Dear Parishioners,

"If we love one another, God remains in us."

It is clear from the scriptures this weekend that we are to live in relationships. Our relationships need to be rooted in the power of God's love for us and to be reflected in how we love one another.

Often, biblical mandates to love one another can be reduced to theoretical niceties. The

truth though is that the mandate to love one another is a real challenge and an invitation we encounter every day.

The relationship of marriage is presented as a prototype of the way God loves us and as to how we should love one another. The image of marriage has been used as a way of describing God's relationship to the Church.

We encounter the realities of brokenness and heart break often. Most of us have had to deal with the cruelty and unfaithfulness we as humans can inflict on one another.

The scriptures call us to rise above the evil and selfishness that can erode our relationships. We see in the first reading, that from creation we are of the one flesh and we are called to unity.

The love that God calls us to is a love that is life giving, merciful, generous and faith filled. We need to take stock from time to time to praise God for the relationships in our lives that we

treasure and to assess what relationships need healing.

Covid continues to take its toll on parish life. Considering concerns about safety protocols it has been decided that we need to postpone the upcoming Christ Renews His Parish (CHRP) Weekends. The process of those weekends is difficult to follow considering restrictions. We will regroup in terms of next year.






Book Club is Back!



Did you know about:

SAINT MARY OF THE LAKE (PART 1)

George William Mundelein was never supposed to be the Archbishop of Chicago. He was scheduled to be the bishop of Buffalo, New York. But at the beginning of the First World War, it was a better idea not to send a man with a German name to a town that bordered the British Empire in Canada. Mundelein was instead assigned to Chicago, something of an outpost at the time, but a growing outpost. Archbishop Mundelein proved to be an extraordinarily successful builder of parishes and much-needed facilities across the archdiocese. He was also a persuasive preacher who came to count President Franklin Roosevelt as a friend, and Adolf Hitler as an enemy.

With a rapidly growing population of Catholic immigrants in Chicago, Mundelein needed to find a place to train priests – and lots of them. He bought a section of Lake County called Area, Illinois. It was centered on Mud Lake. Then Mundelein threw all of his efforts into building the best seminary in America.

At that time, undergraduate and graduate seminary studies were held at the same institution. So Mundelein needed two buildings to house both sets of students, in addition to classroom buildings for all of them. Since Lake County was

more than one train ride from Chicago in the 1920s, Mundelein had to build a residence for all the priest-professors. Of course, no seminary is complete without a chapel and a library, and those were included. Finally, since Chicago's seminary was to be the finest in the country, he wanted to add a gymnasium and a theater. This was a tall bill.

Yet, nothing was impossible for George Mundelein. In a very short period of time, he had the resources and the plans to build his seminary: Saint Mary of the Lake, named after its closed predecessor on the shores of Lake Michigan in the city. Since all the buildings were to be constructed at once, the only question was what style of architecture would be chosen. For Mundelein, whose own career as a bishop was significantly altered by anti-German sentiment, and whose seminarians were largely the sons of Irish,

Italian, Polish, Lithuanian, and German immigrants, there was no doubt about what his seminary would look like. He would build a small city devoted to priests, which resembled a replica of an old colonial town in Connecticut, with every building constructed of red brick and limestone highlights. Mundelein often called himself, “An American for Americans.” His seminary is the epitome of that sentiment.

By 1926, Saint Mary of the Lake was the crown jewel of American seminaries. It was the newest educational institution, with the best accommodations for students, and it was set on a picturesque lake surrounded by century-old trees. George Mundelein had been created a cardinal two years before in recognition of his work in Chicago and of his work for the missions throughout the world. Mundelein was called “The First Cardinal of the West.” In gratitude for his elevation to Cardinal, Mundelein hosted the 1926 Eucharistic Congress.

The Congress was an historic event, including a Mass for more than 400,000 in old Soldier Field. The final gathering of the Congress was held at Saint Mary of the Lake, where Cardinal Mundelein had asked for a benediction loggia to be built out into the lake. From there, the crowd could receive the blessing at a great distance. The numbers who attended the final day of the Congress at Saint Mary of the Lake are extraordinary: 18,000 cars managed the trip; 820 trains took to the rails (which Mundelein had built for this very purpose); and 12,000 people on foot were waiting at the front gate to be admitted early in the morning.

Today, the University of Saint Mary of the Lake remains; but the portion where priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago prepare for ordination is now called Mundelein Seminary. In fact, as an act of thanks for all of his efforts to (quite literally) put the town on the map, Area is now called Mundelein, Illinois.

All four of our priests here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help studied at Mundelein Seminary. It has often been called ‘The Enchanted Forest’ because of its beautiful natural surroundings. At the same time, ‘Mundelein’ is synonymous with the profound priestly formation that each man receives and the fraternal friendships he builds.

Here are a couple of reflections from Fr. Patrick and Fr. Larry about their favorites memories of their time at Mundelein.

