Thoughts on the Sunday Scriptures

FAMILIAR INSIGHTS

Spiritual teachers tend to repeat themselves, and to repeat other teachers. Maybe there really aren't that many different truths to tell. Maybe people just need to hear the basics over and over. Consider today's readings.

People complain God isn't "fair," and Ezekiel answers that God is more than fair. People choose their own fates, and people can change. Even evildoers can turn, do right, and live. "Actions speak louder than words." A fresh new insight? Hardly.

Paul tells the Philippians that he would truly be encouraged if those who claimed to be believers would, in fact, look to others' interests and not their own. "The proof of the pudding is in the eating." A novel idea? I don't think so.

In Jesus' story of the farmer and his sons, everyone knows that the one who said he wouldn't work—but did—is way ahead of the one who said he would work—but didn't. "Talk is cheap." Heard that before?

Dear Parishioners,

"Do nothing out of selfishness...."

St. Paul's challenge this weekend is one well worth reflecting on.

As we continue our journey through these unprecedented days, I have found myself reflecting on those who are managing well and those who are struggling.

We all have our comfort zones of coping with the reality of Covid. We have all had to deal with significant changes to our routines, our freedoms, our sense of wellbeing.

A fundamental principle of so many of the sciences is that survival and the possibility to thrive rests on the ability to adapt. From biology to medicine, from sociology to psychology the ever-present challenge is the ability to adapt. We have had to face many adaptations.

I marvel at seeing how well children adapt to the circumstances they face. The children in our school have inspired me by their willingness to adapt to so many changes. There is no such thing right now as a typical day. Everything must be evaluated from the perspective of mitigating Covid.

In order to successively adapt it seems to me we must rid ourselves of selfishness as St. Paul instructs. The challenge these days might be summed up in the phrase, "we are all in this together!" Many of the adaptations we must accept can be more easily received if we see them from the perspective of how does this help "us" rather than "me".

I am so grateful for the ways you are dealing with the adaptations we have had to make here at OLPH. Every aspect of parish life has had to adapt. We have had to adapt in ways that would have been unimaginable 6 months ago. If you would have told me last March that OLPH will have a "drive in" Mass that would be the cause célèbre of the North Shore, I wouldn't know what you were talking about.

We are exploring and investing in many new forms of technology so that our mission as parish can continue to flourish during the limitations on public gatherings. Scripture Study is using zoom so this semester can continue. What a time to be exploring the Book of Genesis! The Women's Club is putting the finishing touches on presenting the Holly Fair virtually. Our annual Summit will be zoomed this year. The digital resource Formed, will be an asset for many ministries like Religious Education that begins the year remotely. Taking advantage of our live streaming capabilities in the Church will be a way for many liturgical celebrations to reach a vast audience. Our daily Masses are viewed all over the world. We hope to develop our FM transmission capabilities to bring many folks together. This all demands an ability to adapt to the realities of the current moment.

Just a reminder that the Mass schedule will be changing next weekend. We are adding an 8:30 Mass on Saturday mornings and a 9:00 a.m. in the Church. Information on the changes are in this week's bulletin and on the website.

Thank you for your generous response to donate rosaries to Glenbrook Hospital. I was able to deliver several hundred rosaries that will keep them supplied for many months.

Special thanks to **Deacon Christopher** and **Kevin Dougherty** for the 10-day Retreat that recently completed. People loved it. You can still view it on our website. Thanks to everyone who shared their reflections and participated.

As the first quarter of the fiscal year ends, we have been taking a deep dive on the state of our financial health considering the pandemic. We have not been able to take up collections or conduct any of our fundraising. You have been so faithful and generous. We are about 22% behind our offertory budget. In the coming days you will be receiving a letter to encourage you to consider helping us "catch up" and "close the gap" regarding our much-needed income. In addition to a decrease in income we are approaching \$300,000 in expenses related to providing Covid safe infrastructure. I am so grateful for your consideration of this request.

Dear OLPH Parishioners;

May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

I am writing to inform you that this year's Jazzin' to Feed fundraiser has been cancelled. We had originally rescheduled Jazzin' to Feed from the spring to October in hopes that the restrictions of the pandemic would be eased enough to allow us to gather. Unfortunately, in order to keep everyone safe we will be unable to gather in person this year. Apart from this event being one of the spring highlights in the Bronzeville neighborhood, Jazzin' to Feed is the main fundraiser for our food pantry. We have relied on this event to raise much needed funds for over 15 years.

Despite the numerous challenges presented by the pandemic, I want to assure you that we are committed to keeping the food pantry open; **however, we need your help**. For nearly 50 years, St. James Food Pantry has been a beacon of hope for many struggling families, most especially, families and individuals living in near-by public housing and the elderly living in several of the Chicago Housing Authority Senior Buildings. Today the pantry is at the front line providing food to families in need and those impacted by the pandemic. All the pantry programs are running with the exception of the nutrition classes which have been postponed until further notice. We have made adjustments in the way we serve our clients to ensure the safety of our staff, volunteers and clients through social distancing. In addition, we expanded the food delivery program for seniors and people with disabilities to ensure that they have access to food during the pandemic. With God's grace, we haven't closed our doors since the onset of the pandemic. Saint James will continue to do this important work. I hope you will consider my plea for help.

Let me thank you in advance for your contribution which makes it possible for Saint James to care for the less fortunate. Here at St. James, feeding the hungry is our ordinary practice year in and year out. Your generosity makes it possible for us to bring the love of God into the lives of God's beloved children.

- **RE Hard Copy Materials pick up next week:** New RE Materials have arrived and will be distributed the week of Sept. 28. On Tuesday, I will contact families about pick up times. All children will also receive e-books in grades PK thru 6 and online materials for grades 7 and 8.
- **Eighth Graders:** Please start looking for your *Chosen* book from last year as you will need it again this year.
- **Needy Family Gift Cards needed.** Please consider donating gift cards for needy families and deliver when you pick up your RE materials.
- **Zoom RE Parent Information Meetings:** Beginning next week I will offer several RE Parent Information Meetings to explain the OLPH RE Program under my DRE leadership and remote learning environment. 




