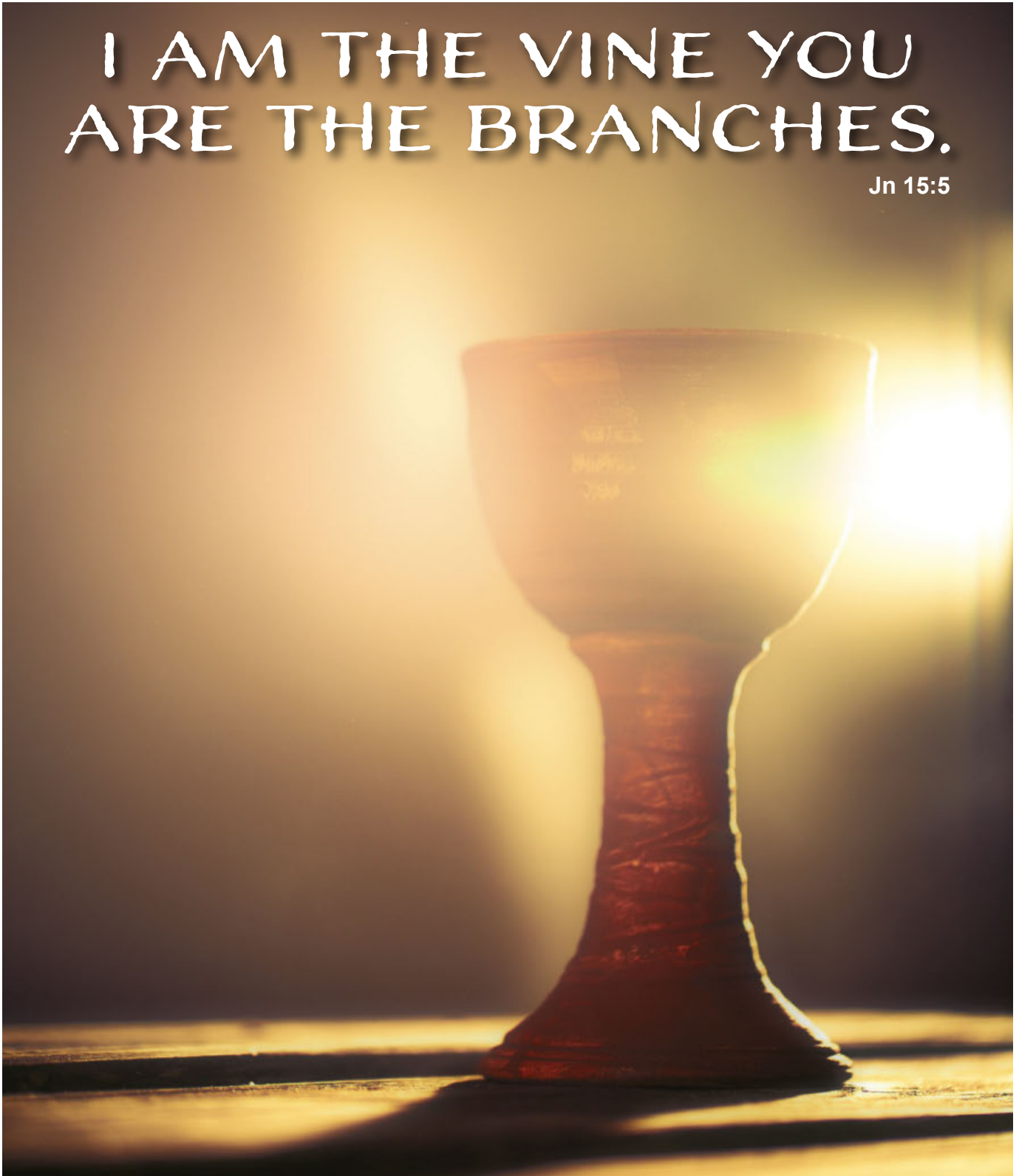

seek, share, rejoice - pastor's letter...

Dear Parishioners,

"I am the vine you are the branches."