Fr. Patrick Kizza: “It was so peaceful and at the same time wonderful to walk in the woods and around the lake, praying the Rosary or just having time to yourself. You would see other students doing the same thing. And it was like working out – taking a walk – and praying at the same time. We were always silent, and we only waved to each other. But we knew we were praying, and it was a beautiful place to pray.”

Fr. Larry Basbas: “It was the time when my 3rd Theology class and I boarded a big, fancy bus headed for O'Hare Airport. Our destination: The Holy Land! I couldn't believe that I was finally on that bus! My best friend Danny and I kept a tradition – from the time we started seminary in 2014 – of bidding ‘bon voyage’ to the 3rd-Year class. Sometimes he and I would brave the bitter cold of January just to wave goodbye to our 3rd year brothers as they headed for the airport on the same bus in the wee hours of the morning. Danny and I would always turn to each other and say, “One day, that will be us.” My study pilgrimage to the Holy Land thus far has been the best trip of my life! We stayed in Palestine, Galilee, and Jerusalem.”

My favorite image of heaven is a party -- a joyful, glorious banquet – to see God, face to face, all the angels and saints, and reunions with family and friends. One of our catechists described the experience of our first day of in-person OLPH RE classes to be, “like a birthday party,” and I understood her comparison. It was a joyful event and I loved hearing all the children’s voices and witnessing their light-hearted actions.

Our OLPH Religious Education Program began its first classes on Tue., Sept. 21. It was the first time that we have had RE in-person programming since March 2020, and the first time I have met many of the children and families in the RE Program. It was a joyful, lively event as the children and families arrived on site, lined up to pick up RE materials and new backpacks, found their catechist, and headed off to their classrooms. At the end of the evening when the 4:30pm and 6:30pm classes concluded, the RE office looked like it had hosted a birthday party! It was so wonderful to see and hear all the children this day!

Thank you to all the parishioners, who responded to my continued cry for more catechists! We are all set. Currently, we have 35 catechists and 470 children enrolled in the OLPH RE Program this year across three learning models: in-person classes with a catechist, once-monthly family catechesis, and RE digital ministry at home family catechesis. All children will work on the same weekly lessons no matter what learning model that they are enrolled in.

I have received remarkable, but not surprising, feedback from the RE families, who participated in teaching their children our faith at home last year by utilizing the materials

that the parish provides to families. There is a reason why Catholic families are called the “domestic church” the “church at home.” The parish supports our families with many tools, resources, and opportunities to learn and experience what it means to learn and live out our faith, to be Catholic, and to teach our children to do the same. One of my catechists from my previous parish shared with me recently, “Margaret, the Catholic Church has everything we need to teach our children to become saints; nothing is lacking”! And I wholeheartedly agreed with him.

Annual RE Parent Informational Meetings will be held in McDonnell Hall on Mon., Oct. 4 and Mon., Oct. 11 from 7:00pm to 8:00pm. Please mark your calendar and come join us. I will provide an overview of the RE program for the entire year, explain the many changes that will take place from previous RE programming, and answer any questions or concerns.

Please note that I have reduced all in-person class sessions to 75 minutes, no longer 90 minutes. We will not offer a Pet Blessing in between classes on a Tuesday. Instead, we invite you to participate in the Parish Pet Blessing on Sun., Oct. 3 at 2pm, on the front lawn of the Rectory. We will invite you to participate in many parish events instead of offering our own events through the RE Program. This will give you and your family the opportunity to develop new practices with our faith and how we teach our children to learn, love and live our Catholic faith; and therefore, strengthen and develop your family’s relationship with God. Thank you for participating in the OLPH RE Program!

Drive-In Mass Update: Safety Issues **IMPORTANT!**

In early Spring, we improved the flow of our Drive-In Mass and changed the way we deliver communion. Instead of having priests and Eucharistic Ministers walk to each car to give the eucharist to parishioners, we have instead been giving communion to cars as they leave the parking lot.

This has led to a potentially dangerous situation. When there are priests/ministers on both sides of the car, drivers tend to drive away as soon as they receive communion, forgetting that on the passenger side, there may be a priest/minister who is still in the process of giving out the eucharist to the rest of the people in the car.

This has almost resulted in having our priests dragged along and almost run over.

To all drivers, please:

- 1) Be mindful of priests/ministers on both sides of the car.
- 2) Put the car in PARK while receiving communion.
- 3) Check to make sure everyone in the car has finished receiving communion and be especially aware of anyone receiving communion in the back seat.
- 4) Look and see that the priest/minister has stepped back and away from your car before putting your car back in gear.
- 5) Only then, proceed forward and exit the parking lot.

We are always trying to create the best experience possible for parishioners attending our Drive-In Mass and all of our liturgies. Safety is the first and most important priority for everything we do. Adhering to strict safety measures makes everything we do possible.

Thank you for helping to ensure the safety of our priests, staff, and volunteers.

Make sure to register for the Drive-In Mass on Sign-Up Genius and tune your radio to 95.7 FM.

PLEASE NOTE: Fr. Jerry's 40th Anniversary Celebration Mass will be in the church. **There will not be a Drive-In Mass on October 9.**
