Dear Parishioners,

"Ephphatha! Be Opened!"

This weekend's gospel is one of just a few instances in the Gospels in which we hear Jesus speaking in his native Aramaic language. The word is recalled in the oldest of the Greek texts of the New Testament. Mark provides the definition of this word Ephphatha; "be opened".

Jesus opens the man's ears so he can hear the Word of God. In this miracle, Christ is foreshadowing His call for all of us to hear the Word and respond in faith. The Lord liberates him from the isolation of being deaf. In opening his ears, he can hear and be connected. Many people fear the loss of sight, but many psychologists suggest that deafness can be even more isolating. We can see what is going on, but we cannot hear. People who suffer from hearing loss work so hard to try and make words out, but can easily become exhausted and simply withdraw. Every week, when people who are hearing impaired, visit us here at OL, they marvel at how well they can hear, not realizing the Church is now equipped with hearing loop technology - thanks to our capital campaign, "To Teach Who Christ Is".



This weekend's Gospel miracle is much more profound than simply healing from deafness, but challenges us to reflect on what we are hearing and who is speaking. We all need to realize our yearning to be opened in way that we can hear the Word, be connected to others who believe, to proclaim the Kingdom of God that we are missioned to witness.

Our parish team has begun meeting in earnest with the other parish teams in the Renew My Church process. We have been reflecting on the ways we can begin to more effectively flourish as the Church in Glenview and Northbrook. We have been looking at the strengths and challenges each of our parishes are facing (OLPH, St. Catherine Laboure and the Catholic Community of Northbrook).

One of the key insights of this process is beginning to see our identity shifting from being a parishioner to a missionary disciple. This transition of how we see ourselves can transform how we participate in the life of the church that transcends parish boundaries.

As we move through this process, I hope to embrace this notion of "Ephphatha", I need to be opened to hear how the Word of God can influence my ministry as a priest and pastor. The Lord is calling all of us to be active participants, to be missionary disciples as we call others to belong.

One way of being called to a deeper sense of our discipleship is to participate in the Women's Christ Renews His Parish (CHRP) weekend. These weekend experiences really have an impact and have for many marked a turning point in their spiritual journey. The Women's weekend will take place, Oct. 16-17 at the Bellarmine Retreat House. There is information in the Bulletin.

The Men's weekend is set for Nov. 20-21.

Thank you for your cooperation as we continue to implement new COVID protocols considering the surging number of cases. Since the earliest days of reopening our greeter/ushers have been essential in keeping us safe. It is so important that the worship space is as safe as it can be. One of the most devoted to this ministry has been **Sandy Smith**. She has given hours and hours over the last year and a half protecting us and inviting us to worship. Sandy is relocating to Santa Rosa, California soon. We are really going to miss her, but we are so grateful for her generous and faithful spirit.

Best wishes to long-term parishioners, **Mike and Anne Schrauth** who are relocating to South Carolina. You have both supported OL in many ways. All the best, you always have a spiritual home here in Glenview!

BUILDING A NEW FUTURE FOR WORKING FAMILIES

Our worlds have been turned upside down in the last 20 months, as we have adapted how we worship, work, educate our children, grocery shop, and so much more. This has also been a time when many of us more fully realized the stark injustice of income inequality and its suffocating impact.

As a nation we recognize that we were kept safe and comfortable of workers, from healthcare, to first responders, to grocery workers, to farm workers. We have come to appreciate how essential their contribution is to our lives. Many of these workers suffered greatly and many are still suffering. Restaurant workers, hotel housekeepers, convention hall workers and so many more are still waiting to be recalled, and to experience economic recovery. This Labor Day lets honor all of these workers and re-commit ourselves to support them in securing their rights. Pope Francis got it right in a speech in June, when he challenged us, saying, “Let us look for solutions that will help us build a new future of work based on decent and dignified working conditions, originating in collective negotiation, and promoting the common good, a phrase that will make work an essential component of our care for society and Creation.”

