the United States and South America.

**Sisters of Saint Joseph (SSJ)** were founded in the tradition of Ignatian Spirituality by Fr. Jean Pierre Medaille a Jesuit. In 1650, six women came together in LePuy, France, where some taught in schools, others nursed in hospitals, but all made ribbon and lace to support the community. They

## Did you know about: RELIGIOUS ORDERS?

The monastic tradition began in Christian Egypt in the 3rd Century, when men and women withdrew from the world by living in desert communities devoted to prayer, fasting, and study. Men living in a monastery were referred to as **monks**, from the Greek word μοναχός, meaning 'one who lives alone;' women were referred to as **nuns**. Saint Benedict and his sister Saint Scholastica introduced monastic communities of men and women into Europe, beginning in the 6th Century. Over time, these monasteries built schools to educate not just their own novices, but also lay children. These schools grew into the first colleges and universities in the world.

By the 13th Century, religious orders were being founded specifically to teach, or to aid the poor, or to serve a particular church. These were called **friars** or **canons regular** for men, and **sisters** for women. They took perpetual vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience, and they lived in community – a priory or convent – but they worked in the community as teachers, medical assistants, or running hospices and orphanages. There also came into being 'third orders;' these were laymen and laywomen who took temporary vows (which could be renewed annually) and who wore a habit, but who did not necessarily live in a communal house. These were called **tertiaries**.

Today, depending on the congregation, the terms monk, friar, and brother vary in meaning, as do the terms nun and sister. However, in general, consecrated women religious can be divided into contemplative orders and active orders. While all can be called nuns, the cloistered contemplative orders of women are properly considered nuns, as from ancient times. While all are addressed as "Sister," referring to 'sisters' in a broader sense means women who have taken vows and dedicated their lives to serving the Christian faithful in some active ministry as part of the community.

also taught poor women and girls to make ribbon and lace as a means of supporting their own families. In 1836, seven Sisters of Saint Joseph left France for St. Louis where they would teach deaf children. By 1860, the sisters had communities in Missouri, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Pennsylvania, New York, West Virginia, Minnesota, and Louisiana. Though they started in education, the Sisters of Saint Joseph became nurses during the Civil War. Today they are known for their advocacy against the death penalty in America and around the world, led by Sister Helen Prejean who wrote *Dead Man Walking*.

**Dominican Sisters – Order of Preachers (OP)** comprise 19 different congregations around the United States. The Dominican Sisters trace their foundation to Saint Dominic who established religious houses for women in 1206.

The first Dominican nuns were contemplatives who lived a cloistered life of prayer and study. Communities of Dominican tertiaries (third order) were lay women who lived in their own homes, but who gathered to pray and study at a particular church to which they were attached. Saint Catherine of Siena was a Dominican tertiary.

In the 17th Century, Dominican nuns began teaching and nursing in their communities, though still living in a convent. The largest community in the United States are the Dominican Sisters of Adrian, Michigan. Their original house, Holy Cross Convent, was founded in Regensburg, Bavaria, in 1233. They first came to New York in 1853 to teach the children of German Immigrants. In 1884, a group of sisters was dispatched to Adrian to establish a hospital for injured railroad workers.

The sisters expanded to apostolates in Illinois, New Mexico, California, Florida, and Nevada, and in 1944 Mother Gerald began sending Adrian Dominicans to missions overseas. Regina Dominican High School in Wilmette is one of the Adrian Dominicans' educational institutions.



## Helping our next generation of young Catholics and families

### Our Lady of Good Help – Champion, WI, USA

Lourdes, Fatima, Guadalupe and Champion, Wisconsin all are part of a select group of places worldwide where the Blessed Virgin Mary is believed to have appeared. She identified herself as “*The Queen of Heaven who prays for the conversion of sinners.*” She appeared in October 1859 to a Belgian immigrant woman, Adele Brise, on the grounds of the

Champion Shrine. Adele became a catechist and Mary’s words to Adele apply to us today.

***“Gather the children in this wild country to teach them what they needed to know for their salvation: teach them their catechism and how to approach the sacraments. That is what I wish you to do. Go and fear nothing, I will help you.” Our Lady of Good Help to Adele Brise, Catechist – Champion WI 1859.***

Each year we continue to seek catechists to teach our parish children. We need catechists to teach our children for three different sessions for grades 4-year old Preschool through 8th grades: Tuesdays at 4:30 and 6:30pm and Saturdays at 9:00am for 75-minute sessions.

We provide comprehensive catechist training and ongoing formation, tools, and resources for all catechists. Parents are committed to work with their children to complete the student weekly lessons and submit assessments on the RE website.

3) **NEW! RE Digital Ministry At-Home Family Catechesis Model** – Parents are committed to teach their children at home with the tools and support of the RE Program under the guidance of the Director of Religious Education, Margaret Waldron. This is basically an online RE class for families. Children learn the same weekly lessons as the in-person students.