As we hear in the scriptures this weekend, it is in the DNA of the Christian community that we are connected. From our earliest days, the community of believers valued the experience of being connected. This sense of being connected was most evident in the celebration of the Eucharist when our spiritual

connection to the very presence of Jesus Christ is celebrated.

These early Christians were connected in other ways through the proclamation of the Word of God. These scriptural reflections from the Jewish tradition put the Christian journey in a larger perspective. Over time, the Letters of St. Paul would connect the movement of the Good News in a contemporary perspective as they would hear firsthand the expansion of the Christian world from Jerusalem to Rome to Corinth to Thessaloniki and beyond.

Recently there was a remarkable article in the Wall Street Journal by Clare Ansberry ("*Some Mental Health Benefits are Linked to Going to Church*" Tuesday, April 16, 2024). She reflected on research that identifies several benefits related to regularly attending church. She quotes studies by Baylor University and of all places Harvard University extolling the mental health and social benefits of belonging to a community of faith.

Religious based communities help people to feel connected, create a powerful sense of belonging, a feeling of being known and making a difference. A larger percentage of people describe their wellbeing as flourishing because of feeling connected to a church community.

This research counters the impression that belonging to, and feeling connected to, a faith community is meaningless or old-fashioned. Our modern culture would rather take a walk in the woods than go to Church. The simple fact is that while walking in the woods is wonderful, there is no sense of community, no invitation to be part of the process of transforming the world, or collectively praising God for the gift of life and creation.

Easter celebrates the power of community! We are not in this alone, we are together building up the Kingdom of God. The Lord is the Vine we are the Branches. We can accomplish nothing if we are not connected to Jesus Christ, the Risen One.

The powerful reality of parish is when people feel they are part of something bigger than themselves. A place where values and tradition are celebrated. A place where the sacredness of life is cherished. A place where significant

relationships are formed and cultivated. A place where the youngest child and oldest parishioner are embraced and loved.

The most profound way we have of being connected is the celebration of the Eucharist, the Mass. Fewer and fewer Catholics are regularly attending the Mass. As wonderful as the virtual Masses can be, they cannot take the place of worshipping in community and personally receiving the Eucharist. As this core group of active Catholics diminishes the very meaning of the Eucharist, the doctrines and traditions surrounding the centrality of the Eucharist begin to fade. Doctrines like transubstantiation and the "Real Presence" become less familiar to the Catholic community.

In response to this the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops launched a three-year National Eucharistic Revival in June 2022. The Revival has initiated many efforts to better educate and form the Catholic community in Eucharistic appreciation. We are about to enter a two-month National Eucharistic Pilgrimage from May through July. The Pilgrimage will take four routes through every section of the United States culminating in the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is on the Marian (Northern) Route in honor of Our Lady of Champion, the only approved Marian apparition in the United States. This apparition took place in Green Bay, Wisconsin. From June 26-30 there will be several celebrations as the pilgrimage passes through the Archdiocese of Chicago. We are planning a special observance here at OLPH. We have events planned for the weekend of Corpus Christi, June 2. We will have a Corpus Christi Procession and many other events. Fr. Patrick Kizza will be organizing these events with the assistance of many others. Please stay tuned for further details.

HAPPY EASTER, everyone!

No, that was not a belated greeting for we are STILL in the Easter season -- but not for long! Easter is often mistaken as merely one day of celebrating the Risen Christ. Rather, it is an entire season consisting of fifty (50) days from the first Sunday of the Resurrection to the Solemnity of the Pentecost on Sunday, May 19. (This year Easter

fell quite early on Sunday, March 31). Yet in addition to the "season" of Easter, every Sunday -- even an Ordinary Sunday -- is a "little Easter"; we gather together at Mass to celebrate the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Easter reminds us that because Jesus is very much ALIVE, we can live in hope and joy despite the challenges or even the darkest moments we face in life. The Light of Christ is so powerful that it can dispel any darkness.

Those present at the Easter Vigil (which took place on Saturday evening, March 30) witnessed a dramatic transition from darkness to light. Tradition holds that the Vigil begins in darkness, with only the light from the Paschal Candle and from the assembly's taper candles (whose flames could be traced from the Paschal Candle) radiating the church.

