The Sacrament Of Reconciliation

Confession, also known as Reconciliation or Penance, puts us face to face with the mercy and forgiveness of Christ.

Each Saturday afternoon, a priest is available in church to hear confessions.

All priests, from our grouping will hear confession during this service. Our grouping includes OLPH, St. Catherine Laboure, St. Norbert and Our Lady of the Brook.



Fasting

The Church requires all those between 18 and 59 years of age to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal.

All Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent.