Building this new future is underway in Illinois and in the United States. The Pro Act, which passed the U.S. House of Representatives and is now being considered in the U.S. Senate will recognize all workers for their God-given

inherent dignity and their right to organize. The “Protecting the Right to Organize Act”, the PRO-Act, would allow workers to more freely join a union without harassment, which is quite common now. The PRO-Act would close the income inequality gap, help secure safe workplaces, strengthen the middle class, stabilize communities, and put the U.S. on par with other industrialized countries. The Pro Act is the most significant worker empowerment legislation since the Great Depression.

Closer to home, Illinois voters will soon consider the Workers’ Rights Amendment. It would enshrine the rights of workers into the state constitution... giving workers in Illinois real protections.

Laws reflect our values. But, laws do not get passed by themselves. It requires a community, organized and appreciative of the value and dignity of workers and of work itself. It requires communities of faith, as Pope Francis urges, to get engaged and stand in solidarity with workers, with the labor movement.


Chicago is the hometown of the American Labor movement. And this year, the Chicago Federation of Labor celebrates its 125th anniversary... founded just five years after Pope Leo XIII’s Rerum Novarum. That spirit of social justice is woven throughout the 125 years the CFL has fought for working families. Fighting for laws and public policy that promote the dignity, value, and respect of workers.

It requires organizations like ARISE Chicago, which connects our broad interfaith network to working people. I am proud to serve on the Religious Advisory Board for ARISE/Chicago.

On this Labor Day, let us remember the words of Cardinal Mundelein who said of the Church of Chicago more than 100 years ago now: “our place is beside the worker”.



THE CANONIZATION PROCESS?

A saint is a person who led a life of heroic virtue, who served God in an extraordinary way, and whose soul is surely in heaven because he or she can intercede with God for the needs of the living. Saints may be venerated and petitioned, but they are not worshiped.

In the early Church, only those who gave their lives for the Faith were considered to be worthy of veneration as especially holy. The exception to giving reverence only to martyrs was, of course, Mary the mother of Jesus, Joseph his foster-father, and John the Evangelist who died of old age. However, by the 4th Century, the faithful began to recognize as uniquely holy those who sacrificed their entire lives to doing God's work on earth, but who were not killed *in odium fidei* – in hatred of the Faith. These men and women came to be called confessors, because they thoroughly announced the Faith through their living example. Thus, for most of the history of the Church there have been five categories of saint: apostle, evangelist, martyr, virgin, confessor.

In the first centuries of Christianity, most saints, both martyrs and confessors, were permitted to be venerated publicly only after their reputation for holiness had been widely affirmed, and their tombs had become places of prayer. The local bishop would then consider the man or woman worthy of veneration;

but the notion of a world-renown saint did not exist. Saints were local holy men and women. This, however, led to some popular figures being declared a saint, even though they did not lead a particularly holy life. Often a beloved king who died in battle was popularly declared a saint. In other instances, a legendary figure, who was a symbol of a certain virtue or who was a combination of several actual people, was locally acclaimed a saint even though such a person never existed. In the case of many people killed as a group during a persecution, they were all called saints simply because they were part of a mass execution, not because they had lived exemplary lives. By the time of Augustine of Hippo, there was a process by which the life of a proposed martyr or confessor was formally investigated before Church officials moved his or her relics to a church or built an altar over their grave.

Eventually, the popes began to assert that only they had the authority to permit an investigation that might lead to a person being declared a saint. This was to avoid unworthy individuals being venerated. Pope Alexander III first set down the official process of canonization in 1173, and Pope Urban VIII defined the formal procedure used in declaring sainthood in 1642. Finally, Pope John Paul II simplified some of the requirements in 1983.

Here is the current process as defined by Pope John Paul II:

1. A Catholic man or woman dies and, after a five year period, the bishop of the diocese in which he or she was born or died agrees to open a “cause” and begin the investigation into the person’s life. A biography is compiled by diocesan officials, relying on the person’s written work and the testimony of people who knew the deceased.