At the end of several readings, the church is ablaze with light as the Gloria is sung, bells are rung, organ and choir on full power, altar candles are lit! And that's only a fraction of what makes the Easter Vigil the most extraordinary and most important of all liturgies in the Catholic Church.

I encourage everyone to experience the Easter Vigil if you haven't yet. Yes, it is a little longer than the usual Sunday Mass but is still quite short in comparison to Orthodox & Eastern Rite liturgies and Protestant services. Adding to the beauty and richness of the Vigil is an array of rituals and sacraments that include the reception of those who have gone through the RCIA process into full communion with the Catholic Church.

At this year's Easter Vigil, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish welcomed with JOY three faith-filled women who were fully initiated into the Catholic Church:

Updates from Our Seminararians

As a Teaching Parish, OLPH has been blessed this year to host two seminararians from Mundelein – **Andrew Whipple** and **Charlie Leidel**. Both spent time at OLPH last fall and early winter participating in Mass and serving various parish ministries. This past semester, Andrew continued his ministry of presence here at OLPH while Charlie has been serving an internship at Holy Name of Jesus parish in his home diocese of Grand Rapids, Michigan. We're happy to share with you updates from each of them. This week we present Charlie's update; next week Andrew's.

Charlie Leidel's Update

Hello everyone! I hope you are all doing well!

How time flies! [Our pastor] **Fr. Charlie Brown** (yes, we do confuse a lot of people...the Hispanic community has started calling me "Junior") has been keeping me very busy here and I have already had so many powerful experiences of ministry. I will just give you some highlights.

The most challenging thing so far was teaching an hour class in Spanish to the Spanish RCIA group! I prepared a lot the week leading up to it and it went very well but my brain was so tired afterward. I have been practicing my Spanish a lot as the majority of the parishioners here are Hispanic and many don't speak English.

I have been to a number of Anointings of the Sick with Fr. Charlie and have helped out at a few funerals. I led a funeral myself at the cemetery which was nerve wracking but ended up going well. I did the funeral liturgy outside of Mass and preached the reflection, speaking beforehand to the children of the deceased to get to know the person and incorporate that into the reflection.

I have given talks at various parish retreats including the Quinceñera Retreat, the Confirmation Retreat, and an RCIA Retreat, where I gave a reflection in Spanish on the sacraments of Matrimony and Holy Orders.

I have helped in Religious Ed classes, visiting classrooms and explaining the different parts of the Mass. One of the kids came up to me after and said "So you're telling me that the bread is actually Jesus..." YES!! He was mind blown.

I often visit the classrooms in our K-8 school. At this point I have visited every class and it has been such a joy to hear all the questions they have, some very profound and some not so much.

Overall, this semester has been very fruitful and life giving. It has been such a joy to be able to put into practice the things we learn in seminary and to witness in Christ's love to so many people.

Please know of my prayers for all of you and I look forward to sharing more in the future.

May Christ keep you close to His sacred heart and Mary forever hold you in her arms.

What is the OLPH Parish Pastoral Council?

The OLPH Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is an advisory body that supports the Church's concept of shared responsibility among laity, religious, and clergy. The PPC is made up of 15 parishioners and our pastor, **Fr. Jerry Boland**. Its purpose is to:

- Listen to, identify, and examine the needs, ideas, and hopes of our faith community;
- Engage with over sixty OLPH ministries to understand and affirm their work and help them address their needs and challenges;
- Create a "culture of involvement" within the parish that welcomes and embraces others and encourages the development of leaders across the parish;
- Help envision, shape, and implement the future goals of our parish and monitor our ongoing success as we strive to fulfill the Church's teachings.

The PPC meets throughout the year on the third Monday of every month according to its bylaws. Meetings follow an established agenda defined in advance based on input from Fr. Boland and PPC members. Members also organize and plan the annual Summit and Ministry Appreciation Mass and Reception. **PPC members serve a three-year term beginning each July.**

We asked several members of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) to share their experience. Here are the responses from PPC Board Member **Katie King**:

When did you and your family join OLPH?

