Dear Parishioners,

On this 20th Anniversary of the September 11th attacks, I recall the words of **Pope Francis** when he visited the Ground Zero Memorial in New York, five years ago:

O God of love, compassion, and healing, we ask you in your goodness to give eternal light and peace to all who died here.

The heroic first responders: our fire fighters, police officers, emergency service workers, and Port Authority personnel, along with all the innocent men and women who were victims of this tragedy simply because their work or service brought them here on September 11, 2001.

We are mindful of those who suffered death, injury, and loss on that same day at the Pentagon and in Shanksville, Pennsylvania.

God of peace, bring your peace to our violent world.

This was one of the most traumatic days in the lives of anyone who was living at that time. We all know where we were at when the news first broke. We all know that immense sense of fear when it became clear this was not an accident and that our nation was under attack.

September 11th and its aftermath resulted in tremendous changes to our sense of wellbeing. We had to make significant changes to our daily lives and for months lived with the anxiety that another attack was imminent.

Over the years much has changed. This anniversary must challenge us in our resolve to be peacemakers. We need to better understand the root causes of this kind of violence; fanatical ideologies, authoritarianism, chronic poverty, persecution and hopelessness. The rage that engulfs the hearts of many must be released to the healing and hopefulness that lies at the center of our Christian witness.

On September 11, 2001, I was attending a class with a professor at the Gregorian University in Rome when we heard the news during a coffee break. As we watched in horror as the second tower of the World Trade Center collapsed, we felt this profound sense of loss for a country, I was with a priest from New York City who was trembling. His parish was just blocks away from it all.

The following week we were visiting the ancient ruins of the Roman Forum. This was the epicenter of the Roman Empire. When it was built, the Romans assumed it would last forever. Well, it didn't. This anniversary challenges us to embrace those things that endure and to let go of the things that won't. Faith without works is useless as the Letter from St. James instructs us this weekend. We must work for justice; we must be engaged in the works of peace and reconciliation.

Our world is still broken by poverty, violence and indifference. May this anniversary bring new energy to dispelling the forces of evil.

I draw special attention to the US Military Prayer List that each weekend reminds of those parishioners and family members who serve in the military. May they be kept from harm's way.

This Saturday is the Men's Club Block Party which begins with Mass on the rectory lawn. For all intents and purposes this is the unofficial beginning of the new program year. School is several weeks going and Religious Education begins in a few weeks. The upcoming CHRP weekends always renew us. Scripture Study and a host of other programs are about to begin. "We are Back!" So much of parish life has been impacted by COVID but gradually we are moving forward. I can't tell you how thrilled I am to see meeting rooms in use, people coming together and the pastoral life of our parish emerging. Both the Men's Club and the Women's Club have great plans.



Thank you for your patience and resilience as we continue to combat the COVID virus.

Special thanks to **Regina Kilroy** and all those involved in our Knit for Life ministry. During the quarantine, they were busy. They have knitted hundreds of hats and other items that will be deeply appreciated by people enduring the impending cold weather.

Congratulations to our former associate pastor, **Fr. Nick Kostyk**. He has been formally received into the Ukrainian Catholic Church and the Eparchy of St. Nicholas. He has been assigned to a parish in Tucson and will eventually begin advanced studies for a doctorate. We are so proud of Fr. Nick; he will be a great blessing to the Ukrainian Church.


Book Club is Back!

Food Donations

Did you know about:

OLPH'S RELATIONSHIPS WITH TECHNY, LOYOLA ACADEMY, AND NOTRE DAME H. S.?

The priests who serve Our Lady of Perpetual Parish full time, and who live in the rectory, are priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. They are called either diocesan priests or secular priests because they live in the world (Latin: saeculum – of the world). However, over the years, the parish has also been assisted, especially at Sunday Mass, by priests who are members of religious congregations. These are called regular clergy, because they live according to communal vows (Latin: regula – rule). Most regular clergy who have served at Our Lady of Perpetual Help have come from Techny, Loyola Academy, or Notre Dame High School.

Techny

The Society of the Divine Word (Latin: Societas Verbi Divini, SVD) is a missionary order that established its North American provincial headquarters next to the area that would become Glenview, in 1896. The Divine Word Missionaries were founded

by Saint Arnold Janssen in the Netherlands in 1875. Janssen was a secular priest who sent his first German missionaries to China in 1882, and soon thereafter, to West Africa and the islands of New Guinea in the Pacific.

