Dear Parishioners,

"I am the Good Shepherd."

By tradition the Fourth Sunday of Easter is called Good Shepherd Sunday. The Church focuses on Jesus the Good Shepherd. The Gospel for this weekend is from John's Gospel in which Jesus declares himself the Good Shepherd.

The role of a shepherd was a complex one biblically, from the exalted to the marginal. The title was exalted because it recalled King David who was the shepherd King called from his flock to be anointed the King of Israel. It was marginal in that most shepherds were on the bottom rung, just above lepers in the social structure of Jewish society. They wielded no influence, lived in the fields and were very poor.

Most of us have little contact with modern day shepherds. I have shared with some of you that I in fact come from a family of shepherds on my father's side in Ireland. To this very day they raise free range, organic lambs. While much is changed in the shepherding business since the time of Jesus, there are many similarities as this brief Gospel passage suggests.

Over the years I have visited the family farm in Nass, in County Kildare. When you spend time there, I am struck at how helpless lambs are. They take a lot longer to become independent compared to other live stock. They are like very little children, who need to be woken up in the morning, often fed by a bottle, and need to be led very carefully to pasture. What struck me was the relationship of the shepherd (my cousins) to the lambs. The lambs know their voices, they instinctively follow them, they feel the protective care of their shepherds. Over time the shepherds get very connected to the lambs as the lambs do to them. On the day they leave the farm, the shepherds often can't be around, it is often very emotional.

It is this kind of relationship that made the notion of Jesus, the Good Shepherd so powerful. The earliest artistic images of Jesus found in the catacombs were not Jesus on the cross or teaching in the synagogues, it was as a shepherd. One of the most valuable sculptures in the Vatican Museum is entitled, "Buon Pastore", the first known sculpture of Christ, created in the third century and was discovered in the Catacombs of St. Callisto just outside Rome. In these painted or sculpted images, Jesus often has a lamb around his neck and holding the shepherd's crook. This is why a bishop uses a crozier to emphasize his role as a shepherd in the community of believers.

We celebrate the love the Good Shepherd has for us, he knows us by our name, we know his voice. Where he leads, we seek to follow. We celebrate today the love and care that the Good Shepherd has for us, his flock, the community of believers.

The Shepherd protects, the Shepherd teaches, the Shepherd loves us.

We had a wonderful example of the Shepherd in our midst last weekend when **Bishop Kane** presided at the Sacrament of Confirmation for our 8th Grade Religious Education students. Special thanks to **Erin Bretts**, our Director of Religious Education, the catechists, our Festival Choir that all planned such a beautiful celebration. I was so impressed with our "conformandi". They will be great leaders of the faith as they move into adulthood.

Saturday (April 20) is the annual spaghetti dinner and clergy appreciation night at St. Catherine's hosted by the Dussman Council of the Knights of Columbus. I am sure I speak for all the priests and deacons who really appreciate the kindness of the Knights. Our Dussman Council does so much. Thank you!

It was great to see so many at the farewell event for **Fr. Paul Kalenzi SJ** at the Theater on the Lake last Wednesday. Fr. Paul has been a wonderful presider here at OL for the past 3 years. Fr. Paul will be returning to Kenya to work full time to establish Hekima University, the first Jesuit University in Eastern Africa. The Jesuits have a network of secondary schools but there is not a university for their graduates to attend. In the coming years, this University will be a transformative institution in shaping a new generation of college degreed graduates. We will miss you, Fr. Paul! You have been a blessing to us!

Congratulations to **Mary Maginot** who is the 2024 recipient of the Women's Club Service award. I can't think of a more deserving honoree.

- Engage with over sixty OLPH ministries to understand and affirm their work and help them address their needs and challenges;
- Create a "culture of involvement" within the parish that welcomes and embraces others and encourages the development of leaders across the parish;
- Help envision, shape, and implement the future goals of our parish and monitor our ongoing success as we strive to fulfill the Church's teachings.

The PPC meets throughout the year on the third Monday of every month according to its bylaws. Meetings follow an established agenda defined in advance based on input from Fr. Boland and PPC members. Members also organize and plan the annual Summit and Ministry Appreciation Mass and Reception. **PPC members serve a three-year term beginning each July.**

We asked several members of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) to share their experience. Here are the responses from PPC Board Member **Kevin Doughtery**:

When did you and your family join OLPH?

Our family became members of our parish in 2015. We were brought to the North Shore from across state due to work, and we sought a parish with a school. We visited OLPH and experienced Mass (and our first homily from **Fr. Boland**!) and we were moved. After a walk around campus and seeing the school, we knew we found our place.