It was actually my Grandma, **Betty Golden**, who paved the way for my family as parishioners at OLPH church. My grandma started teaching Kindergarten at OLPH in the mid 70s and quickly advised her daughters, my mom and aunt, to settle down in Glenview with their young families and be a part of the OLPH community. My siblings, cousins and I all attended OLPH school K-8 and became very involved in the OLPH Parish. As I went on to meet my husband and start my own family, my own wonderful memories inspired me to integrate my own family within the OLPH Church.

We moved to Glenview in 2016 with our then 1 year old little **Liam** and now here we are with a 3rd grader and Kindergartener in the OLPH Religious Ed. Program and a 1.5 year old quickly following in their footsteps. We have experienced OLPH school for several years and have met so many good hearted, welcoming people that, like us, want to give back with their families.

When did you first hear about the PPC?

One of my favorite and most eye opening experiences with the OLPH Parish was the incredible opportunity to go on the Christ Renews His Parish Retreat. I left for one night and came home so inspired, with a renewed focus on my faith and wonderful new friendships with strong, faith filled and truly loving women. For those of you who experienced it in high school, it was like a much needed KAIROS for adults.

It was on this retreat that I got to know **Sara Carsten**, the current PPC Chair. I will follow Sara wherever she leads and so, when she asked me one year ago if I might consider being a part of the Parish Pastoral Council, after hearing about the PPC's mission, I promptly said yes.

What does the PPC do?

The members of the PPC play a dual role as both the eyes and ears of the Parish and the Pastor, listening to all that the Pastor is focusing on and providing insight and perspective as parishioners to help guide the Pastor in his focus and actions

that best serves the OLPH Parish. PPC Members attend monthly PPC meetings to review and discuss the activities of the parish and offer feedback to the pastor. In addition, the PPC provides outreach and support to all the ministries of the parish, plans the annual Parish Summit as well as the annual Ministry Appreciation mass and reception.

Is there an aspect of the PPC that you enjoy the most?

I love that the current PPC truly reflects the diversity of life stages and perspectives of the current parish. I love that we all have different needs, worries, wants for our faith and church, fostering some great conversations, but our faith and the desire to make it a focal point in our life is what ties us all together. I have had the opportunity to meet and get to know members of our parish that I otherwise wouldn't have and every meeting they give me something to think about.

I have also really enjoyed getting to know more about the different ministries within the OLPH church. There are so many good people giving back, strengthening their faith and in doing so, creating so many opportunities for members of our Parish to do Jesus' work within our community. Who knew we have over 80 ministries/volunteer opportunities! That's a lot of good.

How would you describe PPC meetings?

We meet once per month. We always open with a prayer and any prayer requests. Fr. Boland then provides an update on the latest activities, needs, areas of focus within the parish during which he looks to the PPC to provide any advice, suggestions, collaborative feedback etc., specifically when there are any challenges or opportunities facing the parish. Sometimes this is followed by a ministry update. We close with a prayer and then end with some social time, getting to know each other better and sharing a glass of wine and bite to eat.

What should OLPH parishioners know about the PPC?

The PPC is truly a unique and enlightening experience. It has made me feel like I'm not so alone in dealing with any challenges around my faith and I have some really great unique perspectives to think about. The parish needs your input! 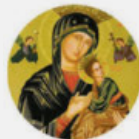

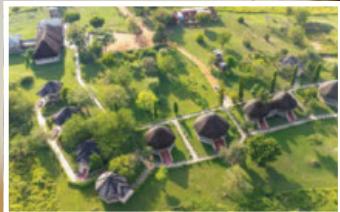
Misericordia Candy Days

What would you do if your child was faced with unimaginable violence, crushing poverty, and natural disasters?

Would you send them to another country to escape all these things and have enough faith in God that your child would survive without you at their side?

That's what thousands of teens are doing as they make the long treacherous journey from Central America.

Shelters exist to provide comfort to unaccompanied teens while the Office of Refugee Resettlement seeks to match them with US sponsors. There are facilities in the Chicagoland area that care for these traumatized kids. In the past, OLPH parish collected gently used shoes, coats, bags and Bibles, but these collections stopped during the pandemic.

Young teens (13 to 17 year-olds) are passing through our area again. The facilities need bed sheets and the kids need duffel bags.