Realizing that the Midwestern United States was home to many German Catholic immigrants, Janssen purchased land north of Chicago and built St. Joseph's Technical School – hence, the nickname "Techny." By 1909, Techny was home to St. Mary's Mission Seminary, the first college and seminary in the world to train priests and brothers specifically for international missionary work. Today, the Divine Word Missionaries, who are particularly devoted to Bible education, have missions in 70 countries around the world. There are 4,150 SVD priests, and 6,016 SVD brothers. The Divine Word Missionaries are the largest missionary congregation in the Catholic Church and they are one of the orders that is growing in numbers every year.

The Divine Word Missionaries have two affiliated women's congregations, also founded by Saint Arnold. The Missionary Sisters Servants of the Holy Spirit work in education and health care, and the Sister Servants of the Holy Spirit of Perpetual Adoration are cloistered nuns who live a life devoted exclusively to prayer. They Missionary Sisters are called the "Blue Nuns" and the Adoration Sisters are called the "Pink Nuns."

The Divine Word Missionaries train young men for the priesthood at Divine Word College in Epworth, Iowa, and at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago. The SVD priests and brothers retire to Techny after their years of service in the foreign missions have been completed.

Loyola Academy

The Society of Jesus was founded by Saint Ignatius Loyola in 1540, and is today the largest religious order of men in the world, with 11,049 priests and 15,306 brothers. They are known as the Jesuits.

In 1857, Fr. Arnold Damen, S.J., (also a Dutchman like Saint Arnold Janssen) founded Holy Family Church in Chicago for the growing immigrant population of Catholics. In 1869, he founded St. Ignatius College next to Holy Family. When the Great Fire ravaged Chicago in 1871, Holy Family and St. Ignatius College were some of the few buildings to survive unburned. Damen credited his and the parishioners' prayers to Our Lady of Perpetual Help for saving his church and school. To this day, seven candles burn in front of a statue to Our Lady in Holy Family Church, fulfilling a promise Damen made. Fr. Jerry Boland was one of Fr. Damen's successors as administrator of Holy Family.

St. Ignatius College became Loyola University, and in 1909 the Jesuits opened Loyola Academy as a secondary school in conjunction with the university. The academy remained on the Lake Shore campus of the university until it needed larger facilities for its growing student body; accordingly, Loyola Academy moved to Wilmette in 1957.

Loyola brought nearly 50 Jesuit priests to the North Shore, and these priests eagerly assisted at many area parishes. Because Our Lady of Perpetual Help was one of the largest, and had the largest school, the Jesuits made sure to support the parish since it sent so many young men to Loyola Academy. Fr. Patrick McGrath, SJ, the current president of Loyola, has assisted at Sunday Mass throughout his tenure at the academy. Fr. John Flavin served on Loyola's Board of Trustees while he was pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

Notre Dame High School

Founded in 1955 by the Congregation of Holy Cross, Notre Dame was the only high school staffed by the Holy Cross Priests, not the Holy Cross Brothers who have 15 high schools across the country. The Congregation of Holy Cross (Latin: Congregatio a Sancta Cruce, CSC) was established by Blessed Basil Moreau in France in 1837. Five years later, Fr. Edward Sorin, CSC, founded the University of Notre Dame in northern Indiana.

Notre Dame High School was staffed by Holy Cross Priests who regularly served at Our Lady of Perpetual Help until 2007, when the Congregation turned over administration of Notre Dame to a board of lay people. It is now known as Notre Dame College Prep.



Community Announcements

USCCB Department of Migration and Refugee Services

On behalf of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Department of Migration and Refugee Services (USCCB/MRS), I am writing to you with a very time sensitive request. Tens of thousands of Afghan allies are being evacuated to the United States where they will have the opportunity to start a new life, contribute to their local communities, and raise families in a safe environment. USCCB/MRS is closely involved with the reception and welcome of Afghans who are being evacuated from Afghanistan. They are being sent to one of several army bases around the country for processing, before they are sent to resettlement sites that will help to establish them in local communities. The initial reception is a significant operation that requires robust staffing that exceeds the internal capacity of USCCB/MRS.

I am writing to ask if you would look into your heart and consider whether you are in a position to deploy to one of the military bases in the United States currently being used as an intermediary stop for processing and orientation before Afghan families/individuals continue to their final destinations. Your time commitment would be an invaluable contribution to the welcome of these populations. Rest assured that reasonable expenses will be reimbursed, including air/ground transportation and for the cost of lodging and meals at the per-diem rate for that location. NOTE: You must be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 to participate.

At this time, USCCB/MRS is unable to provide a timeline for the total possible duration of this deployment, though availability for at least two weeks is preferred. We are also unable to convey at this time the military base where your help will be needed most; those details would be provided in a later communication based on your responses to the form linked below.

If you are unable to travel but are still willing to assist or your ability to travel is limited, please convey that in the form linked below.