When did you first hear about the PPC?

I was drawn to the CRHP (Christ Renews His Parish) ministry when I arrived, and chose to be on its formation teams for several years. I noted that many of my brothers who moved on from CRHP after a few years seemed to consistently ask the question "what do I do next?" Many of those men had joined the PPC. This was a signal to me - I was looking for my own answer to that same question and maybe something like the PPC was for me. When **Sara Carsten** reached out to me to consider joining the PPC in 2023, I was pretty sure the Holy Spirit was working through her to help me finally answer that question.

What does the PPC do?

The PPC plans and hosts the annual Parish Summit in the fall. It plans the annual Ministry Appreciation Mass and Reception in the winter. In addition, each member of the PPC performs outreach and support for ministries of our parish. But perhaps our most critical role is to act as the "eyes and ears" for the pastor and provide honest feedback to the pastor in monthly meetings throughout the year.

Is there an aspect of the PPC that you enjoy the most?

I am drawn to people of faith. I draw inspiration from individuals who live the life of Christ and who invite discussion on matters of faith. I am invigorated by palpably seeing, hearing, and feeling the Holy Spirit working through someone before me. Via the monthly meetings with my fellow members and Fr. Boland, via the outreach I do for the ministries I contact, via encountering so many parishioners, all of them doing things - large and small - to be Christ's hands for others... The PPC provides me an opportunity to see, hear, and feel the Spirit at work, and it compels me to just "do more" in God's name.

How would you describe PPC meetings?

We typically follow an agenda where Fr. Boland provides updates on a range of topics related to OLPH and we provide feedback. We often times discuss creative potential solutions to challenges the parish may face. We update the council on each ministry - resulting from individual outreach efforts. We always begin and end in prayer.

What should OLPH parishioners know about the PPC?

Each of us - every single individual... We are the Church. Your input - your individual and collective faith experiences - are important to the fabric of who we are as a community. The PPC is a reflection of that fabric, and it needs your input. Please pray on the thought of joining us!

Stewardship Report

To all parishioners:


Thank you for your on-going generosity and continued support during the year. We are now more than three quarters through our fiscal year. As a Parish Community, we have contributed \$2,550,458 towards Sunday, Holyday, Christmas, and Easter collections for the nine months ended March 31, 2024. You can see from the charts below that we are ahead of last fiscal year by 9.3% and ahead of our nine-month budget by 3.8%. Included in these figures for FY24 is Easter collection revenue of \$100,000, received up through March 31st. This accounts for the large jump from 4.1% increase over last year at our six-month mark to the current comparative of 9.3%. Note that FY23 actual figures do not include the Easter collection, as Easter was in April last year.

We also encourage you, at this time, to review your Intentional Offertory Commitment made last Fall and reflect on your actual giving amounts vs that commitment. Thanks to your generosity, our numbers to date indicate we are in line to meet our \$3.2 million budget goal for this year; however, in order to do this we must sustain our current level of giving.

The 2024 Annual Catholic Appeal here at OLPH is more than halfway towards its goal of \$200,505. Early activity reports indicate pledges of \$128,610, with over \$119,000 already collected. We do have a distance to go. If you have not yet made a pledge or gift to this year's Appeal, you can give directly through the campaign website at <u>annualcatholicappeal.com</u>. You can also send a check to OLPH indicating it is for the Appeal and we will direct it accordingly. Remember, all amounts received over our \$200,505 goal will stay in our parish for special projects use, like an elevator for the Playdium and updated McDonnell Hall kitchen items.

During the weeks before Easter, we included in the weekly bulletins various ways our parishioners can make gifts in addition to writing checks and using GiveCentral. To summarize, other available ways of giving can include a direct gift of securities or mutual funds; including OLPH in your estate plan or as a beneficiary of your life insurance policy; setting up a one-time or recurring gift through your Donor Advised Fund or via your IRA; purchasing a charitable gift annuity through the Archdiocese of Chicago; or, inquiring with your Employer about matching gifts. Some of these ways of giving come with greater tax benefits to the donor. 

What would you do if your child was faced with unimaginable violence, crushing poverty, and natural disasters?

That's what thousands of teens are doing as they make the long treacherous journey from Central America.

Shelters exist to provide comfort to unaccompanied teens while the Office of Refugee Resettlement seeks to match them with US sponsors. There are facilities in the Chicagoland area that care for these traumatized kids. In the past, OLPH parish collected gently used shoes, coats, bags and Bibles, but these collections stopped during the pandemic.

Young teens (13 to 17 year-olds) are passing through our area again. The facilities need bed sheets and the kids need duffle bags.


