

Dear Parishioners,

*"Then they will see the Son of Man coming with great power and glory".*

The scriptures this weekend focus on the "end times", that final judgement, the second coming. The scriptures suggest a sense of urgency, to get our lives back on track. Every so often, Evangelical Christians come up with a date that will mark the end of the world as we know it. The date comes and passes, and the world has

not ended.

The Greeks distinguished two ways of understanding the passing of time, Chronos vs Kairos. Chronos is the sequential passing of time understood in terms of units, no unit anymore important than another, 60 seconds is a minute, 60 minutes is an hour, 24 hours is a day, etc.

Kairos distinguishes periods of time, some moments change our lives, others challenge us, others draw us into a deeper insight into the ways God is working in our lives.

November is a month of reflecting on time. We remember our beloved dead; we deal with the end of day light savings time when darkness expands, and light diminishes.

This time of year is for me a time of Kairos. We reflect on the mystical and powerful ways that God is revealing his love and plan for us. We know the holidays and the end of the calendar year is just around the corner. COVID has taken its toll and hopefully encouraged us to treasure the relationships in our lives.

This time of the year as the season of Advent draws close, we must take the time to reflect on the ways that the "Son of Man" has come to us in his power and glory. Babies have been born, couples have been married, young people have made great achievements despite the challenges they have had to face. People have had to deal with illness, death, disappointments yet our God never abandons us. He is there in our midst, in his power and his glory.

We celebrated the life of **Iñaki Bascaran** this week. His tragic death at the age of 23 reminds us of how fragile life is. In terms of Chronos time his life was ended way too soon. In terms of Kairos time, he has influenced legions of people by his kindness, his spirit, and his contagious smile. The funeral was a great testimony to his family and circle of friends. We will never forget him.

## WOMEN DOCTORS OF THE CHURCH

Catholic education in America is one of the greatest success stories in the history of the modern Church – and that history has been written almost entirely by women. Here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, throughout the many years of the school’s mission to educate students in all subjects imbued with the spirit of the Faith, there has only been one man to serve as principal; and he was in office for only six years.

The Church has long celebrated the greatest of its teachers. They are called “Doctors of the Church” (from the Latin *docere*: to teach). As the school year moves into full swing, let us remember the women who are Doctors of the Church and what they have taught us.

**Catherine Benincasa**  
(Catherine of Siena)  
1347-1380  
Siena, Italy



She never wanted to do what her father demanded. Catherine was on the young end of 22 children, and spent quite a bit of time tending to her older sisters in their pregnancies and caring for their children. Yet, Catherine was given the gift of beautiful visions of Jesus. Eventually, when her father demanded that she marry, Catherine refused. At the same time, she did not want to enter the convent. Both her father and the convent agreed that Catherine had tremendous gifts which they could not hold back. She became the most influential woman of her age, and she remains an inspiration for anyone who desires a life of significance – what Catherine would call living your ‘fire.’

“Start being brave about everything. Drive out darkness and spread light. Don’t look at your weaknesses. Realize instead that in Christ crucified you can do everything. We are of such value to God that He came to live among us and to guide us home. He will go to any length to seek us, even to being lifted high upon the cross to draw us back to Himself. We can only respond by loving God for His love.”



**Teresa Sánchez**  
(Teresa of Ávila)  
1515-1582  
Ávila, Spain

Teresa ran away with her brother, when she was only seven-years-old, to join the army. But they were brought back to their family. Still, the experience of committing to a great cause was something Teresa desired very much.

When her mother died four years later, Teresa found a deep devotion to the Blessed Mother. Nevertheless, Teresa did not want the life of a convent – she wanted to be active. Teresa finally found the Carmelites for whom she could write, travel, and spread her wisdom, as well as work on the healthy reform of monastic orders and, through them, the Church.

“May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received, and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones, and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love. It is there for each and every one of us.”



**Hildegard Bermersheim**  
(Hildegard of Bingen)  
1098-1179  
Bermersheim, Germany

Hildegard always wanted to give her gifts to as many people as possible – and Hildegard had many gifts. She was a poet, a song-writer, a preacher, and a theologian. She became Abbess of her

religious community at a young age so she could extend her knowledge and that of others. She established her abbey as a hospital where people could find healing of their illnesses and injuries. Hildegard wrote two major books about the care of the sick, and trained nuns who went out to spread the knowledge of basic health care. But Hildegard was primarily concerned with the care of a person's soul.

"Glance at the sun. See the moon and the stars. Gaze at the beauty of Earth's greenings. Now, think: What delight God gives to humankind with all these things! All nature is at the disposal of humankind. We are to work with it. For without, we cannot survive."

## Marie Françoise-Thérèse Martin

(Thérèse of Lisieux)

1873-1897

Lisieux, France



A sensitive and very smart young girl, Thérèse was at the top of her class in school, but did not care much for sports. She was often bullied for both her academic success and her religious devotion. Having lost her mother at an early age, Thérèse sought to enter the Carmelites and become a nun like her older sister. However, since she was too young, at 14-years-old during a pilgrimage to Rome, Thérèse begged Pope Leo XIII for permission to be admitted to the convent. As a nun, Thérèse wrote extensively and beautifully of her love for Jesus and religious life; she also wrote in very simple and understandable terms about everyone's call to be holy.

"I understood that every flower created by Him is beautiful, that the brilliance of the rose and the whiteness of the lily do not lessen the perfume of the violet or the sweet simplicity of the daisy. I understood that if all the lowly flowers wished to be roses, nature would no longer be enameled with lovely hues. And so it is in the world of souls, Our Lord's living garden."

## SPRED Openings 2022-23

OLPH's SPRED program anticipates having openings for children ages 6 through 10 for the 2022-23 year. SPRED is a program of faith formation, based on lived experiences, that meets the spiritual needs of people with intellectual, developmental, or learning disabilities. Each child is paired with an adult catechist, and this one-to-one relationship allows both child and catechist to deepen their faith.



There are eight catechists and six children in a SPRED group, and the group meets 12 times per year.

We have three SPRED Masses in a typical year - one in the fall, one in the winter, and a First Communion Mass in May.



## End of Year Giving

**Please consider making a QCD gift to our parish**

Making a gift from your IRA can benefit you and our parish. An IRA charitable rollover, also known as a qualified charitable distribution (QCD), allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to

make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- (1) If you are 72 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- (2) The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- (3) Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.

**\*If you wish to have your QCD gift qualify for the current tax year, we recommend submitting your request to your IRA administrator by December 1st.\***

## Drive-In Mass Update: Safety Issues

Now that that seasons are changing, our priests and lectors will be moving inside for the Saturday evening Drive-In Mass. Parishioners will be able to view them from the third floor windows in the Parish Center.

The darkness will also mean that car drivers must be extra mindful of our priest and Eucharistic Ministers as they walk through the parking lot and deliver communion.

To all drivers, please:

- 1) **Be mindful of priests/ministers on both sides of the car.**
- 2) **Put the car in PARK while receiving communion.**
- 3) **Check to make sure everyone in the car has finished receiving communion and be especially aware of anyone receiving communion in the back seat.**
- 4) **Look and see that the priest/minister has stepped back and away from your car before putting your car back in gear.**
- 5) **Only then, proceed forward and exit the parking lot.**

We are always trying to create the best experience possible for parishioners attending our Drive-In Mass and all of our liturgies. Safety is the first and most important priority for everything we do. Adhering to strict safety measures makes everything we do possible.