2. After the bishop reviews the biography, if he agrees to forward the cause to the Vatican, the person becomes known as “Servant of God.” The Congregation for the Causes of Saints assigns a postulator who conducts a more thorough investigation of the person’s life. Before 1983, a Promoter of the Faith, nicknamed the *advocatus diaboli* – the devil’s advocate – was appointed to argue against the person being named a saint, in order to insure the investigation was fair and impartial. The person’s body is also exhumed and examined to confirm, in the case of a martyr, the cause of death; to ascertain whether or not any improper worship of the deceased has occurred; to see whether the body is incorrupt, an automatic sign of holiness; and to determine whether the person was dead when buried (though this is no longer a significant concern). Relics are taken from the body, and the person is reinterred.

3. If the postulator finds that the person, while alive, possessed faith, hope, and charity, and exercised prudence, justice, temperance, and fortitude to a truly heroic degree, the Congregation for Saints recommends that the pope declare the person “Venerable.” Prayer cards can now be printed commemorating the person, and the faithful may pray for his or her intercession in granting a miracle, in order to establish that it is God’s will the Venerable should advance toward sainthood.

4. If the pope declares that the Venerable was killed in hatred of the Faith or undertaking an act of heroic charity, he or she is considered a martyr and is called “Blessed,” meaning that the person’s soul is assuredly in heaven. This is called beatification. If the Venerable is a confessor, a miracle attributed to his or her intercession is necessary to determine that the Venerable’s soul is assuredly in heaven. These miracles are usually spontaneous, instantaneous, complete, and enduring cures of a medical patient suffering from a grave disease or injury. Furthermore, physicians must be incapable of explaining the event by scientific means – hence it must be a miracle attributable to the Venerable’s intercession. He or she is then beatified and called Blessed. Churches may be dedicated to the Blessed and a day of commemoration is assigned to the Blessed.

5. For both Blessed martyrs and Blessed confessors to be named Saints, a further miracle is necessary. All biographical materials, virtues of life, circumstances of death, and attribution of miracles are reviewed by the cardinals who are members of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. They vote whether to advance the cause of a Blessed to the pope who then will canonize a person a Saint of the Catholic Church in a formal ceremony. The Saint is said to be “raised to the full honors of the altar.”

The next seven Saints who will be canonized by Pope Francis:



Charles Foucauld

Blessed Charles de Foucauld was a French Trappist priest who worked with the poor in Algeria, and who was killed in 1916.

Blessed Devasahayam (Lazarus) Pillai is the first Indian layman to be canonized. He was a high-ranking military commander of the Hindu king who converted to Catholicism in 1745.

His faith led his wife, family, and many others to convert, for which he was martyred in 1752.

Blessed César de Bus was a French priest who founded a religious congregation of teachers and died in 1607.

Blessed Luigi Maria Palazzolo was an Italian priest who founded the Sisters of the Poor, six of whom are also proposed for canonization because they died working with victims of the Ebola virus in the Congo in 1995.



Sisters of the Poor (Annalvira and Floralba) who died working for victims of Ebola and whose cause of canonization is in process; their founder will be named a saint this year.

Blessed Giustino Maria Russolillo was an Italian priest who founded a religious community devoted to fostering vocations to the priesthood and religious life. He died in 1955.

Blessed Anna Maria Rubatto was an Italian Franciscan nun who founded a community of missionaries, and who died in Uruguay in 1904.

Blessed Maria Domenica Mantovani was an Italian nun who founded the Sisters of the Holy Family to care for the poor, the sick, and the elderly. She died in 1934.

- 1) Children need to learn, based on Catholic teaching: who God is, why God became a human and died on the Cross for us, and how God wants us to live (in service) to make God's "kingdom come and will be done on earth as it is in heaven."
- 2) Children need an adult to teach them how to talk to/pray to God, and how to listen and act on what God says to them.
- 3) Children need an adult to explain how the Church's teachings and practices help Catholics to understand why and how to worship/serve God.
- 4) If there are too few adults willing to teach children in smaller groups about their Faith, children likely will perceive that having a relationship with God is optional or unimportant, leading them to reject through indifference a relationship with God strengthened through participation in the Church.
- 5) Many children are willing to learn about their Catholic faith through participation in class.


Zoe Sundstrom – Catechist for 4th Grade and Youth Ministry Assistant






