Thoughts on the SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

In today's Gospel Jesus offers a warning about living selfishly in his parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus. The Rich Man holds sumptuous feasts and dresses in fine clothes. But despite his affluence he does nothing to relieve the painful hunger and debilitating condition of his neighbor Lazarus. He neglects to love his neighbor as he loves himself and is sent to hell for his lifestyle and desire for self-gratification.

The Rich Man represents those who spend their money on their own personal pleasures with no regard for sharing their material possessions with the poor and needy in their own neighborhood. Good stewards realize the practical implications of not only loving God, but loving their neighbor as they would love themselves.

Who are the less fortunate in our neighborhood? Do we share a portion of our own blessings with them?

"*Father Abraham have pity on me.*"

The plea of Lazarus in this weekend's gospel is profound. We yearn for the compassion and mercy of God. We all have our struggles, our poor choices. Amid it is a God who calls us to conversion, a change of heart and an openness to allow the spirit to renew us.

We struggle with the influence the negative culture we live in has on us. There is such anger that we all are influenced by. It is so much easier to condemn and judge than it is to work out and forgive. I often feel such sadness for people consumed with anger, that is revealed in their critical, mean, spiritedness. How much we need the redeeming love of Jesus Christ to bring us to a place of mercy and compassion.

I invite you to consider attending a Christ Renews His Parish weekend. The Women's weekend is on Oct 19 -20 and the Men's weekend is on Nov. 16-17. Both retreats are at the Bellarmine Retreat House in Barrington. These weekend experiences are transformative. Both **Archbishop Gregory** and **Cardinal Cupich** were so grateful for their participation in the Outdoor Mass and the Centennial Mass. We will soon be dedicating a portrait of our founding pastor, **Fr. Martin Schmidt** in the lobby of the Church along with our other former pastors. A long overdue gesture. The more I learn about him the more I admire his courage and perseverance during the time he was our pastor. He faced challenges I can't even imagine.

Special thanks to our two seminarians, **Michael Lingauer** and **Jesse Hiett** for the great job they did last weekend speaking at all the masses on the Tolton Teaching Program, from Mundelein Seminary.

I am overwhelmed by your generous support of "Catch up Sunday" to make up the revenue that we were lacking as a result of lower than anticipated summer collections. As you know with your own finances if you don't deal with deficits they quickly get out of control. We were \$109,000 behind as the end of the first quarter of the fiscal year approaches. It will be a couple more weeks before we know but at this point, we are very close to closing the gap! Your generosity and love of this parish is awesome. We are going to do it!

Congratulations to parishioner **Tom Schufreider** who has been named as the *Lee McDonnell Transform a Life Award* winner for St Joseph Services. He will receive this distinguished award on Saturday, November 9, at a benefit hosted by Bredemann Lexus at 2000 N Waukegan, Glenview. St. Joseph services uplift the youth and adults of Chicago neighborhoods affected by violence and poverty. It is a ministry of the Daughters of Charity. Tom was on the PPC when I was appointed and did so much to help me in the transition. I will always be grateful to him.

There isn't a day that goes by that I don't thank God for the efforts of our Sharing Room and the Sr. Paulanne Needy Family Fund. The process of receiving and delivering food, clothes, and essential products for people at risk, every week, is amazing. Hundreds of pounds of these goods get from the Sharing Room to the neighborhoods of Pilsen, Englewood, Dearborn Homes and South Shore. We also assist many other charities. I am deeply grateful to our Sharing Committee and the efforts of **Bill Lynch, Betty Collins and Lenore Pettinger, and**, early in the morning, the likes of **Ed Krupa and Bill Thome**. The list of dedicated volunteers is amazing. It is such a positive and uplifting place. If you would like to help, please call the parish office for contact info.

The Church continues to deal with the anguish that surrounds the sexual abuse of minors in our Church. This suffering has been compounded by the malfeasance of bishops and others in authority who failed in their responsibilities. A few months ago, **Bishop Barron**, an auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and former priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago has written a book entitled, "Letter to a Suffering Church." **Mary Jane Keller** organized an effort with her Scripture Study group to obtain several copies of these books that will be available at the exits of the Church. Please take a copy home for your reflection. If we need more copies, we will get them! The book is honest, comforting and challenging as we move to a better place.



Johannes Brahms' Personal Journey for Meaning: The German Requiem

Saturday Oct.5, 9:30 am, McDonnell Hall

Robert Schumann called him: "the inheritor of Beethoven". An introvert in the age of extroverts, Brahms lived with Schumann and his wife Clara. He considered Schumann his mentor and Schumann's death at an early age, after being institutionalized for a mental disorder, greatly affected him.

Though he considered himself an atheist, Brahms set upon a path searching for "meaning" in life. Surprisingly, he began reading his mother's Bible. The verses which he read began to offer him consolation; as he spent time contemplating these passages in Scripture, his spirituality deepened. This was a spiritual journey of several years of inner transformation and increasing solace.

Greg Athnos is an Emeritus Professor of Music at North Park University. He has an extensive background as director of choral organizations and as conductor of University Orchestra and Choir. He has traveled internationally as a lecturer in music and theology and has published books on the Art of the Catacombs. His schedule is filled with lectures and seminars offered to Elderhostel/Road Scholar programs, museums, retirement communities and churches.

His lectures typically include slides and taped music samplings to enhance the experience. Besides the stirring music, Professor Athnos will provide the historical context of the society of the time that shaped and influenced the composer. He will explore the intriguing backstory of this spiritual journey that unfolds in parallel to the musical expression of this conversion. The result: a moving expression of music as prayer. We will also include some discussion of his towering symphonies and his last songs.





If I were an artist by Fr. Paddy

Last Friday, I paid a visit to some of our young people who are now in college in Madison. After visiting with them, I spent some time praying in the adoration chapel of a local church. It is always a great and peaceful experience for me but this time I was distracted by a man who was in the front seat. When he was leaving, he backed out, as if he was afraid to turn his back on Jesus. When he got as far as me, he prostrated completely on the floor for a minute, and then left.

That experience as well as the two paintings on the walls, of private revelations, one of Jesus and one of Mary, forced me to think of private revelations. I wondered if private revelations of 17th or 18th century nuns in Europe, deprive us of valuing our own religious experiences. My own dominant religious experience for the past year has been of a little 15-year girl in Nazareth saying "yes" to an invitation from God to be central in God's plan for our world with all its horror and sinfulness. My experience is of this 15-year-old holding out her hand to me, and strongly inviting me to be with her in bringing the love of God to our world. This young woman is pure love, with no admixture of selfishness or sin, and she is asking me to be with her in bringing God's loving plan to completion in the world.

How I would love to paint a picture of this 15-year-old holding an 86-year-old man by the hand, with the most powerful invitation any human being can experience, of daily growing in love so that he can bring this overwhelming love of God to all he meets.

OLPH Book Club

At our last meeting on Richard Rohr's book, *The Universal Christ*, some powerful discussion took place. The book was a real eye-opener, which most participants considered to be truly mind-blowing. It raised the ordinary Christian consciousness to a new dimension, and at least opened up new possibilities in our understanding of God's dealings with the human race.

Our next book is a novel many of you will have read. It is James Michener's book "The Source". Like "Hawaii" and many of his other novels he uses history as the backdrop for his novel. In this case it is the history of Israel. Like most of his novels this is a very long read, so for our next meeting on October 14 we will read the first half of the book, up to Level VII, p.451.
