Dear Parishioners,

This week, we celebrated the life of our Director of Religious Education, **Cherie DiCesare**. For many years Cherie has led our religious education program. At about 900 students, she oversaw one of the largest programs in the Archdiocese.

Cherie was much more than the Director, she was the wife of her husband **Joe** and the devoted mother of **Sara, Maggie and Caroline**. Her family was the center of her life. We saw these girls grow up in our midst and the loving circle that Cherie surrounded them with. Our hearts go out to them at this time of loss. Cherie valiantly fought cancer over the past several months. She fought to the very end and her courage inspired us all.

A hallmark of her ministry was hospitality. She went to great lengths to create an environment of welcome. She transformed our new religious education center into a place of warmth and friendliness. Given the fact that our religious education students come from many schools, she wanted them and their parents to feel that they were treasured and cherished members of our faith community here at OL. She cultivated a devoted team of over 80 catechists, many who have served the whole time she led the program.

A great sign of her leadership has been the extraordinary way the Religious Education Board and the catechists launched this year's program as Cherie confronted her illness.

Cherie was a lot of fun. Nobody celebrated Halloween with more energy than her. The Christmas pageant in the Playdium on Christmas Eve was joyous. Her family-based program that she developed was treasured by those who participated. Each year, the outdoor Stations of the Cross were deeply moving. She helped to cultivate a great devotion to the Blessed Mother with the students.

Cherie leaves a great legacy here at OLPH. As a staff member and a parishioner, we were so blessed. May she rest in the arms of the Lord who she so faithfully served.

We were also saddened this week to learn of the death of **Maria Schoon** from complications from heart surgery. Maria was one of our beloved lectors and so involved in our parish. Please pray for her husband **Roy** and their daughter.

Each October the Archdiocese asks us to conduct a count of parishioners attending weekend masses. You will be noticing the ushers/greeters counting heads during the masses throughout the month. These numbers give us a sense of the percentage of parishioners who attend weekend masses and on a macro level a sense of the larger diocese.

Last year approximately 20% of Chicago area Catholics attended mass during the 2018 October count. The overall count at parishes decreased by -4.2%. Our parish along with 337 out of 347 parishes experienced a slight decrease from the previous year.

It is important that we continue to reach out and be a faith community that is welcoming, and spirit filled. We have a great tradition of liturgy here at OL and we must continue in this direction. Vital parishes celebrate vital liturgies. There are many challenges trying to meet the spiritual needs of a large diverse congregation such as ours. We must face the secularization of our culture and the detachment many feel from communities of faith. This past year the Church dealt with the ongoing tragedy of the sexual abuse of minors and the malfeasance of many bishops.

Each weekend as I look out at the congregation from my perspective as a presider, I am often overwhelmed with a sense of how blessed I am to be part of this parish. I see the commitment you make to your faith and to the support of our mission. This centennial year is a compelling case statement to the fact that parishes matter and worship of the Lord is essential to a life-giving spiritual life. The events surrounding the celebration of Cherie's life were a profound validation of the difference one person can make in a community and the power of a faith community gathered in prayer.


OLPH SPRED FALL INCLUSION MASS

Youth Ministry

A Dynamic Experience of Faith for Young People

One of the most frequent statements by young people about Mass or Religious Experience is "BORING". Of course we can argue that church is not meant to entertain. Often though there is a lack of understanding of the Sacrament and the relationship between Church or Mass and living out our faith. All too often, our young people think of faith as something for adults.

A recent study by the Catholic based Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) has found that 13 is the average age that Catholics become unbelievers or no longer find organized religion important or valuable. For some it is the incongruence between science and religion. For others being Catholic, going to Mass and Religious Education doesn't relate to their life.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is sponsoring a day-long experience for 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th grade students on Saturday, October 19. Last year over 9,000 attended and the Spirit was obviously present. Participants had fun! There was lots of music, dancing, faith sharing, the Sacrament of Reconciliation for those who wanted, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and a special Mass celebrated by Cardinal Cupich. The event is entitled "Holy Fire" reminiscent of the Holy Spirit and Pentecost.

Participants are touched by the realization that they are part of a much bigger Church and being Catholic is something they share with many others. They are challenged during the event to make their Catholic faith a part of their daily lives, helping them to grow in that faith and with Prayer and Service to deepen their relationship with God, with Jesus, and with the Church.

OLPH Youth Ministry is taking a bus to the event at the University of Illinois Chicago Pavilion on **Saturday, October 19**, leaving at 8 am and returning at 4:00 pm. Holy Fire is a particularly awesome experience for those preparing for Confirmation.
