

seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

"I should like you to be free of anxieties."

In St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians this weekend, he expresses an aspiration we might all embrace. Wouldn't it be great to be free of all anxieties? Think of the issues or situations you often find yourself dwelling on. We all have stuff that weighs heavy on us, that can preoccupy our

thoughts. A teenager is anxious about feeling accepted. A parent worries about one of their children who seems increasingly withdrawn and quiet. We might be worrying about the well-being of an elderly parent who is having increasing difficulty living independently. We can be anxious about financial challenges or a nagging cough or soreness that is not getting better.

I often think of the words of the great philosopher, **Bob Marley** of reggae music fame who sang, "don't worry about tomorrow, every little thing is going to be alright". Oh, if that was always true! Unfortunately, there are times when "every little thing" does not work out. We must face and deal with consequences and implications of choices we make or circumstances we find ourselves.

The more I have reflected on this passage over the years I have come to see that the fruits of a deep faith in the Lord results in a way of being in the world. We develop a spiritual strength to encounter the anxieties of the world with a deep underlying confidence in the unconditional love that the Lord has for us. A few years ago, I did my annual retreat in Assisi and stayed with the Franciscans in their friary which adjoins the Basilica where St. Francis is buried. Over the days I was with them I was struck by an underlying joy and peace that was evident in their living together. This is not to say there were not challenges and frustrations that come with living in community but beneath some of the ordinary stresses of life was a mutual respect and a sense we are all in this together.

Life is fraught with the tensions and stresses of dealing with one another and life itself. The Lord taught as the Gospel says, with authority. He unabashedly proclaimed the commandment, "Love one another as I have loved you."

As I have been reflecting on the recent Vatican document, "Fiducia supplicans", I have been disappointed by some who simply cannot accept the teaching's application to people who are divorced and remarried or living together in same sex relationships. They cannot seem to grasp there are many kinds of blessings, some liturgical and some pastoral. The Pope is reflecting on the reality of being blessed, we all need the sense that we are blessed and loved by the Lord. Some cannot accept that they are blessed because of their circumstances, or they make a judgement about others who do not fit into their categories of what is right and what is wrong. Listening to some of the Pope's critics, it sounds like none of us can be blessed because of some underlying short coming. Talk about creating stress! We need to be immersed in a sense of blessedness, that is when we can move closer to a life, "free of anxieties."

This week we have many activities related to Catholic Schools Week. We are blessed by our parish school and have benefitted from the tremendous sacrifices our parents and the parish at large make to provide the resources that help us to have such an outstanding school. I am grateful to **Dr. Amy Mills**, the faculty and staff that work with such dedication to accomplish the mission of our school. These are challenging times for Catholic education, and we can be proud of the vital and effective school we have here. There are activities that the whole parish is invited to. Stop over at the open house or some of the events this week to get a sense of what we are about.

Lots of wonderful events lately, the Men's Club Poker Party was terrific. Check out the display case in the South Vestibule to see the beautiful work of our Knit for Life Ministry. One of the great events is the Sneaker Ball for Moms and Boys 4-12. This Sunday is the Spaghetti and Service event for Youth Ministry beginning with the 5:00pm Mass.

Thank you for your tremendous support of the Annual Catholic Appeal. Last year we exceeded our goal by about \$125,000! You are so generous in supporting the mission of the Church in the Archdiocese of Chicago and here at OLPH. The new campaign's theme is "Together at the Table." You will be receiving information about the campaign in the mail and there will be material on the website and in the Bulletin. **Our goal for next year is \$200,505.**

I have always wanted to invest the money we receive over our goal for parish projects that benefit us all and we do not need to go into our savings to accomplish. We were able to replace the carpeting and defray some of the expenses related to our new Bell system and clock

tower. We have also benefitted from several bequests for the bell tower as well. It is getting closer and closer to installation. I would love to have them by Easter. Let us keep our fingers crossed.

There are two projects I would like to direct resources that might come if we can exceed our goal. These projects have surfaced out of conversations with many people. We will soon begin the renovation of McDonnell Hall. Inflation has made this project much more expensive. We want to renovate the kitchen in McDonnell Hall and resources from the appeal could offset some of those upgrades to equipment and cabinets for the kitchen. I would also hope to install an elevator in the Playdium. The ramp that is original to the building is all but impossible for people with physical disabilities. There are so many events there which people with physical disabilities have great difficulty getting to. Elevators are frightfully expensive, but we could make a dent into the expense if we can use resources from the Annual Catholic Appeal.

Please Consider a QCD Gift for Our Parish

Jesus told us "whatever you do for the least of my brothers, you do for me." Every day we have the opportunity to see the face of Jesus in others and be the face of Jesus to others.

Making a gift from your IRA can benefit you and our parish. An IRA charitable rollover, also known as a qualified charitable distribution (QCD), allows

individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.


There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

(1) If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.

(2) The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.

(3) Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.





Support the Collection for the Church in Latin America

hrist calls his disciples to love God and to love our neighbor. We Catholics can show love for our neighbors by performing corporal works of mercy, which include feeding those who are hungry, giving shelter to those who are homeless, and visiting prisoners.

For more than 50 years, the US bishops' program to aid the Church in Latin America has helped the Church carry out its pastoral mission of mercy among those with both spiritual and material needs across Latin America and the Caribbean.

In Mexico's Diocese of Iztapalapa, much of the population lives below the poverty line and has trouble meeting basic needs. The crime rate is high. Offenders who complete their jail sentences face rejection and isolation and risk reoffending upon their return to society. With grant support from the Collection for the Church in Latin America, the diocese created the Cristo Redentor evangelization center, where persons released from prison can receive job search help, group therapy, spiritual direction, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. And they can participate in recreational activities such as theater, games, and music, all at no charge.

In Venezuela, economic hardship and political turmoil have caused food shortages and a migration wave that has left behind vulnerable people, such as seniors. Without adequate resources, the elderly are particularly vulnerable to health problems, malnutrition, and homelessness. The Diocese of Carúpano, with help from the Collection for the Church in Latin America, established a social dining room at its Casa de la Caridad Santa Ana, where it provides nutritious lunches and spiritual and medical care to 100 people every day. The diocese also delivers bags of food and supplies to an additional 80 people every week. These works of mercy are made possible through the generosity of Catholics in the United States to the Collection for the Church in Latin America.




