Dear Parishioners,

In the Gospel today, we hear about Jesus healing a blind man named Bartimaeus. When Bartimaeus is calling out to Jesus for help, he says, "Son of David, have pity on me!" In Greek, that's "eleison me, eleison me!" Actually, at the beginning of Mass, we say the same thing: "Kyrie eleison. Christe eleison. Kyrie eleison." Essentially, it could be translated, "Lord, have

pity on me. Christ, have pity on me. Lord, have pity on me," – just like the blind man! At the beginning of every Mass, we're putting our lives into context. We're putting ourselves ritually in the position of Bartimaeus in that we realize that we are helpless before God, and we need His help. Actually, that's the virtue of Bartimaeus in the Gospel – he knows that he's helpless, and that he can't fix his own problems, and so he calls out to Christ to save him. Whom do you always call when you have any problem?

I'm sure that there are a lot of people in our OLPH parish who have found themselves in the same situation. There are people who are overwhelmed with a family situation, or health issues, or financial problems, or the overall world today. There are people who are overwhelmed with some attachment to sin that they can't seem to get rid of. And what does that feel like? That's right – complete powerlessness. No matter how hard you try, you can't fix this. You can't do it on your own power.

It is tough to have faith. Lots of people start out with faith as children or have inherited at least the practice of their faith from their parents or friends. But they're not entirely convinced by it. They can't see God (obviously). Conversation with God is not exactly the same as it is with anyone else. They want faith – they want to be able to see what God sees – but it's too difficult or too discouraging. And let's face it, our society isn't exactly big on faith. I mean, maybe it enjoys the trappings of faith, like little angels or WWJD bracelets. But when our faith challenges us to live it? When it challenges us to look at our social views, our economic views, moral view or even our political views beyond what we ourselves might want to control? Probably a lot of us find ourselves in a situation where we need faith. And even though we are discouraged by others, or the culture, or our lives, please don't give up. Keep calling. Keep persisting. Keep enduring. That's ultimately what brought Christ to Bartimaeus' side, and that is what will bring Christ to ours as well.

When Bartimaeus is called, it's interesting how he responds – he throws off his cape. Umm, wait a second...he's blind. Can you imagine? If this whole Jesus thing doesn't work out, how's he going to find it again? That's pretty much all his security and protection against rain, cold, or whatever. It's pretty much everything he has. Do you see what we're being taught here? He abandons himself to God in order to run to him. That is what faith is: abandonment to God. Faith is leaving behind all the things that we want that keep us self-sufficient, and it is leaving behind all the things we want to control but can't.

What is persistence and faith, if I may ask? It's the act of not giving up, no matter how great the odds against us. We will continue to pursue what we want because we believe, deep in our hearts, that God will be with us, and God will hear us and help us.

The blind and poor man Bartimaeus had this very mindset. All the odds were stacked against him in his desire to have an encounter with Jesus. He was blind and poor, and had no power and influence, yet when he heard that Jesus was passing by, he mightily shouted, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me (Mark 10:48)." Bartimaeus was rebuked and told to keep silent but the more he was told that, the more he persisted on calling Jesus. What made Bartimaeus persist? What made him believe that Jesus would hear him as He passed by? Bartimaeus had great faith in Jesus; he believed deep in his heart that Jesus would hear and heal him. Do you believe that Jesus is waiting for you to call Him persistently?

Ironically, Bartimaeus was blind; therefore, he did not see Jesus performing miracles. But Bartimaeus believed, even if he did not see Jesus doing miracles! It was enough for Bartimaeus to hear the powerful name of Jesus to believe that he would be healed. By his deep faith and persistence Bartimaeus gained the attention of Jesus. And during that very moment Bartimaeus was healed, he regained his sight. This is what faith in Jesus can do for us.

For as long as we will not give up on Jesus, no matter the difficulties and the odds against us, miracles will happen to us. Perhaps it's healing from our sickness, perhaps it's the granting of our persistent and faith-filled prayers and the like. I would like to ask each one of you: How persistent are you in your desire to have an encounter with Jesus? How persistent are you in your desire to get closer and to be healed by Jesus? Do you always pray? Do you always attend Holy Mass? Do you set aside daily time to read His words in the bible?



The Ministry of Bereavement and Father Jeremiah Boland invite you and your family to a special All Souls Day Mass of Remembrance





Did you know about:
**ROMAN CATHOLIC AND
GREEK ORTHODOX TRADITIONS**

From the most ancient days of the Church, there have been five Patriarchates – the five most important communities founded by one of the Apostles: Jerusalem, Antioch, Alexandria, Rome, and Constantinople. The bishop of each local church was called a Patriarch, from the Greek *πατριάρχης*, the father of a family. Over time, Rome which traced its founding to the Apostle Peter, and Constantinople which traced its founding to the Apostle Andrew, came into a major dispute. In the year 1054, differences between the Bishop of Rome, known as the Pope, and the Bishop of Constantinople, known as the Ecumenical Patriarch, led to a mutual excommunication that has divided the Church ever since. In general terms, the two ancient branches of the Church are called Roman Catholic and Greek Orthodox.

A leader of either branch of the Church is called a bishop, and can trace his lineage back to one of the Apostles, meaning that a direct follower of Jesus ordained successors who, in turn, ordained successors unto this very day. For example, Cardinal Cupich was ordained by Bishop Harry Flynn. Cardinal Cupich can trace his “episcopal lineage” directly back to Scipione Rebiba, the Cardinal-Bishop of Sabina (1504-1577), though the paper evidence ends there because of a devastating fire in the archives. For Greek Orthodox bishops, the Apostolic lineage is of equal importance, establishing each leader as having been given his authority from one of the Twelve.

In both the Roman Catholic and Greek Orthodox traditions, a bishop is the pastor of his diocese. An archbishop is the pastor of a large or historically significant diocese. A

metropolitan-archbishop is the pastor of a large diocese that has administrative authority over other, smaller dioceses which are called suffragans. For the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Chicago, the metropolis includes the suffragan dioceses of Joliet, Rockford, Peoria, Springfield, and Bellville. The Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Chicago includes all the parishes of Illinois, Iowa, Indiana, Wisconsin, Missouri, and Minnesota. Both Blase Cupich and Nathanael Symeonides are Metropolitan Archbishops.

Saint John Paul II called the Roman and Greek branches of the Church, ‘Her two lungs with which She must breathe!’ It is only historical and minor theological differences that keep them apart.

However, most people will notice differences in what the two Metropolitan Archbishops wear. A Roman Catholic miter has two panes, a front and back. These symbolize the Old and New Testament. A Greek Orthodox mitre is shaped more like a crown, and bears icons at the four central points. (*See figures 1 and 2 below.*) A Roman Catholic Cardinal wears red and the square biretta with three upright flaps. A Greek Orthodox Metropolitan wears black and the cylindrical kalimavkion with a black veil down the back. (*See figures 3 and 4 below.*)

Both are bishops. Both are metropolitans. Both are brothers in the Apostolic succession. The first words of Saint John Paul’s encyclical urging greater unity between the Roman and Greek branches of the Church were taken from the Gospel of John: “Ut Unum Sint” – That they may be one.

The OLPH Respect Life Ministry will continue to support local crisis pregnancy centers with the Baby Bottle Project during the month of October.






