## seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

*"I will tend my sheep, I will rescue them from every place."*

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend the Church celebrates the Feast of Christ the King. It is both an ending and a beginning.

It is an ending because it marks the conclusion of the liturgical year. It began last year on Dec. 1, 2019 on the First Sunday of Advent.

The liturgical year reflects on the dying and rising of The Kingdom of God in the course of a year.

We remembered his birth, his public ministry, his passion and death, his Resurrection and the birth of the Church.

Never in my life has this dynamic been more revealed than this past year! We began Advent in the context of our centennial and faced Easter isolated as a result of COVID 19. Just when we seemed to have turned the corner we are now in the grips of the second wave.

How powerful that the scriptures entrust us to the Good Shepherd. There has been much dying and rising to new life. We must trust in his abiding love for us.

This Feast calls us to the big picture of the Kingdom of God that transcends everything we know. As we launch into this new liturgical year we have the reality of COVID and the reality we are a deeply divided country.

We must transcend political and cultural divisions. We can't withdraw to tribal corners that threaten our unity from both sides of the political spectrum. We must find a common ground of mutual respect and resolve that has escaped us in recent years. We must look to the Good Shepherd to lead us.

A case in point is the recently released Vatican report on the investigation into **Theodore McCarrick**. He began as a parish priest and rose through the ranks to become one of the most influential bishops and Cardinals on the national and global stage. He was also a deeply dysfunctional and compromised person. He abused countless people and this was not a secret. How did this happen? This report is an unprecedented view into the inner world of the ecclesial process and is well worth reading. It is a painful insight into the dysfunction of the hierarchical world.

The report is a case statement against the pathology of clericalism. We must rid the church of those who are obsessed with vestments, titles and unwarranted authority. The Good Shepherd knows the smell of his sheep and abhors the clerical culture of privilege. This plague infects the ordained clergy of deacons, priests and bishops. We can't tolerate these obsessions of power. This is not the church Jesus calls us to.

Things are changing! Our own **Cardinal Cupich** has assumed an international influence in addressing the lack of accountability of deacons, priests and bishops to the norm of transparent protocols. While much progress has been made, bishops cannot supervise bishops. We need mandated lay boards of oversight.

We have the most credible lay people here in the US; they must be delegated with the authority to call a bishop to accountability. The current model places that primary responsibility on the Metropolitan Archbishops. Unfortunately some of the most serious offenders have been Metropolitan Archbishops, ie McCarrick, **Bernard Law**, **Rembert Weakland**, etc. Let the lay people take the oversight authority. Period.

It is complicated. Insecure clerics are drawn to the vestiges of clericalism. While I sympathize with their insecurity, they cannot abuse the faithful. Enough is enough! Reflect on the Good Shepherd!! He will lead us to the gate of eternal peace. Our new Auxiliary Bishop, **Robert Lombardo** exemplifies this.

I am confident with leaders like Cardinal Cupich and a new generation of episcopal leadership; change will happen. The church has suffered a generational catastrophe. We must liberate the church from the crippling grip of clericalism. Enough is enough!

I am grateful for my brother priests and deacons who abhor the scourge of clericalism. We are here to serve not dictate. I am a fellow disciple, a brother.

This Feast is also a beginning! We enter a new liturgical year next Sunday with the beginning of the Advent Season. Our theme is, "let every heart prepare Him room." Given all that is happening, this challenge is daunting.

We cannot lose sight of the power of Christ being born again in our midst. We enter this advent never so anxious. The Good Shepherd will prevail! Let's make room for him in our hearts.

Thanks to all who made Holly Fair and the Men's Club Raffle great successes! Thanks for your faithful stewardship of OLPH, through your regular contributions and the "Catch Up Sunday Appeal".

Don't forget the Evolve Virtual presentation with **Dr. Pauline Viviano** on the Beatitudes; it is excellent! Thanks to the Men's Spirituality Group under the leadership of **Bill Harlin** that assembled many bag lunches for the homeless.

Thanks to all that our supporting the Thanksgiving effort of the Jewel in the Glen. Hundreds of Thanksgiving Dinners will be distributed to our Sharing Program.

Let the new year of proclaiming the Kingdom of God begin!

Remember, Jesus said He would be with us always until the end of time; above all else, for this we should be thankful.

## Upcoming Holiday Protocols

### Dispensation for Sunday and Holiday Masses

The Archdiocese has given dispensation for all Catholics from attending Mass throughout the Holiday season. In the coming weeks, OLPH will be releasing our Christmas Mass schedule. We will be offering as many Masses as physically possible. It is imperative that any parishioners who wish to attend Christmas Mass register through Signup Genius once the schedule is announced.

Of course we will continue to livestream Mass as we have been doing and our Christmas Mass will be available for viewing from our website and other social media. We encourage all families to view Christmas Mass together from your homes if you are not able to come to church.

### Regulations regarding printed materials

OLPH Church has a tradition of supplying calendars and Advent Companion booklets for our parishioners.

Unfortunately, the Archdiocese's COVID Guidelines do not permit materials in the church at this time. We will not be distributing 2021 calendars this season. We also cannot distribute Advent booklets this year.

## Creation Care Ministry

### OLPH Let's Continue Greening Up This Holiday Season!

Like all of you, the Creation Care Ministry has been on a bit of a hiatus since the pandemic came upon us earlier this year. You may have noticed that we have not shared with you any thoughts in the Sunday Bulletin on what we all can do to further the teachings of Laudato Si'. But it is time for us to get back at it, particularly with the Holiday Season coming fast upon us.



With that in mind, there was an article recently in the Environmental Defense Fund's Fall 2020 issue that you might find easy to follow and help avoid the needless waste that can occur this time of year. The article entitled "How to make online shopping a safer option for the planet", by Joanna Foster, provided the following 6 tips for greener online shopping. We hope you will all think about these tips in the coming weeks!



◇ **Don't rush it.** Next-day delivery options free us from the chore of planning ahead. But when you select the "I need it now" shipping option, you are contributing to the likelihood that partially full diesel delivery trucks will be patrolling your neighborhood.

When you pick a slower shipping option, companies can consolidate loads and routes and make the most energy efficient delivery. Fewer trucks also lighten the pollution for the neighborhoods surrounding depots and warehouses, which are often low income and communities of color.

◇ **Think it through.** When ordering, be mindful. Remember, there's no such thing as a free return. Your credit card might be unaffected when you change your mind about a purchase, but returns essentially double the environmental impact of an order. "The impact is real," says EDF's Aileen Nowlan, who helps cities and companies manage and mitigate local air pollution. "You're actually increasing air pollution in your own neighborhood."

◇ **Consumers, unite!** Purchasing power can drive positive change. Tell companies that you want to hear a plan for them to clean up their act. According to Nowlan, the trucks that are responsible for the final leg of the delivery process are perfectly poised to switch to full electrification. These trucks typically drive less than 100 miles a day and are parked all night in a central location. "The technology is there and it's cost-effective," says Nowlan. "But these companies need to be motivated by customers demanding cleaner alternatives."



◇ **Give back.** Once you've unpacked your treasures, it's time to recycle or repurpose all that packaging. You can help the environment and your neighbors using old cardboard boxes to ship donations through the Give Back Box program ([givebackbox.com/works](http://givebackbox.com/works)). Fill an old box with gently used clothing or household items, print the prepaid label and ship as usual. Your box will be donated to your nearest participating charity organization.

◇ **Grow greener.** Did you know you can use an old cardboard box to make an indoor composting bin with minimal fuss? All you need is a large cardboard box and some coco peat and rice husk ash or hardwood ash from a gardening store. Composting household food scraps is more than just a crunchy hobby. It prevents organic matter from ending up in landfills where it decomposes to release methane, a potent greenhouse gas. You can use the compost to enrich the soil for houseplants or to grow vegetables and flowers. A layer of used cardboard in your flowerbeds or kitchen garden is also a safe and effective weapon against weeds.

◇ **Get crafty.** Rather than buying more and more toys to keep your stir-crazy kids quiet while you work, challenge them to get creative with all that cardboard you already have lying around.



Build a dollhouse, a spaceship or a fort. You'll be giving a second life to what would otherwise end up on the curb. You'll also be raising imaginative environmentalists.
